A BILL FOR

1 An Act appropriating funds for the construction of a state
2 agricultural building.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund
2 of the state the sum of seven million eight hundred thousand
3 (7,800,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary,
4 to the department of general services for the construction
5 of a state agricultural building.

6 Sec. 2. The state agricultural building shall be con-
7 structed pursuant to plans developed as provided in the
8 Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1973 Session,
9 chapter ninety-seven (97) and in the manner directed by the
10 capitol planning commission. The capitol planning commis-
11 sion shall make periodic reports to the legislative council
12 regarding the construction of the state agricultural build-
13 ing.

14 Sec. 3. Fees for architectural services shall be paid
15 only for those services relating to the general contract
16 for the actual construction of the state agricultural build-
17 ing. It is the intent of this section that no fees shall
18 be paid for architectural services relating to interior
19 furniture, decorating, or other things not a part of the
20 state agricultural building.

21 Sec. 4. The governor, the director of the department of
22 general services, the capitol planning commission, or the
23 state comptroller are authorized to obtain and accept federal
24 funds available for use in constructing the state
25 agricultural building.
