A BILL FOR

1 An Act appropriating from the general fund of the state to
2 the department of social services for the biennium be-
3 ginning July 1, 1973 and ending June 30, 1975.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund
2 of the state for each fiscal year of the fiscal biennium be-
3 ginning July 1, 1973 and ending June 30, 1975 to the depart-
4 ment of social services, the following amounts, or so much
5 thereof as may be necessary, to be used in the manner
6 designated:

9 To the department of social
10 services for Iowa adult human
11 needs supplementation to assist
12 those Iowans needing health care
13 or other living arrangements
14 whose income, with or without
15 supplemental security income,
16 is insufficient to meet the
17 cost of care or other living
18 arrangements established by
19 the department and to increase
20 custodial care payments by two
21 dollars per day: \$175,000

\$2,971,000

22 Sec. 2. In order to assure that the necessary data is
23 available to aid the general assembly to determine appropriate
24 funding for the custodial care program, the department of
25 social services shall develop a cost related system for
26 financial supplementation to individuals who need custodial
27 care and who have insufficient resources to purchase the care
28 needed.

29 All privately operated licensed custodial facilities in
30 Iowa shall cooperate with the department of social services
31 to develop the cost related plan. After the plan is im-
32 plemented, state supplemental funds shall not be used for
33 the care of any individual in facilities that have not sub-
34 mitted cost statements to the department of social services.

35 Sec. 3. The appropriations made to the department of

1 social services by this section are in addition to those
2 provided by the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1973 Session.

3 Sec. 4. Unencumbered funds as of June 30, 1974 of the
4 funds appropriated by this Act for the fiscal year beginning
5 July 1, 1973 shall revert to the general fund of the state
6 on August 31, 1974. Unencumbered funds as of June 30, 1975
7 of the funds appropriated for the fiscal year beginning
8 July 1, 1974 shall revert to the general fund of the state
9 on September 30, 1975. Funds appropriated by this Act shall
10 not be used for capital improvements.

11 Sec. 5. It is the intent of the general assembly that
12 a portion of the funds appropriated by this Act for the
13 1974-75 fiscal year are to be used as an intermediate step
14 to alleviate the present crisis in the custodial care pro-
15 gram by increasing the present supplementation for each
16 eligible individual in custodial care by two dollars per
17 day.

18 It is also the intent of the general assembly that the
19 department of social services shall increase the limitation
20 on allowable costs for intermediate care facilities to fifteen
21 dollars per day through the use of the appropriation for
22 medical assistance for the 1974-75 fiscal year as stated in
23 chapter one hundred five (105), section one (1), subsection
24 seven (7) of the Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly,
25 1973 Session. If these funds are insufficient to support
26 this level of payment, the department of social services shall
27 report to the Sixty-sixth General Assembly, 1975 Session the
28 amount of additional funds which are required to maintain
29 this fifteen dollar per day maximum allowable costs for
30 intermediate care facilities.

31 Sec. 6. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance,
32 shall take effect and be in force from and after its publica-
33 tion in the Sioux Center News, a newspaper published in Sioux
34 Center, Iowa, and in The Shell Rock News and The New Hartford
35 Chronicle, a newspaper published in Shell Rock, Iowa.
