**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act appropriating from the general fund of the state to  
2 the executive council for aid in educating certain Iowa  
3 residents or Iowa high school graduates to become osteo-  
4 pathic physicians.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund  
2 of the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1974 and  
3 ending June 30, 1975 to the executive council, the sum of  
4 four hundred thousand (400,000) dollars, or so much thereof  
5 as may be necessary, to provide a subvention for the college  
6 of osteopathic medicine and surgery of Des Moines, Iowa.

7 Sec. 2. The total amount of funds appropriated under sec-  
8 tion one (1) of this Act shall be paid if thirty percent of  
9 the members of the new academic class enrolling in 1974 have  
10 been residents of Iowa for twelve months prior to the time  
11 the class commences its academic year, or are persons who  
12 have graduated from a high school located in Iowa, or in  
13 which thirty percent of the members of the class are per-  
14 sons who meet either qualification. In the event the new  
15 academic class enrolling in 1974 does not meet the thirty  
16 percent qualification, the amount to be paid under section  
17 one (1) shall be reduced by ten thousand dollars for each  
18 class member under the required percentage.

19 The executive council shall determine enrollment numbers  
20 before funds are released under this Act. The college of  
21 osteopathic medicine and surgery of Des Moines, Iowa, shall  
22 prepare and certify to the executive council and the state  
23 comptroller a list of the enrollees on October 1, 1974 who are  
24 qualified Iowa residents or persons who have graduated from  
25 an Iowa high school.

26 Sec. 3. Funds not expended under this Act shall revert  
27 to the general fund of the state on September 30, 1975.

28 Sec. 4. It is the intent of the general assembly in making  
29 the appropriation pursuant to this Act that the funds available  
30 under the provisions of this Act shall be a subvention for  
31 the college of osteopathic medicine and surgery of Des Moines,  
32 Iowa for the college's participation in training medical  
33 practitioners for the state of Iowa.

1 Amend House File 1501 as follows:

2 1. By striking everything after the enacting  
3 clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

4 Section 1. NEW SECTION. TUITION GRANT PROGRAM.

5 There is established a tuition grant program for  
6 qualified students enrolled in the college of osteo-  
7 pathic medicine and surgery of Des Moines, Iowa. For  
8 the purposes of this Act, the term "tuition grant"  
9 means an award by the state of Iowa to a qualified  
10 student.

11 The tuition grant shall be available to any student  
12 enrolled on a full-time basis in the college of  
13 osteopathic medicine and surgery who is either a  
14 resident of this state, or who is not a resident of  
15 this state but who signs a declaration of intent to  
16 practice osteopathic medicine and surgery in this  
17 state following graduation.

18 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. PROCEDURE. The board of  
19 directors of the college of osteopathic medicine and  
20 surgery shall determine within the limits of funds  
21 appropriated by the general assembly the amount of  
22 the tuition grant for each qualified student on an  
23 annual basis, which shall not exceed the cost of  
24 tuition for one year at the college of osteopathic  
25 medicine and surgery.

26 Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the general  
27 fund of the state to the higher education facilities  
28 commission for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1974  
29 and ending June 30, 1975, the sum of four hundred  
30 thousand (400,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may  
31 be necessary, to be allocated to the board of directors  
32 of the college of osteopathic medicine and surgery for  
33 the tuition grant program.

34 Sec. 4. Funds not expended under this Act shall  
35 revert to the general fund of the state on September  
36 30, 1975.

37 2. Amend the title, page 1, by striking lines 2,  
38 3, and 4 and inserting in lieu thereof the words "the  
39 higher education facilities commission for a tuition  
40 grant program for qualified students enrolled in the  
41 college of osteopathic medicine and surgery".
