The committee's recommendation is for a budget of \$114,040 for 1973-74  
and \$118,590 for 1974-75.

From this total, \$92,840 for 1973-74 and \$97,450 for 1974-75 is budgeted  
for salaries.

11

\$14,400 for 1973-74 and \$14,400 for 1974-75 is budgeted for travel.

12

\$6,800 for 1973-74 and \$6,740 for 1974-75 is budgeted for office supplies  
and expense.

The committee's recommendation allows for no increase in personnel.

1 Section 1. There is appropriated and the commissioner  
2 of public safety may expend from the money received by the  
3 department of public safety under section three hundred twenty-  
4 two point twelve (322.12) of the Code, known as the motor  
5 vehicle dealers license fee fund, for each year of the biennium  
6 beginning July 1, 1973 and ending June 30, 1975 the following  
7 amounts, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used  
8 for the following purposes:

14 Sec. 2. The remainder of the fund referred to in section  
15 one (1) of this Act is appropriated and may be expended by  
16 the commissioner of public safety for contingencies arising  
17 during the biennium which are legally payable from the fund.

18 Sec. 3. A contingency shall not include any purpose or  
19 project which was presented to the general assembly or any  
20 standing committee or subcommittee of a standing committee  
21 by any person by way of a bill, proposed bill, amendment to  
22 a bill, written document, or a proposal which is documented  
23 by the minutes, records, or reports of a committee or sub-  
24 committee, and which failed to be enacted into law; however,  
25 for the purpose of this Act a necessity of additional oper-  
26 ating funds may be construed as a contingency.

27 Before any of the funds authorized to be expended by this  
28 Act shall be allocated for contingencies, it shall be deter-  
29 mined by the executive council that a contingency exists and  
30 that the contingency was neither existent while the general  
31 assembly was in session nor reasonably foreseeable at that  
32 time, and that the proposed allocation shall be for the best  
33 interest of the state.

34 If a contingency arises or could reasonably be foreseen  
35 during the time the general assembly is in session, expendi-

1 tures for the contingency must be authorized by the general  
2 assembly.

3 Sec. 4. The reversion of funds appropriated by this Act  
4 which are unexpended and unencumbered shall be governed by  
5 the provisions of section three hundred twenty-two point  
6 twelve (322.12) of the Code.

7 Sec. 5. When any of the laws of this state are in conflict  
8 with this Act, the provisions of this Act shall govern for  
9 the biennium.
