2 ment of public safety motor vehicle inspection fund.

Public Safety—Motor Vehicle Inspection Fund (Trust)

The committee's recommendation is for a budget of \$178,450 for 1973-74 and \$180,800 for 1974-75.

From this total, \$102,700 for 1973-74 and \$106,500 for 1974-75 is budgeted for salaries.

\$16,060 for 1973-74 and \$16,060 for 1974-75 is budgeted for travel.

\$49,750 for 1973-74 and \$48,500 for 1974-75 is budgeted for office supplies and expense, printing and binding, telephone and telegraph, and equipment.

Other expenses, which include postage, insurance, and unemployment are budgeted at \$9,940 for 1973-74 and \$9,740 for 1974-75.

The committee's recommendation allows for no increase in personnel.

1 Section 1. There is appropriated and the commissioner
2 of public safety may expend from the money received by the
3 department of public safety under section three hundred twenty-
4 one point two hundred thirty-eight (321.238) of the Code,
5 known as the motor vehicle inspection fund, for each year
6 of the biennium beginning July 1, 1973 and ending June 30,
7 1975, the following amounts, or so much thereof as may be
8 necessary to be used for the following purposes:

11 For salaries, support, mainte- 12 nance and miscellaneous purposes:	\$ 178,450	\$ 180,800

13 Sec. 2. The remainder of the fund referred to in section
14 one (1) of the Act is appropriated and may be expended by
15 the commissioner of public safety for contingencies arising
16 during the biennium which are legally payable from the fund.

17 Sec. 3. A contingency shall not include any purpose or
18 project which was presented to the general assembly or any
19 standing committee or subcommittee of a standing committee
20 by any person by way of a bill, proposed bill, amendment to
21 a bill, written document, or a proposal which is documented
22 by the minutes, records, or reports of a committee or subcom-
23 mittee, and which failed to be enacted into law; however,
24 for the purpose of this Act a necessity of additional oper-
25 ating funds may be construed as a contingency.

26 Before any of the funds authorized to be expended by this
27 Act shall be allocated for contingencies, it shall be deter-
28 mined by the executive council that a contingency exists and
29 that the contingency was neither existent while the general
30 assembly was in session nor reasonably foreseeable at that
31 time, and that the proposed allocation shall be for the best
32 interest of the state.

33 If a contingency arises or could reasonably be foreseen
34 during the time the general assembly is in session, expendi-
35 tures for the contingency must be authorized by the general

1 assembly.

2 Sec. 4. When any of the laws of this state are in con-
3 flict with this Act, the provisions of this Act shall govern
4 for the biennium.
