A BILL FOR

1 An Act making a supplemental appropriation and reallocating
2 prior appropriations from the general fund to the state
3 board of regents and institutions under the control of
4 the state board of regents and making appropriations to
5 the state board of regents for capital projects for state
6 institutions.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. There is appropriated to the state board of
2 regents and institutions under the board of regents from the
3 general fund of the state for the fiscal year beginning July
4 1, 1974 and ending June 30, 1975 the following amounts, or
5 so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used for the pur-
6 poses indicated. The amounts appropriated by this Act are
7 in addition to any other appropriations made for the fiscal
8 year under the Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1973
9 Session, chapters twelve (12) and one hundred six (106):

10 1. Office of Board of Regents.

11 For salaries of the institutions
12 under the control of the board of
13 regents, to be allocated by the
14 board of regents with approval of
15 the state comptroller to provide
16 equity within the merit pay plan
17 and the merit classification plan
18 during implementation periods \$ 150,000

19 2. State university of Iowa

20 a. General university, includ-
21 ing lakeside laboratory.

34 Sec. 2. There is appropriated to the state board of regents
35 and institutions under the state board of regents from the

1 general fund of the state for the fiscal year beginning July
2 1, 1974 and ending June 30, 1975 the following amounts, or
3 so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used for the pur-
4 pose indicated. The amounts are in addition to any other
5 appropriations made for the fiscal year under the Acts of
6 the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1973 Session, chapters
7 twelve (12) and one hundred six (106), and section one (1)
8 of this Act.

9 To the office of the state board
10 of regents, to be allocated by the
11 state board of regents with approval
12 of the state comptroller to institu-
13 tions under the control of the
14 state board of regents to supplement
15 existing appropriations for non-
16 academic personnel as follows:

17 Administrative and professional personnel . . . \$673,000
18 General staff \$857,000

19 Sec. 3. The state board of regents may reallocate funds
20 appropriated by paragraph a of subsection two (2) of section
21 one (1); paragraph a of subsection three (3) of section one
22 (1); and subsection four (4) of section one (1), of this Act.
23 However, such reallocations shall not reduce by more than
24 one percent the amount of these individual appropriations.

25 Sec. 4. Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1973
26 Session, chapter one hundred six (106), section one (1),
27 subsection two (2), paragraph a, subparagraph one (1), is
28 amended to read as follows:

29 (1) For salaries, support, maintenance, equipment, and

31 Sec. 5. Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1973
32 Session, chapter one hundred six (106), section one (1),

8 Sec. 7. Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1973
9 Session, chapter one hundred six (106), section six (6), is
10 amended to read as follows:

11 Sec. 6. If federal action ~~prohibits an increase in~~
12 ~~nonresident tuition under a price freeze policy, there is~~
13 ~~appropriated to the state board of regents,~~ eliminates or
14 delays into future fiscal year periods certain federal funds
15 previously anticipated as a part of institutions receipts,
16 there is appropriated to state board of regents, to be allo-
17 cated by the board of regents to the institutions to supple-
18 ment existing appropriations for losses of such federal funds
19 during the fiscal biennium beginning July 1, 1973 and ending
20 June 30, 1975, the sum of ~~two~~ three million ~~five-hundred~~
21 ~~eighty-one-thousand-three-hundred-(2,584,300)~~ (3,000,000)
22 dollars, or so much as may be necessary, from the general
23 fund of the state for the biennium beginning July 1, 1973
24 and ending June 30, 1975. No funds shall be allocated under
25 this section without the approval of the governor and the
26 state comptroller.

27 It is the intent of this section to supplement existing
28 appropriations for losses of federal funds during the 1973-
29 75 fiscal biennium which federal funds relate to educational
30 and capitation grants to the institutions. It is not intended
31 to supplement federal funds relating solely to sponsored
32 research grants to the institutions.

33 Sec. 8. For the state board of regents and institutions
34 under the state board of regents there is appropriated from
35 the general fund of the state for the fiscal year beginning

1 July 1, 1974 and ending June 30, 1975 the sum of one million
2 five hundred thousand (1,500,000) dollars, or so much thereof
3 as may be necessary, to be allocated to the institutions with
4 approval of the state comptroller, to supplement existing
5 appropriations for unusual and extraordinary increases in
6 costs of utilities during the fiscal year beginning July 1,
7 1974 and ending June 30, 1975.

8 The amounts appropriated by this section are in addition
9 to any other appropriations made for the fiscal year under
10 Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1973 Session, chap-
11 ters twelve (12) and one hundred six (106), and other specific
12 or general appropriations made in sections one (1) and two
13 (2) of this Act and in the Acts of the 1974 Session for
14 salaries.

15 Sec. 9. Unencumbered funds appropriated by sections one
16 (1) through eight (8) of this Act remaining as of June 30,
17 1975 shall revert to the general fund of the state on September
18 30, 1975.

19 Sec. 10. There is appropriated from the general fund of
20 the state for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1974 to
21 the state board of regents the sum of three million five
22 hundred eighty thousand (3,580,000) dollars, or so much as
23 may be necessary, to be used with nine hundred twenty thousand
24 (920,000) of the prior appropriation contained in section
25 three (3) of chapter seventy-eight (78) of the Acts of the
26 Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1973 Session, for the purchase
27 of a coal-fired boiler and appurtances at the University of
28 Iowa.

29 Sec. 11. There is appropriated from the general fund of
30 the state for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1974 to
31 the state board of regents the sum of six million four hundred
32 ninety thousand (6,490,000) dollars, or so much as may be
33 necessary, to be used for the construction of a design center
34 at Iowa State University of Science and Technology.

35 Sec. 12. There is appropriated from the general fund of

1 the state for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1974 to
2 the state board of regents the sum of two million eight hundred
3 thousand (2,800,000) dollars, or so much as may be necessary,
4 to be used for the construction of a meats lab at Iowa State
5 University of Science and Technology.

6 Sec. 13. There is appropriated from the general fund of
7 the state for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1974 to
8 the state board of regents the sum of two hundred fifty
9 thousand (250,000) dollars, or so much as may be necessary,
10 to be used to supplement any prior appropriations for capital
11 improvement items for the movable equipment in the industrial
12 arts and technology building at the University of Northern
13 Iowa.

14 Sec. 14. There is appropriated from the general fund of
15 the state for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1974 to
16 the state board of regents the sum of eighteen thousand
17 (18,000) dollars, or so much as may be necessary, to be used
18 to supplement any prior appropriation for capital improvement
19 items for water supply conservation equipment at the Iowa
20 Braille and Sight Saving School.

21 Sec. 15. There is appropriated from the general fund of
22 the state for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1974 to
23 the state board of regents the sum of one million sixty-four
24 thousand (1,064,000) dollars, or so much as may be necessary,
25 to be used to supplement any prior appropriations for capital
26 improvement items for the speech and art complex at the
27 University of Northern Iowa.

28 Sec. 16. Sections six (6), seven (7), and eight (8) of
29 chapter seventy-eight (78), Acts of the Sixty-fifth General
30 Assembly, 1973 Session, shall apply to this Act.

31 Sec. 17. Any unencumbered balance of funds appropriated
32 by sections ten (10) through fifteen (15) of this Act remain-
33 ing on June 30, 1978, shall revert to the general fund on
34 June 30, 1978.

35 Sec. 18. It is the intent of the general assembly in mak-

1 ing the appropriations pursuant to this Act that the funds
2 available under the provisions of this Act shall be used ex-
3 clusively for the specific capital projects identified in
4 each section of this Act.

3 Sec. 9. There is appropriated to the Iowa state
4 university of science and technology college of
5 veterinary medicine from the general fund of the
6 state the sum of seventy thousand (70,000) dollars
7 annually, or so much thereof as is necessary, which
8 shall be used for research to determine methods
9 for the prevention and cure for transmissible gastro
10 enteritis and other enteric diseases affecting swine.
11 Funds appropriated by this section shall become
12 available on July first of each year and any
13 unencumbered balances of such funds remaining on
14 June thirtieth of each year shall revert to the
15 general fund of the state. Such funds may be
16 expended for salaries, support, maintenance, and
17 miscellaneous purposes but shall not be used for
18 capital improvements. The college of veterinary
19 medicine may accept funds, grants and gifts from
