1 An Act making an appropriation to the department of public
2 instruction to provide school food service assistance
3 for the purpose of participating in certain federal
4 child nutrition programs.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

- 4 2. Page 2, by striking from line 18 the figures "\$1,350,000"
- 5 and inserting in lieu thereof the figures "\$1,240,000".
- 6 3. Page 2, by striking all of lines 26 through 35 and line 1,
- 7 page 3.

1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of
2 the state to the department of public instruction for the fiscal
3 year commencing July 1, 1974, and ending June 30, 1975 the
4 following amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be
5 used in the manner designated:

7 Fiscal Year

8 DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC IN-
9 STRUCTION FOR SCHOOL FOOD
10 SERVICE ASSISTANCE.

11 For the purpose of pro-
12 viding assistance to students
13 enrolled in public school dis-
14 tricts and nonpublic schools
15 of the state for breakfasts,
16 lunches, and minimal equip-
17 ment programs, the follow-
18 ing amount:

\$1,350,000

19 Sec. 2. The funds appropriated by this Act shall be used
20 as state matching funds for federal programs and shall be
21 disbursed according to federal regulations.

22 Sec. 3. Unencumbered funds as of June 30, 1975 shall revert
23 to the general fund of the state as of September 30, 1975.

24 Sec. 4. Chapter two hundred eighty-three A (283A), Code
25 1973, is amended by adding the following new section:

26 NEW SECTION. The authorities in charge of nonpublic schools
27 may operate or provide for the operation of school lunch pro-
28 grams in schools under their jurisdiction and may use funds
29 appropriated to them by the general assembly, gifts, funds
30 received from sale of school lunches under such programs, and
31 any other funds available to the nonpublic school. However,
32 school lunch programs shall not be required in nonpublic
33 schools. The department of public instruction shall direct
34 the disbursement of state funds to nonpublic schools for school
35 lunch programs in the same manner as state funds are disbursed

1 to public schools.

EXPLANATION

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3 According to the School Food Service Division of the De-
4 partment of Public Instruction the cost of funding breakfasts,
5 lunches, and minimal equipment programs for public school
6 participating students is estimated to be \$1,240,000 and for
7 nonpublic school participating students is estimated to be
8 \$110,000.

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
