A BILL FOR

- 1 An Act relating to the reversion of funds appropriated for
- 2 carrying out amusement inspections.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE REPORT
(Senate File 346)

Legislation enacted in the second session of the Sixty-fourth General Assembly instituted inspection of amusement rides and devices, to be financed from revenue generated by permit and inspection fees. \$37,000.00 was appropriated to the Bureau of Labor for initial funding of the inspection. This money was then to be reverted on January 1, 1973, from the funds obtained through permit and inspection fees.

For various reasons, insufficient funds were generated through permit and inspection fees to provide for both the inspection and the necessary reversion. This bill appropriates \$22,646.00 to the Bureau of Labor, constituting sufficient funds to finance activities through the current biennium, as well as providing for the \$37,000.00 reversion.

Additional legislation is being proposed to increase the licensing fees to the level of self-sustaining inspections.

1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund
2 of the state for the fiscal period commencing January 1, 1973
3 and ending June 30, 1973 to the bureau of labor for deposit
4 in the amusement inspection fund, the sum of twenty-two
5 thousand six hundred forty-six (22,646) dollars, or so much
6 thereof as may be necessary, to carry out the provisions of
7 chapter eighty-eight A (88A) of the Code.

8 Sec. 2. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance,
9 shall take effect and be in force from and after its publi-
10 cation in the Bettendorf News, a newspaper published in
11 Bettendorf, Iowa, and in the LeMars Daily Sentinel,
12 a newspaper published in LeMars, Iowa.

13 EXPLANATION

14 In 1972 the General Assembly passed legislation which pro-
15 vided that the bureau of labor is to inspect amusement rides
16 and devices. A licensing system was enacted which it was
17 hoped would provide sufficient revenue to finance the in-
18 spection system. Section 5 of Chapter 1029 of the Acts of
19 the Sixty-fourth General Assembly, Second Session, appropri-
20 ated \$37,000 to the bureau of labor from the general fund
21 and provided that \$37,000 would revert on January 1, 1973
22 from the amusement inspection fund to the general fund in
23 order to repay the \$37,000 appropriated from the general fund.
24 The revenues received from inspection fees have not been
25 sufficient to finance the provisions of Chapter 88A and
26 with the reversion there are insufficient funds to finance
27 Chapter 88A.
