A BILL FOR

1 An Act to appropriate and authorize expenditures from the
 2 vehicle dispatcher revolving fund.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. There is appropriated, and the state vehicle
 2 dispatcher is authorized to expend, from the vehicle dispatcher
 3 revolving fund established under section twenty-one point
 4 six (21.6) of the Code, for each fiscal year of the biennium
 5 commencing July 1, 1973 and ending June 30, 1975, the following
 6 amounts, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used
 7 in the manner designated:

10 For salaries, support,

13 Sec. 2. The remainder of the fund is appropriated for
 14 the purchase of gasoline, oil, tires, repairs and all other
 15 maintenance expenses incurred in the operation of state-owned
 16 motor vehicles and for contingencies arising during the
 17 biennium which are legally payable from this fund.

18 Sec. 3. A contingency shall not include any purpose or
 19 project which was presented to the general assembly or any
 20 standing committee or subcommittee of a standing committee
 21 by any person by way of a bill, proposed bill, amendment to
 22 a bill, written document, or a proposal which is documented
 23 by the minutes, records, or reports of a committee or subcom-
 24 mittee, and which failed to be enacted into law. For the
 25 purpose of this Act a necessity of additional operating funds
 26 may be construed as a contingency.

27 Before any of the funds authorized to be expended by this
 28 Act shall be allocated for contingencies, it shall be deter-
 29 mined by the executive council that a contingency exists and
 30 that the contingency was neither existent while the general
 31 assembly was in session nor reasonably foreseeable at that
 32 time, and that the proposed allocation shall be for the best
 33 interest of the state.

34 If a contingency arises or could reasonably be foreseen
 35 during the time the general assembly is in session, expendi-

1 tures for the contingency must be authorized by the general
2 assembly.

3 Sec. 4. Notwithstanding the provisions of section eight
4 point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code, all unencumbered or
5 unobligated balances of appropriations made by this Act for
6 the first fiscal year of the biennium commencing July 1, 1973
7 shall, on August 31, 1974, revert to the state treasury and
8 to the credit of the fund from which appropriated. In all
9 other respects the provisions of section eight point thirty-
10 three (8.33) of the Code shall apply to appropriations made
11 for the first fiscal year of such biennium. Unencumbered
12 or unobligated balances of appropriations made for the second
13 fiscal year of such biennium shall be subject to section eight
14 point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code.

15 Sec. 5. When any laws of this state are in conflict with
16 this Act, the provisions of this Act shall govern for the
17 biennium.

Vehicle Dispatcher Revolving Fund

The committee's recommendation is for a budget of \$161,730 for 1973-74
and \$165,730 for 1974-75.

From this total, \$131,130 for 1973-74 and \$137,100 for 1974-75 is budg-
eted for salaries.

\$1,500 for 1973-74 and \$1,500 for 1974-75 is budgeted for travel.

\$25,150 for 1973-74 and \$24,180 for 1974-75 is budgeted for office sup-
plies and expense, printing and binding, and telephone and telegraph.

Other expenses, which include garage supplies and expense, and garage
and service station equipment are budgeted at \$2,950 for 1973-74 and \$2,950
for 1974-75.

The committee's recommendation is for a personnel level of 18.
