A BILL FOR

1 An Act to appropriate and authorize expenditures from moneys
2 received by the department of general services centralized
3 printing permanent revolving fund.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. There is appropriated, and the director of
 2 the department of general services is authorized to expend
 3 from the centralized printing permanent revolving fund
 4 established under section fifteen point thirty-six (15.36)
 5 of the Code, for each fiscal year of the biennium commencing
 6 July 1, 1973 and ending June 30, 1975, the following amounts
 7 or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used in the
 8 following manner designated:

14 Sec. 2. The remainder of the permanent revolving fund
 15 is appropriated for the expense incurred in supplying paper
 16 stock, offset printing, copy preparation, binding, original
 17 payment of printing and binding claims, and contingencies
 18 arising during the biennium which are legally payable from
 19 this fund.

20 Sec. 3. A contingency shall not include any purpose or
 21 project which was presented to the general assembly or any
 22 standing committee or subcommittee of a standing committee
 23 by any person by way of a bill, proposed bill, amendment to
 24 a bill, written document, or a proposal which is documented
 25 by the minutes, records, or reports of a committee or subcom-
 26 mittee, and which failed to be enacted into law. For the
 27 purpose of this Act a necessity of additional operating funds
 28 may be construed as a contingency.

29 Before any of the funds authorized to be expended by this
 30 Act shall be allocated for contingencies, it shall be deter-
 31 mined by the executive council that a contingency exists and
 32 that the contingency was neither existent while the general
 33 assembly was in session nor reasonably foreseeable at that
 34 time, and that the proposed allocation shall be for the best
 35 interests of the state.

1 If a contingency arises or could reasonably be foreseen
2 during the time the general assembly is in session,
3 expenditures for the contingency must be authorized by the
4 general assembly.

5 Sec. 4. Notwithstanding the provisions of section eight
6 point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code, all unencumbered or
7 unobligated balances of appropriations made by this Act for
8 the first fiscal year of the biennium commencing July 1, 1973,
9 shall on August 31, 1974, revert to the state treasury and
10 to the credit of the fund from which appropriated. In all
11 other respects the provisions of section eight point thirty-
12 three (8.33) of the Code shall apply to appropriations made
13 for the first fiscal year of such biennium. Unencumbered
14 or unobligated balances of appropriations made for the second
15 fiscal year of such biennium shall be subject to section eight
16 point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code.

31 The committee's recommendation is for a budget of \$265,115 for 1973-74
and \$273,840 for 1974-75.

32 From this total, \$214,515 for 1973-74 and \$223,040 for 1974-75 is budgeted
for salaries.

33 \$500 for 1973-74 and \$500 for 1974-75 is budgeted for travel.

34 \$50,100 for 1973-74 and \$50,300 for 1974-75 is budgeted for office supplies
and expense, and equipment.

35 The committee's recommendation is based on 27 full-time positions and
2 part-time.
