A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to aid to dependent children, blind assis-
2 tance, and aid to the disabled.
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
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1 Section 1. Chapter two hundred seventeen (217), Code 1973,
2 is amended by adding the following new section:

3 NEW SECTION. The commissioner of social services or his
4 designee, shall employ such personnel as are necessary for
5 the performance of the duties and responsibilities assigned
6 to the department. All employees shall be selected on a basis
7 of fitness for the work to be performed with due regard to
8 training and experience and shall be subject to the provisions
9 of chapter nineteen A (19A) of the Code.

10 Sec. 2. Section two hundred thirty-nine point eight
11 (239.8), Code 1973, is amended to read as follows:

12 239.8 REMOVAL FROM COUNTY. When any child for whose
13 benefit a grant of assistance has been made removes or is
14 removed from the county giving in which he resided at the
15 time he was granted assistance, it shall be the duty of the
16 recipient to immediately notify the county board of the county
17 ~~giving-assistance~~ of the fact of such removal and of the city
18 or town (or the nearest city or town) and of the county to
19 which the child has removed. ~~If the-removal-is-into-another~~
20 ~~county-in-the-state,-the-county-which-has-been-giving~~
21 ~~assistance-shall-continue-the-assistance-for-a-period-of-six~~
22 ~~months-after-the-date-of-removal,-but-if~~ the removal is out
23 of the state, assistance shall be continued as long as the
24 child remains otherwise eligible for assistance under this
25 chapter or until he becomes eligible for assistance from the
26 state to which he has moved, but in no case may assistance
27 payments from this state be continued for more than one year
28 beyond the date of the child's removal from this state;
29 provided, further, that during the period in which such
30 assistance may be paid, the county board shall, by regular
31 contact with the proper state or local welfare agency in the
32 state to which such child has been removed, review and
33 determine such child's eligibility for assistance other than
34 with respect to the residence eligibility requirement.
35 ~~Thereafter-any-assistance-can-be-granted-only-in-the-manner~~

1 provided-for-herein-as-to-obtaining-assistance-and-can-be
2 only-in-and-from-the-county-in-which-the-child-is-then-living.

3 Sec. 3. Section two hundred thirty-nine point twelve
4 (239.12), Code 1973, is amended to read as follows:

5 239.12 FUND-FOR AID TO DEPENDENT CHILDREN ACCOUNT--
6 REIMBURSEMENT-TO-STATE. There is hereby established in the
7 state treasury a-fund an account to be known as the "Fund
8 for Aid to Dependent Children Account" to which shall be
9 credited all funds appropriated by the state for the payment
10 of administrative-expenses, assistance and benefits under
11 this chapter, and all other moneys received at any time for
12 such purposes, and all funds paid by counties to the state
13 division as provided by this chapter. All assistance and
14 benefits under this chapter, and the administrative expenses
15 incident thereto, except compensation and expenses paid to
16 the county board members, shall be paid from said fund account.
17 The state division shall report to the county board quarterly
18 the total amount of assistance and benefits paid during the
19 preceding quarter to recipients chargeable to the county.
20 The county board shall promptly report the same to the county
21 board of supervisors which shall then order paid from the
22 county poor fund a sum representing the county's share thereof
23 determined in the manner heretofore provided, which payment
24 shall be credited to the fund for aid to dependent children.

25 Any-unexpended-balance-of-the-fund-appropriated-or-allocated
26 by-the-state-which-remains-in-the-fund-for-aid-to-dependent
27 children-at-the-end-of-each-biennium-shall-not-revert-to-the
28 general-fund-of-the-state,-any-law-to-the-contrary-notwith-
29 standing.

30 Sec. 4. For the extended fiscal year beginning January
31 1, 1974 and ending June 30, 1975, and for that period only,
32 the maximum levy for support of the poor in each county,
33 expressed in mills, shall be computed by the state comptroller
34 as prescribed by this section. This computation shall be
35 in lieu of any other statutory limitation for the period

1 January 1, 1974 through June 30, 1975.

2 1. The tentative maximum poor fund levy for each county
3 shall be equal to one hundred fifty percent of the total
4 millage levy which that county could have made for the poor
5 fund in the budget year beginning January 1, 1972 and ending
6 December 31, 1972 if it had levied the full amount authorized
7 by section two hundred fifty-two point forty-three (252.43)
8 of the Code and the additional amounts authorized by sections
9 two hundred thirty-nine point eleven (239.11) and two hundred
10 forty-one A point thirteen (241A.13) of the Code and by Acts
11 of the General Assembly, 1971 Session of the Sixty-fourth
12 General Assembly, Chapter sixty-five (65), Section thirteen
13 (13).

14 2. The reduction in the levy for the poor fund in each
15 county, due to elimination of county responsibility for aid
16 to dependent children, aid to the blind, aid to the disabled
17 and for certain foster care expenditures, shall be established
18 as follows:

19 a. The amount charged the county by the department of
20 social services during the calendar year 1972 as the county's
21 share of payments made by the state for aid to dependent chil-
22 dren, aid to the blind, and to the disabled, and foster care
23 for children who were under the custody, care or supervision
24 of the state department of social services or of a county
25 department of social services, shall be determined.

26 b. The assessed valuation of property against which the
27 county made its poor fund millage levy in 1972, payable in
28 1973, shall be determined.

29 c. The millage reduction in the poor fund levy of the
30 county shall be equal to one hundred fifty percent of the
31 quotient obtained by dividing the amount determined pursuant
32 to paragraph a of this subsection by the amount determined
33 pursuant to paragraph b of this subsection.

34 3. The maximum poor fund millage levy for the extended
35 fiscal year in each county shall be equal to the county's

1 tentative maximum poor fund levy determined pursuant to sub-
2 section one (1) of this section, minus the millage reduction
3 in the poor fund levy determined pursuant to subsection two
4 (2) of this section.

5 Sec. 5. Sections two hundred thirty-four point twelve
6 (234.12), two hundred thirty-four point thirteen (234.13),
7 two hundred thirty-nine point eleven (239.11), two hundred
8 forty-one point twenty (241.20), two hundred forty-one point
9 twenty-one (241.21), two hundred forty-one point twenty-two
10 (241.22), two hundred forty-one A point thirteen (241A.13),
11 two hundred forty-one A point fourteen (241A.14), and two
12 hundred forty-one A point fifteen (241A.15), and subsection
13 two (2) of section two hundred forty-one point four (241.4),
14 Code 1973, are repealed.

15 Sec. 6. Sections two (2) through five (5) of this Act
16 shall take effect January 1, 1974.

17 EXPLANATION

18 This bill removes from the Code the requirement that coun-
19 ties pay a portion of the cost of Aid to Dependent Children,
20 Aid to the Blind, Aid to Disabled and foster care for children
21 under the custody, care or supervision of the Department of
22 Social Services or a county department of social services,
23 effective January 1, 1974. To insure that the benefits of
24 this step are passed along to county property taxpayers, a
25 requirement is imposed that each county reduce its poor fund
26 levy for the period January 1, 1974 to June 30, 1975 by an
27 amount proportionate to the amount that county levied in 1972,
28 payable in 1973, to pay its share of the costs of the categor-
29 ical welfare and foster care programs for which counties will
30 no longer have financial responsibility.

88 one (1) of this Act and the millage reduction in the
