1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund
 2 of the state for the biennium beginning July 1, 1973, and
 3 ending June 30, 1975, to the department of public instruc-
 4 tion, the following amounts, or so much thereof as may be
 5 necessary, to be used in the manner designated:

31 Sec. 2. There is appropriated to the department of public
32 instruction from the general fund of the state for each year
33 of the biennium beginning July 1, 1973 and ending June 30,
34 1975, the sum of twenty thousand (20,000) dollars, or so much
35 thereof as may be necessary, for the use of the professional

1 teaching practices commission to carry out the provisions
2 of chapter two hundred seventy-two A (272A) of the Code.

3 Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the general fund of
4 the state to the department of public instruction, the sum
5 of ten thousand (10,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may
6 be necessary, for each year of the fiscal biennium commencing
7 July 1, 1973, such monies to be deposited in the vocational
8 youth organization fund created in section two hundred fifty-
9 eight point fourteen (258.14) of the Code to be used to carry
10 out the provisions of such section.

11 Sec. 4. Section two hundred fifty-seven point twenty-nine
12 (257.29), Code 1973, is amended by striking the section and
13 inserting in lieu thereof the following:

14 257.29 PERMANENT REVOLVING FUND.

15 1. There is established a permanent revolving fund for
16 the department of public instruction. From this fund shall
17 be paid expenses incurred by the department of public in-
18 struction subject to reimbursement by the federal government.

19 2. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund
20 of the state to the department of public instruction the sum
21 of one hundred twenty-five thousand (125,000) dollars for
22 the purpose of establishing the fund created by subsection
23 one (1) of this section. If any surplus accrues to said re-
24 volving fund in excess of the original appropriation for which
25 there is no anticipated need or use, the governor shall order
26 such surplus to be deposited in the general fund.

27 3. Any unencumbered funds remaining in the veterans ed-
28 ucation administration revolving fund on June 30, 1973 shall
29 revert to the general fund of the state.

30 Sec. 5. Section two hundred eighty-three A point six
31 (283A.6), Code 1973, is repealed. Unencumbered funds de-
32 posited in the school lunch revolving fund on June 30, 1973
33 shall revert to the general fund of the state.

34 Sec. 6. Notwithstanding the provisions of section eight
35 point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code, all unencumbered or

1 unobligated balances of appropriations made by this Act, ex-
2 cept funds appropriated by section four (4) of this Act, for
3 the first fiscal year of the biennium commencing July 1, 1973
4 shall, on August 31, 1974, revert to the state treasury and
5 to the credit of the fund from which appropriated. In all
6 other respects the provisions of section eight point thirty-
7 three (8.33) of the Code shall apply to appropriations made
8 for the first fiscal year of such biennium. Unencumbered
9 or unobligated balances of appropriations made for the second
10 fiscal year of such biennium shall be subject to section eight
11 point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code.

12 Sec. 7. When any laws of this state are in conflict with
13 this Act, the provisions of this Act shall govern for the
14 biennium.

15 Sec. 8. All federal grants to and the federal receipts
16 of this department and divisions thereof are hereby appro-
17 priated for the purpose set forth in the federal grants or
18 receipts.

19 Sec. 9. No moneys appropriated by this Act shall be used
20 for capital improvements.
