18 Sec. 3. Acts of the Sixty-sixth General Assembly, 1975
19 Session, chapter one hundred ten (110), section twelve (12),
20 is amended to read as follows:

21 SEC. 12. There is appropriated from the general fund of
22 the state for the fiscal year biennium beginning July 1, 1975
23 and ending June 30, ~~1976~~ 1977 to the state department of
24 health the sum of one hundred fifty thousand (150,000) dollars,
25 or so much thereof as is necessary, to establish not more
26 than five well-elderly demonstration clinics for the purpose
27 of delivering health supervision services. At least two
28 clinics shall be located in a rural area and shall offer
29 services to a multi-county area. A well-elderly clinic is
30 a clinic for the development of a program of preventive
31 medicine to serve persons sixty years of age and older. The
32 clinics may be staffed with physicians, as defined in section
33 one hundred thirty-five C point one (135C.1) of the Code,
34 or persons designated by physicians and shall provide referral
35 services to skilled care. The department shall establish

1 fees on a sliding scale for services provided through the
2 clinics.

3 Sec. 4. All federal grants to and the federal receipts
4 of the agencies appropriated funds under this Act are
5 appropriated for the purposes set forth in such federal grants
6 or receipts.

7 EXPLANATION

8 The appropriations to the state Department of Health for
9 the 1976-77 fiscal year are intended to provide for the
10 continuation of current programs with the exception of an
11 additional \$115,000 being appropriated to Community Health
12 Services to assume the administrative cost of the Emergency
13 Medical Service Program which was previously federally funded.

14 The appropriation for emergency medical services made in
15 1975 is changed by section 2 of this Act to an annual, rather
16 than a biennial appropriation. The appropriation for the
17 establishment of five well-elderly demonstration clinics made
18 in 1975 is changed from an annual to a biennial appropriation
19 by section 3 of this Act.

The clinics may be staffed with physicians, as defined in section one hundred thirty-five C point one (135C.1) of the Code, or persons designated by physicians and shall provide referral services to skilled care. The department shall establish fees on a sliding scale for services provided through the clinics.

Sec. 4. All federal grants to and the federal receipts of the agencies appropriated funds under this Act are appropriated for the purposes set forth in such federal grants or receipts.
