18 board shall provide that four years of successful teaching
19 experience and either a master's degree or a professional
20 degree beyond the baccalaureate degree shall be the minimum
21 requirements for awarding a permanent professional certificate.

22 EXPLANATION

23 This bill provides that a professional degree beyond the
24 baccalaureate degree may be substituted for the master's
25 degree required under current administrative rules of the
26 department of public instruction for the awarding of a
27 permanent professional teachers' certificate.

AN ACT

TO CHANGE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR AWARDING A PERMANENT PROFESSIONAL TEACHERS' CERTIFICATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section two hundred fifty-seven point ten (257.10), subsection eleven (11), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

11. Constitute the board for the certification of administrative, supervisory and instructional personnel for the public school systems of the state; prescribe types and classes of certificates to be issued, the subjects and fields and positions which such certificates shall cover and determine the requirements for certificates; establish standards for the acceptance of degrees, credits, courses, and other evidences of training and preparation from institutions of higher learning, junior colleges, normal schools, or other training institutions, both public and private, within or without the state, for the certification of their students. The state board shall have and exercise all the powers and perform all the duties imposed upon the board of educational examiners under the provisions of chapter 260. The minimum requirements for awarding a permanent professional certificate shall be:

1. a professional certificate.
