## A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the dates of World War II, the Korean  
2 Conflict, and the Vietnam Conflict.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:  
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1 Section 1. Section nineteen point sixteen (19.16), Code  
2 1975, is amended to read as follows:

3 19.16 VETERAN'S NEWSSTAND. The executive council shall,  
4 on the application of any disabled, honorably discharged  
5 soldier, sailor, marine, or woman who served in the military  
6 or naval forces of the United States in the late Civil war,  
7 Spanish-American war, Philippine insurrection, China relief  
8 expedition, World War I, World War II from December 7, 1941,  
9 to ~~September-27-1945~~ December 31, 1946, both dates inclusive,  
10 or the Korean conflict at any time between June ~~27~~ 25, 1950,  
11 and ~~July-27-1953~~ January 31, 1955, both dates inclusive,  
12 or the Vietnam Conflict at any time between August 5, 1964,  
13 and ~~ending-on-the-date-the-armed-forces-of-the-United-States~~  
14 ~~are-directed-by-formal-order-of-the-government-of-the-United~~  
15 ~~States-to-cease-hostilities~~ August 15, 1973, both dates  
16 inclusive, cause to be reserved in the state capitol a  
17 reasonable amount of space in the lobby of said state capitol  
18 to be used by such applicant rent-free as a stand for the  
19 sale of news, tobaccos, and candies and may in such application  
20 permit installation of merchandise vending machines. Should  
21 there be more than one applicant for such reserved space,  
22 the executive council shall award the same to the person in  
23 its opinion most deserving of the same. The executive council  
24 shall prescribe the regulations by which the stand shall be  
25 operated.

26 Sec. 2. Section thirty-five point nine (35.9), unnumbered  
27 paragraph one (1), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

28 Said bonus board is authorized to expend not to exceed  
29 four hundred dollars per year for any one child who shall  
30 have lived in the state of Iowa for two years preceding  
31 application for aid hereunder, and who is the child of a man  
32 or woman who died during World War I between the dates of  
33 April 6, 1917, and June 2, 1921, or during World War II between  
34 the dates of September 16, 1940, and ~~September-27-1945~~ December  
35 31, 1946, both dates inclusive, or the Korean Conflict at

1 any time between June 27 25, 1950, and ~~July-27,-1953~~ January  
 2 31, 1955, both dates inclusive, or the Vietnam Conflict at  
 3 any time between August 5, 1964, and ~~ending-on-the-date-the~~  
 4 ~~armed-forces-of-the-United-States-are-directed-by-formal-order~~  
 5 ~~of-the-government-of-the-United-States-to-cease-hostilities~~  
 6 August 15, 1973, both dates inclusive, while serving in the  
 7 military or naval forces of the United States, to include  
 8 members of the reserve components performing service or duties  
 9 required or authorized under chapter 39, United States Code  
 10 and Title 32, United States Code, sections 502 through 505,  
 11 and active state service required or authorized under chapter  
 12 29A, or as a result of such service, to defray the expenses  
 13 of tuition, matriculation, laboratory and similar fees, books  
 14 and supplies, board, lodging, and any other reasonably  
 15 necessary expense for such child or children incident to  
 16 attendance at any educational or training institution of  
 17 college grade, or in any business or vocational training  
 18 school of standards approved by said bonus board, said educa-  
 19 tional institutions to be located within the state of Iowa.

20 Sec. 3. Section seventy point one (70.1), Code 1975, is  
 21 amended to read as follows:

22 70.1 APPOINTMENTS AND PROMOTIONS. In every public  
 23 department and upon all public works in the state, and of  
 24 the counties, cities, and school corporations thereof,  
 25 honorably discharged men and women from the military or naval  
 26 forces of the United States in any war in which the United  
 27 States was or is now engaged, including the Philippine  
 28 Insurrection, China Relief Expedition, and the Korean Conflict  
 29 at any time between June 27 25, 1950 and ~~July-27,-1953~~ January  
 30 31, 1955, both dates inclusive, and the Vietnam Conflict  
 31 beginning August 5, 1964, and ~~ending-on-the-date-the-armed~~  
 32 ~~forces-of-the-United-States-are-directed-by-formal-order-of~~  
 33 ~~the-government-of-the-United-States-to-cease-hostilities~~  
 34 August 15, 1973, both dates inclusive, who are citizens and  
 35 residents of this state shall be entitled to preference in

1 appointment, employment, and promotion over other applicants  
2 of no greater qualifications. For the purposes of this section  
3 World War II shall mean service in the armed forces of the  
4 United States between December 7, 1941, and ~~September-27-1945~~  
5 December 31, 1946, both dates inclusive.

6 Sec. 4. Section two hundred nineteen point one (219.1),  
7 Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

8 ~~294-4~~ 219.1 FOR WHOM MAINTAINED. The Iowa soldiers home,  
9 located in Marshalltown, shall be maintained for honorably  
10 discharged soldiers, sailors, marines and nurses who have  
11 served the United States in any of its wars, including the  
12 Korean conflict at any time between June ~~27~~ 25, 1950, and  
13 ~~July-27-1953~~ January 31, 1955, both dates inclusive, and  
14 including the Vietnam conflict at any time between August  
15 5, 1964, and ~~ending-on-the-date-the-armed-forces-of-the-United~~  
16 ~~States-are-directed-by-formal-order-of-the-government-of-the~~  
17 ~~United-States-to-cess-hostilities~~ August 15, 1973, both dates  
18 inclusive, and who do not have sufficient means or ability  
19 to support themselves, and for the dependent spouses and  
20 surviving spouses of such soldiers, sailors or marines.

21 For the purposes of this section World War II shall be  
22 from December 7, 1941, to ~~September-27-1945~~ December 31, 1946,  
23 both dates inclusive.

24 Sec. 5. Section two hundred nineteen point eight (219.8),  
25 Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

26 219.8 QUALIFICATIONS OF COMMANDANT. The commandant shall  
27 be a resident of the state of Iowa who has an honorable dis-  
28 charge from the United States army, navy or marine corps and  
29 who has served in the military or naval forces of the United  
30 States in any war, including the Korean conflict at any time  
31 between June ~~27~~ 25, 1950, and ~~July-27-1953~~ January 31, 1955,  
32 both dates inclusive, and including the Vietnam conflict at  
33 any time between August 5, 1964, and ~~ending-on-the-date-the~~  
34 ~~armed-forces-of-the-United-States-are-directed-by-formal-order~~  
35 ~~of-the-government-of-the-United-States-to-cess-hostilities~~

1 August 15, 1973, both dates inclusive.

2 Sec. 6. Section two hundred fifty point one (250.1), Code  
3 1975, is amended to read as follows:

4 250.1 TAX. A tax not exceeding twenty-seven cents per  
5 thousand dollars of assessed value may be levied by the board  
6 of supervisors upon all taxable property within the county,  
7 to be collected at the same time and in the same manner as  
8 other taxes, to create a veteran affairs fund for the relief  
9 of, and to pay the funeral expenses of honorably discharged,  
10 indigent men and women of the United States who served in  
11 the military or naval forces of the United States in any war  
12 including the Korean Conflict at any time between June 27  
13 25, 1950, and ~~July-27,-1953~~ January 31, 1955, both dates  
14 inclusive, and including the Vietnam Conflict at any time  
15 between August 5, 1964, and ~~ending-on-the-date-the-armed~~  
16 ~~forces-of-the-United-States-are-directed-by-formal-order-of~~  
17 ~~the-government-of-the-United-States-to-cess-hostilities~~  
18 August 15, 1973, both dates inclusive, and their indigent  
19 wives, widows and minor children not over eighteen years of  
20 age, having a legal residence in the county.

21 Sec. 7. Section two hundred fifty point three (250.3),  
22 Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

23 250.3 COMMISSION OF VETERAN AFFAIRS. The commission of  
24 veteran affairs shall consist of three persons, all of whom  
25 shall be honorably discharged men or women of the United  
26 States who served in the military or naval forces of the  
27 United States in any war, including the Korean Conflict at  
28 any time between June 27 25, 1950, and ~~July-27,-1953~~ January  
29 31, 1955, both dates inclusive, and including the Vietnam  
30 Conflict at any time between August 5, 1964, and ~~ending-on~~  
31 ~~the-date-the-armed-forces-of-the-United-States-are-directed~~  
32 ~~by-formal-order-of-the-government-of-the-United-States-to~~  
33 ~~cess-hostilities~~ August 15, 1973, both dates inclusive.

34 Said membership shall at all times, as near as possible, be  
35 equally divided among the men and women who served in the

1 Spanish American War, World War I and World War II.

2 Sec. 8. Section two hundred fifty point thirteen (250.13),  
3 Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

4 250.13 BURIAL--EXPENSES. The board shall designate some  
5 suitable person in each township to cause to be decently  
6 interred in a suitable cemetery and not in any cemetery or  
7 part thereof used exclusively for the burial of the pauper  
8 dead, the body of any honorably discharged man or woman of  
9 the United States, who served in the military or naval forces  
10 of the United States during any war, including the Korean  
11 Conflict at any time between June ~~27~~ 25, 1950, and ~~July-27,~~  
12 ~~1953~~ January 31, 1955, both dates inclusive, and including  
13 the Vietnam Conflict at any time between August 5, 1964, and  
14 ~~ending-on-the-date-the-armed-forces-of-the-United-States-are~~  
15 ~~directed-by-formal-order-of-the-government-of-the-United~~  
16 ~~States-to-cess-hostilities~~ August 15, 1973, both dates  
17 inclusive, or the spouse, surviving spouse, or child of such  
18 person, if any such person has died without leaving sufficient  
19 means to defray the funeral expenses. The commission shall  
20 pay such expenses in a sum not exceeding two hundred dollars  
21 in any case.

22 Sec. 9. Section two hundred fifty point sixteen (250.16),  
23 Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

24 250.16 MARKERS FOR GRAVES. The commission of veteran  
25 affairs in any county shall, upon the petition of five  
26 reputable freeholders of any township or municipality in their  
27 county, procure for and furnish to said petitioners some  
28 suitable and appropriate metal marker, at a cost not exceeding  
29 three and one-half dollars each, for the grave of each  
30 honorably discharged man or woman of the United States, who  
31 served in the military or naval forces of the United States  
32 during any war, including the Korean Conflict at any time  
33 between June ~~27~~ 25, 1950, and ~~July-27,-1953~~ January 31, 1955,  
34 both dates inclusive, and including the Vietnam Conflict at  
35 any time between August 5, 1964, and ~~ending-on-the-date-the~~

1 ~~armed-forces-of-the-United-States-are-directed-by-formal-order~~  
2 ~~of-the-government-of-the-United-States-to-cease-hostilities~~  
3 August 15, 1973, both dates inclusive, who buried within the  
4 limits of said township or municipality, to be placed at his  
5 grave to permanently mark and designate said grave for memorial  
6 purposes. The expenses thereof shall be paid from any funds  
7 raised as provided in this chapter.

8 Sec. 10. Section two hundred fifty point twenty-one  
9 (250.21), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

10 250.21 WORLD WAR II DATES. For the purposes of this  
11 chapter, World War II shall be from December 7, 1941, to  
12 ~~September-27-1945~~ December 31, 1946, both dates inclusive.

13 Sec. 11. Section three hundred thirty-two point five  
14 (332.5), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

15 332.5 VETERAN'S NEWSSTANDS. The board of supervisors  
16 of any county shall, on the application of any honorably dis-  
17 charged soldier, sailor, marine, or nurse of the army or navy  
18 of the United States in the late Civil War, Spanish-American  
19 War, Philippine insurrection, China relief expedition, World  
20 War I, World War II, from December 7, 1941, to ~~September-27-~~  
21 ~~1945~~ December 31, 1946, both dates inclusive, including the  
22 Korean Conflict at any time between June 27 25, 1950, and  
23 ~~July-27-1953~~ January 31, 1955, both dates inclusive, and  
24 including the Vietnam Conflict at any time between August  
25 5, 1964, and ~~ending-on-the-date-the-armed-forces-of-the-United~~  
26 ~~States-are-directed-by-formal-order-of-the-government-of-the~~  
27 ~~United-States-to-cease-hostilities~~ August 15, 1973, both dates  
28 inclusive, who was disabled in said war, cause to be reserved  
29 in the courthouse of the county a reasonable amount of space  
30 in the lobby of said courthouse to be used by such applicant  
31 rent-free as a stand for the sale of news, tobaccos, and  
32 candies. Should there be more than one applicant for such  
33 reserved space, the board of supervisors shall award the same  
34 to the person in their opinion most deserving of the same.  
35 The supervisors shall prescribe the regulations by which the

1 stands shall be operated.

2 Sec. 12. Section three hundred thirty-five point four  
3 (335.4), unnumbered paragraph two (2), Code 1975, is amended  
4 to read as follows:

5 This section shall apply to any man or woman entitled  
6 thereto who served at any time in any of the armed branches  
7 of the United States of America, including members of the  
8 merchant marine in time of war, and including the Korean  
9 Conflict at any time between June 27 25, 1950, and ~~July-27,~~  
10 ~~1953~~ January 31, 1955, both dates inclusive, and the Vietnam  
11 Conflict beginning at any time between August 5, 1964, and  
12 ~~ending-on-the-date-the-armed-forces-of-the-United-States-are~~  
13 ~~directed-by-formal-order-of-the-government-of-the-United~~  
14 ~~States-to-cease-hostilities~~ August 15, 1973, both dates  
15 inclusive, members of the armed forces of any country allied  
16 with the United States of America, and of the armed forces  
17 of Iowa, the various states and territories.

18 Sec. 13. Section four hundred point ten (400.10), Code  
19 1975, is amended to read as follows:

20 400.10 PREFERENCES. In all examinations and appoint-  
21 ments under the provisions of this chapter, other than promo-  
22 tions and appointments of chief of the police department and  
23 chief of the fire department, honorably discharged men and  
24 women from the military or naval forces of the United States  
25 in any war in which the United States was or is now engaged,  
26 including the Philippine Insurrection, China Relief Expedition  
27 and the Korean Conflict at any time between June 27 25, 1950  
28 and ~~July-27,-1953~~ January 31, 1955, both dates inclusive,  
29 and the Vietnam Conflict beginning at any time between August  
30 5, 1964, and August 15, 1973, both dates inclusive, and who  
31 are citizens and residents of this state, shall be given the  
32 preference, if otherwise qualified.

33 For the purposes of this section World War II shall be  
34 from December 7, 1941, to ~~September-27-1945~~ December 31, 1946,  
35 both dates inclusive.

1     Sec. 14. Section four hundred ten point seven (410.7),  
2 Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

3     410.7 SOLDIERS AND SAILORS. Any member of the fire or  
4 police department, who resigned or obtained leave of absence  
5 therefrom to serve in the United States air force or air force  
6 reserve, army, navy or marine reserve, or marine corps, of  
7 the United States, or as a member of the United States army  
8 and navy reserve, the Spanish-American war, in the World War  
9 1917-1918, or in World War II from December 7, 1941, to  
10 ~~September-27-1945~~ December 31, 1946, both dates inclusive,  
11 or in the Korean Conflict at any time between June ~~27~~ 25,  
12 1950, and ~~July-27-1953~~ January 31, 1955, both dates inclusive,  
13 or in the Vietnam Conflict at any time between August 5, 1964,  
14 and ~~ending-on-the-date-the-armed-forces-of-the-United-States~~  
15 ~~are-directed-by-formal-order-of-the-government-of-the-United~~  
16 ~~States-to-cessate-hostilities~~ August 15, 1973, both dates  
17 inclusive, and has returned with an honorable discharge from  
18 such service, to the fire or police department, shall have  
19 the period of such service included as part of his period  
20 of service in the department.

21     Sec. 15. Section four hundred twenty-seven point three  
22 (427.3), subsection four (4), Code 1975, is amended to read  
23 as follows:

24     4. The property, not to exceed one thousand eight hundred  
25 fifty-two dollars in taxable value of any honorably separated,  
26 retired, furloughed to a reserve, placed on inactive status,  
27 or discharged soldier, sailor, marine, or nurse of the second  
28 World War, army of occupation in Germany November 12, 1918,  
29 to July 11, 1923, American expeditionary forces in Siberia  
30 November 12, 1918, to April 30, 1920, second Nicaraguan  
31 campaign with the navy or marines in Nicaragua or on combatant  
32 ships 1926-1933, second Haitian suppressions of insurrections  
33 1919-1920, navy and marine operations in China 1937-1939 and  
34 Yangtze service with navy and marines in Shanghai or in the  
35 Yangtze Valley 1926-1927 and 1930-1932 or of the Korean

1 Conflict at any time between June ~~27~~ 25, 1950, and January  
2 31, 1955, both dates inclusive, or those who served on active  
3 duty during the Vietnam Conflict ~~beginning~~ at any time between  
4 August 5, 1964, and ~~ending-on-June-30~~ August 15, 1973, both  
5 dates inclusive, and as defined in section 35C.2.

6 For the purposes of this section, the second World War  
7 shall be from December 7, 1941, to ~~September-27-1945~~ December  
8 31, 1946, both dates inclusive.

9 EXPLANATION

10 This bill changes the dates for service during World War  
11 II, the Korean Conflict, and the Vietnam Conflict to conform  
12 with dates used by the United States government.

Prepared in regard to H.F. 411, An Act relating to dates of World War II, the Korean Conflict, and the Vietnam Conflict. Following is the fiscal effect in dollars of the legislative proposal as required by Joint Rule 16:

Following is the estimated cost under H.F. 411:

War Orphans Educational Aid

WW I - No additional cost. These war orphans have either acquired their education or are presently too old to be interested.

WW II - Present dates of eligibility are from Sept. 16, 1940, to September 2, 1945. HF 411 would change these dates from Sept. 3, 1945, to Dec. 31, 1946, which would make more war orphans eligible. This fifteen month and twenty-nine day period would make eligible an estimated 55 at \$400 each, or \$22,000 per year.

Korean War - \$30,000 per year. (75 individuals @ \$400)

Vietnam Conflict - Present dates of eligibility are from Aug. 5, 1964, to present date. No estimate available at this time.

Military Service Exemptions

WW I - No change

WW II - From Sept. 3, 1945, to Dec. 31, 1946, would make veterans of our armed forces honorable discharged who entered active military service on or after Sept. 3, 1945, eligible for property tax exemption to Dec. 31, 1946. It is estimated that an additional 3600 veteran property owners would become eligible. Assuming the average age of the veteran property owner is 50 and that he will live an additional 25 years, and also assuming that the average property tax exemption is \$55, the annual increase in cost would be \$198,000. Over the additional 25 year period the total cost would be approximately \$4.9 million.

Korean - No significant change.

Vietnam - \$275,000 annually. (5,000 @ \$55)

Total estimated cost under HF 411 would be approximately \$525,000 per year.

Prepared in regard to amendment H-3583 to H.F. 411, An Act relating to the dates of World War II, the Korean Conflict, and the Vietnam Conflict. Following is the fiscal effect in dollars of the legislative proposal as required by Joint Rule 16:

It is estimated that between Dec. 31, 1946, and June 25, 1950, there would be an additional 3600 eligible individuals. Assuming a \$55 average property exemption, the additional annual cost would be approximately \$198,000.

Also assuming that these individuals will live an additional 25 years, the total cost over this period would be approximately \$4.9 million.

Between the dates of Jan. 31, 1955, and Aug. 5, 1964, there would be an additional 14,400 individuals eligible for this exemption. Assuming a \$55 average property tax exemption, the additional annual cost would be approximately \$792,000. Also assuming these individuals will live an additional 30 years, the total cost over this period would be approximately \$23.7 million

application for aid hereunder, and who is the child of a man or woman who died during World War I between the dates of April 6, 1917, and June 2, 1921, or during World War II between the dates of September 16, 1940, and ~~September-27-1945~~ December 31, 1946, both dates inclusive, or the Korean Conflict at any time between June 27 25, 1950, and ~~July-27-1953~~ January 31, 1955, both dates inclusive, or the Vietnam Conflict at any time between August 5, 1964, and ending on the date the armed forces of the United States are directed by formal order of the government of the United States to cease hostilities, both dates inclusive, while serving in the military or naval forces of the United States, to include members of the reserve components performing service or duties required or authorized under chapter 39, United States Code and Title 32, United States Code, sections 502 through 505, and active state service required or authorized under chapter 29A, or as a result of such service, to defray the expenses of tuition, matriculation, laboratory and similar fees, books and supplies, board, lodging, and any other reasonably necessary expense for such child or children incident to attendance at any educational or training institution of college grade, or in any business or vocational training school of standards approved by said bonus board, said educational institutions to be located within the state of Iowa.

Sec. 3. Section seventy point one (70.1), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

70.1 APPOINTMENTS AND PROMOTIONS. In every public department and upon all public works in the state, and of the counties, cities, and school corporations thereof, honorably discharged men and women from the military or naval forces of the United States in any war in which the United States was or is now engaged, including the Philippine Insurrection, China Relief Expedition, and the Korean Conflict at any time between June 27 25, 1950 and ~~July-27-1953~~ January 31, 1955, both dates inclusive, and the Vietnam Conflict beginning August 5, 1964, and ending on the date the armed forces of the United States are directed by formal order of

the government of the United States to cease hostilities, both dates inclusive, who are citizens and residents of this state shall be entitled to preference in appointment, employment, and promotion over other applicants of no greater qualifications. For the purposes of this section World War II shall mean service in the armed forces of the United States between December 7, 1941, and ~~September 27, 1945~~ December 31, 1946, both dates inclusive.

Sec. 4. Section two hundred fifty point one (250.1), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

250.1 TAX. A tax not exceeding twenty-seven cents per thousand dollars of assessed value may be levied by the board of supervisors upon all taxable property within the county, to be collected at the same time and in the same manner as other taxes, to create a veteran affairs fund for the relief of, and to pay the funeral expenses of honorably discharged, indigent men and women of the United States who served in the military or naval forces of the United States in any war including the Korean Conflict at any time between June 27 25, 1950, and July-27-1953 January 31, 1955, both dates inclusive, and including the Vietnam Conflict at any time between August 5, 1964, and ending on the date the armed forces of the United States are directed by formal order of the government of the United States to cease hostilities, both dates inclusive, and their indigent wives, widows and minor children not over eighteen years of age, having a legal residence in the county.

Sec. 5. Section two hundred fifty point three (250.3), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

250.3 COMMISSION OF VETERAN AFFAIRS. The commission of veteran affairs shall consist of three persons, all of whom shall be honorably discharged men or women of the United States who served in the military or naval forces of the United States in any war, including the Korean Conflict at any time between June 27 25, 1950, and July-27-1953 January 31, 1955, both dates inclusive, and including the Vietnam Conflict at any time between August 5, 1964, and ending on

the date the armed forces of the United States are directed by formal order of the government of the United States to cease hostilities, both dates inclusive. Said membership shall at all times, as near as possible, be equally divided among the men and women who served in the Spanish American War, World War I and World War II.

Sec. 6. Section two hundred fifty point thirteen (250.13), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

250.13 BURIAL--EXPENSES. The board shall designate some suitable person in each township to cause to be decently interred in a suitable cemetery and not in any cemetery or part thereof used exclusively for the burial of the pauper dead, the body of any honorably discharged man or woman of the United States, who served in the military or naval forces of the United States during any war, including the Korean Conflict at any time between June 27 25, 1950, and July-27-1953 January 31, 1955, both dates inclusive, and including the Vietnam Conflict at any time between August 5, 1964, and ending on the date the armed forces of the United States are directed by formal order of the government of the United States to cease hostilities, both dates inclusive, or the spouse, surviving spouse, or child of such person, if any such person has died without leaving sufficient means to defray the funeral expenses. The commission shall pay such expenses in a sum not exceeding two hundred fifty dollars in any case.

Sec. 7. Section two hundred fifty point sixteen (250.16), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

250.16 MARKERS FOR GRAVES. The commission of veteran affairs in any county shall, upon the petition of five reputable freeholders of any township or municipality in their county, procure for and furnish to said petitioners some suitable and appropriate metal marker, at a cost not exceeding ~~three-and-one-half~~ ten dollars each, for the grave of each honorably discharged man or woman of the United States, who served in the military or naval forces of the United States during any war, including the Korean Conflict at any time

between June 27 25, 1950, and ~~July-27-1953~~ January 31, 1955, both dates inclusive, and including the Vietnam Conflict at any time between August 5, 1964, and ending on the date the armed forces of the United States are directed by formal order of the government of the United States to cease hostilities, both dates inclusive, who is buried within the limits of said township or municipality, to be placed at his grave to permanently mark and designate said grave for memorial purposes. The expenses thereof shall be paid from any funds raised as provided in this chapter.

Sec. 8. Section two hundred fifty point twenty-one (250.21), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

250.21 WORLD WAR II DATES. For the purposes of this chapter, World War II shall be from December 7, 1941, to ~~September-27-1945~~ December 31, 1946, both dates inclusive.

Sec. 9. Section three hundred thirty-two point five (332.5), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

332.5 VETERAN'S NEWSSTANDS. The board of supervisors of any county shall, on the application of any honorably discharged soldier, sailor, marine, or nurse of the army or navy of the United States in the late Civil War, Spanish-American War, Philippine insurrection, China relief expedition, World War I, World War II, from December 7, 1941, to ~~September-27-1945~~ December 31, 1946, both dates inclusive, including the Korean Conflict at any time between June 27 25, 1950, and ~~July-27-1953~~ January 31, 1955, both dates inclusive, and including the Vietnam Conflict at any time between August 5, 1964, and ending on the date the armed forces of the United States are directed by formal order of the government of the United States to cease hostilities, both dates inclusive, who was disabled in said war, cause to be reserved in the courthouse of the county a reasonable amount of space in the lobby of said courthouse to be used by such applicant rent-free as a stand for the sale of news, tobaccos, and candies. Should there be more than one applicant for such reserved space, the board of supervisors shall award the same to the person in their opinion most deserving of the same. The

supervisors shall prescribe the regulations by which the stands shall be operated.

Sec. 10. Section three hundred thirty-five point four (335.4), unnumbered paragraph two (2), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

This section shall apply to any man or woman entitled thereto who served at any time in any of the armed branches of the United States of America, including members of the merchant marine in time of war, and including the Korean Conflict at any time between June 27 25, 1950, and ~~July-27-1953~~ January 31, 1955, both dates inclusive, and the Vietnam Conflict beginning at any time between August 5, 1964, and ending on the date the armed forces of the United States are directed by formal order of the government of the United States to cease hostilities, both dates inclusive, members of the armed forces of any country allied with the United States of America, and of the armed forces of Iowa, the various states and territories.

Sec. 11. Section four hundred point ten (400.10), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

400.10 PREFERENCES. In all examinations and appointments under the provisions of this chapter, other than promotions and appointments of chief of the police department and chief of the fire department, honorably discharged men and women from the military or naval forces of the United States in any war in which the United States was or is now engaged, including the Philippine Insurrection, China Relief Expedition and the Korean Conflict at any time between June 27 25, 1950 and ~~July-27-1953~~ January 31, 1955, both dates inclusive, and the Vietnam Conflict beginning August 5, 1964, and ending on the date the armed forces of the United States are directed by formal order of the government of the United States to cease hostilities, both dates inclusive, and who are citizens and residents of this state, shall be given the preference, if otherwise qualified.

For the purposes of this section World War II shall be from December 7, 1941, to ~~September-27-1945~~ December 31, 1946,

both dates inclusive.

Sec. 12. Section four hundred ten point seven (410.7), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

410.7 SOLDIERS AND SAILORS. Any member of the fire or police department, who resigned or obtained leave of absence therefrom to serve in the United States air force or air force reserve, army, navy or marine reserve, or marine corps, of the United States, or as a member of the United States army and navy reserve, the Spanish-American war, in the World War 1917-1918, or in World War II from December 7, 1941, to ~~September-27-1945~~ December 31, 1946, both dates inclusive, or in the Korean Conflict at any time between June ~~27~~ 25, 1950, and ~~July-27-1953~~ January 31, 1955, both dates inclusive, or in the Vietnam Conflict at any time between August 5, 1964, and ending on the date the armed forces of the United States are directed by formal order of the government of the United States to cease hostilities, both dates inclusive, and has returned with an honorable discharge from such service, to the fire or police department, shall have the period of such service included as part of his period of service in the department.
