19 EXPLANATION

20 This bill exempts persons who are on active duty with the
21 military or naval forces of the United States and who are
22 legal residents of this state, from obtaining a fishing or
23 hunting license to hunt or fish. Members of the Iowa national
24 guard are not included in this exemption.

AN ACT

EXEMPTING CERTAIN MILITARY PERSONNEL FROM OBTAINING A
HUNTING OR FISHING LICENSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section one hundred ten point seventeen (110.17), unnumbered paragraph seven (7), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

No license shall be required of minor pupils of the state school for the blind, state school for the deaf, nor of minor inmates of other state institutions under the control of a director of a division of the department of social services, except that this provision shall not apply to the inmates of the men's penitentiary at Fort Madison, the men's reformatory at Anamosa, and the women's reformatory at Rockwell City, nor shall any person who is on active duty with the Armed Forces of the United States, on authorized leave during the time the United States is engaged in war who is a member of the military or naval forces of the United States on active duty, and a legal resident of the state of Iowa, be required to have a license to hunt or fish in this state. No license shall be required of inmates of county homes or any person who is receiving old-age assistance under chapter 249.
