1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund
2 of the state for the following agencies, the following amounts
3 or so much thereof as is necessary, for the fiscal year desig-
4 nated, to be used in the manner designated:

20 1. The appropriation made under section one (1) of this
21 Act shall be used solely for programs designed for develop-
22 ment of a statewide plan as provided for in section four
23 hundred fifty-five A point seventeen (455A.17) of the Code.

24 2. The funds appropriated to the Iowa natural resources
25 council under subsection one (1) of section one (1) of this
26 Act shall be used to pay salaries for not more than two full-
27 time permanent employees.

28 3. The funds appropriated to the department of soil con-
29 servation under subsection two (2) of section one (1) of this
30 Act shall be used to pay salaries for not more than one full-
31 time permanent employee.

32 4. The funds appropriated to the state conservation
33 commission under subsection three (3) of section one (1) of
34 this Act shall be used to pay salaries for not more than one
35 full-time permanent employee.

1 5. The funds appropriated to the geological survey under
2 subsection four (4) of section one (1) of this Act shall be
3 used to pay the salaries for not more than six full-time
4 permanent employees.

5 Sec. 3. Section four hundred fifty-five A point seventeen
6 (455A.17), unnumbered paragraph one (1), Code 1975, is amended
7 to read as follows:

8 The council shall establish and enforce a comprehensive
9 state-wide plan for the control, utilization and protection
10 of the water resources of the state, which plan shall include
11 all uses and developments of water resources and shall provide
12 for the optimum control, protection, development, allocation
13 and utilization thereof. All uses and developments of water
14 resources regulated under provisions of this chapter must
15 be found to be compatible with the state comprehensive plan
16 prior to the granting of a permit by the water commissioner
17 or an approval order by the council. In making and formulating
18 such state comprehensive plan for the further control, develop-
19 ment, protection, allocation, and utilization of the water
20 resources of the state, the council shall make surveys and
21 investigations of the water resources of the state and shall
22 give consideration to the needs of agriculture, industry,
23 health, fish and wildlife, recreation, pollution and allied
24 matters as they relate to flood control and water resources.
25 Before implementation of the statewide plan, the council shall
26 submit the plan to the general assembly which shall approve
27 or disapprove the plan pursuant to a concurrent resolution.
28 Approval of the plan shall require the affirmative vote of
29 a majority of the members of each house of the general
30 assembly.

31 Sec. 4. All federal grants to and the federal receipts
32 of the agencies appropriated funds under this Act are appro-
33 priated for the purposes set forth in such federal grants
34 or receipts.

35 Sec. 5. Funds appropriated by this Act shall not be used

1 for capital improvements.

2 Sec. 6. Notwithstanding the provisions of section eight
3 point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code, all unencumbered or
4 unobligated balances of appropriations made by this Act for
5 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975 remaining on June 30,
6 1976 shall revert to the general fund on August 31, 1976.
7 In all other respects the provisions of section eight point
8 thirty-three (8.33) of the Code shall apply to this Act.

9 EXPLANATION

10 This bill appropriates a total of \$165,722 to the Iowa
11 natural resources council, the department of soil conservation,
12 the state conservation commission, and the geological survey.
13 These funds are to be used in the development of a statewide
14 comprehensive water plan as provided in section 455A.17 of
15 the Code. A total of 10 employees are funded by this appro-
16 priation. The plan must be approved by the general assembly
17 prior to implementation.

AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO PROVIDE FUNDS FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A STATEWIDE COMPREHENSIVE WATER PLAN AND REQUIRING APPROVAL OF THE PLAN BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state for the following agencies, the following amounts or so much thereof as is necessary, for the fiscal year designated, to be used in the manner designated:

Sec. 2.

1. The appropriation made under section one (1) of this Act shall be used solely for programs designed for development of a statewide plan as provided for in section four hundred fifty-five A point seventeen (455A.17) of the Code.

2. The funds appropriated to the Iowa natural resources council under subsection one (1) of section one (1) of this Act shall be used to pay salaries for not more than two full-time permanent employees.

3. The funds appropriated to the department of soil conservation under subsection two (2) of section one (1) of this Act shall be used to pay salaries for not more than one full-time permanent employee.

4. The funds appropriated to the state conservation commission under subsection three (3) of section one (1) of this Act shall be used to pay salaries for not more than one full-time permanent employee.

5. The funds appropriated to the geological survey under subsection four (4) of section one (1) of this Act shall be used to pay the salaries for not more than six full-time permanent employees.

Sec. 3. Section four hundred fifty-five A point seventeen (455A.17), unnumbered paragraph one (1), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

The council shall establish and enforce a comprehensive state-wide plan for the control, utilization and protection of the water resources of the state, which plan shall include all uses and developments of water resources and shall provide for the optimum control, protection, development, allocation and utilization thereof. All uses and developments of water resources regulated under provisions of this chapter must be found to be compatible with the state comprehensive plan prior to the granting of a permit by the water commissioner or an approval order by the council. In making and formulating such state comprehensive plan for the further control, development, protection, allocation, and utilization of the water resources of the state, the council shall make surveys and investigations of the water resources of the state and shall give consideration to the needs of agriculture, industry, health, fish and wildlife, recreation, pollution and allied matters as they relate to flood control and water resources. Before implementation of the statewide plan, the council shall submit the plan to the general assembly which shall approve or disapprove the plan pursuant to a concurrent resolution. Approval of the plan shall require the affirmative vote of

a majority of the members of each house of the general assembly.

Sec. 4. All federal grants to and the federal receipts of the agencies appropriated funds under this Act are appropriated for the purposes set forth in such federal grants or receipts.

Sec. 5. Funds appropriated by this Act shall not be used for capital improvements.

Sec. 6. Notwithstanding the provisions of section eight point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code, all unencumbered or unobligated balances of appropriations made by this Act for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975 remaining on June 30, 1976 shall revert to the general fund on August 31, 1976. In all other respects the provisions of section eight point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code shall apply to this Act.
