Section 1. Section three hundred seven A point two
2 (307A.2), subsection three (3), Code 1975, is amended to read
3 as follows:

4 3. When in the interest of the state, the commission may
5 allow a subsistence expense to an employce of the highway
6 division of the department for continuous stay in one location
7 while on duty away from established headquarters and place
8 of domicile or either for a period not to exceed forty-five
9 days; allow automobile expenses in accordance with section
10 79.9, for moving an employee and his family from place of
11 present domicile to new domicile, and actual transportation
12 expense for moving ~~not-to-exceed-seven-thousand-pounds~~ of
13 household goods. Such household goods shall not include pets
14 or animals.

15 EXPLANATION

16 This bill permits the Highway Division of the State
17 Department of Transportation to pay actual moving expenses

Requested by Committee on Transportation
Prepared in regard to H.F. 81 - Payment of
Transportation Expenses of Households. This
bill permits the Highway Division to pay actual
moving expenses of household goods for its
employees. Following is the fiscal effect in
dollars of the legislative proposal as required
by Joint Rule 16.

No fiscal note required.

During 1973 and 1974 the Highway Division had
approximately 119 employees who were paid
transportaton expense. Out of these, about 22 had
excess weight which would have cost approximately
\$1,200 more to move.

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PAYMENT OF TRANSPORTATION EXPENSES FOR MOVING
HOUSEHOLD GOODS FOR EMPLOYEES OF THE HIGHWAY DIVISION OF
THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section three hundred seven A point two
(307A.2), subsection three (3), Code 1975, is amended to read
as follows:

3. When in the interest of the state, the commission may
allow a subsistence expense to an employee of the highway
division of the department for continuous stay in one location
while on duty away from established headquarters and place
of domicile or either for a period not to exceed forty-five
days; allow automobile expenses in accordance with section
79.9, for moving an employee and his family from place of
present domicile to new domicile, and actual transportation
expense for moving ~~not-to-exceed-seven-thousand-pounds~~ of
household goods. Such household goods shall not include pets
or animals.
