1 Section 1. Chapter three hundred forty-one (341), Code  
2 1975, is amended by adding the following new section:

3 NEW SECTION. FULL-TIME COUNTY PROSECUTORS. In counties  
4 having a population in excess of one hundred fifty thousand,  
5 the county attorney may appoint, with the approval of the  
6 board of supervisors, assistant county attorneys to serve  
7 as full-time prosecutors who shall refrain from the private  
8 practice of law. The compensation paid to such assistant  
9 county attorneys shall not be subject to the provisions of  
10 section three hundred forty point ten (340.10) of the Code.

11 EXPLANATION

12 This bill authorizes the appointment of assistant county  
13 attorneys in counties having a population of more than 150,000  
14 to serve as full-time prosecutors who shall refrain from the  
15 private practice of law. The compensation paid to such  
16 assistants shall not be subject to the limitations provided  
17 in section 340.10 of the Code.

AN ACT  
RELATING TO THE EMPLOYMENT OF FULL-TIME PUBLIC PROSECUTORS IN CERTAIN COUNTIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Chapter three hundred forty-one (341), Code 1975, is amended by adding the following new section:

NEW SECTION. FULL-TIME COUNTY PROSECUTORS. In counties having a population in excess of one hundred fifty thousand, the county attorney may appoint, with the approval of the board of supervisors, assistant county attorneys to serve as full-time prosecutors who shall refrain from the private practice of law. The compensation paid to such assistant county attorneys shall not be subject to the provisions of section three hundred forty point ten (340.10) of the Code.
