1 Section 1. Section one hundred sixty-four point one
2 (164.1), subsection seven (7), Code 1975, is amended to read
3 as follows:

4 7. "Official calthood vaccination" shall mean the
5 vaccination of any female calf of a dairy breed between the
6 ages of four two months and eight six months or any female
7 calf of a beef breed between the ages of two months and ten
8 months with brucella abortus vaccine ~~strain-number-nineteen~~
9 ~~or-such-other-vaccine-as-may-hereafter-be~~ approved by U.S.
10 department of agriculture, which calf shall have been
11 vaccinated by a licensed accredited veterinarian according
12 to the rules established by the department. The officially
13 vaccinated animal shall be identified by a vaccination tattoo
14 mark, and ear tag or owner's purebred identification. Such
15 tattoo mark, ear tag or owner's purebred identification shall
16 be described in a certificate furnished by the attending
17 veterinarian.

18 Within thirty days following such vaccination, the attending
19 veterinarian shall supply the owner with a certificate of
20 vaccination. The veterinarian shall retain a copy of same
21 and forward a copy to the local office of the U.S. department
22 of agriculture or a copy to the Iowa department of agriculture.

32 the ages of two months and ten months may be officially
33 vaccinated for brucellosis according to the method approved
34 by the United States department of agriculture. The expense

13 shall be placed in a fund to be known as the county
14 tuberculosis eradication fund, and the same shall only be
15 used for the payment of claims as provided in this chapter
16 and for payment of the expenses of the inspection, testing
17 and indemnification program provided for the eradication of
18 tuberculosis in swine. However, the board of supervisors
19 may transfer any unexpended funds from the county tuberculosis
20 eradication fund to the county brucellosis eradication fund
21 to meet any unpaid obligations of the county brucellosis
22 eradication fund.

23 Sec. 8. There is appropriated from the general fund of
24 the state to the department of agriculture for the fiscal
25 year beginning July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1976, the
26 sum of fifty thousand (50,000) dollars, or so much thereof
27 as may be necessary, to make grants to counties to pay the
28 indemnity and the expenses of the inspection and testing of
29 animals as provided in chapters one hundred sixty-three A
30 (163A) and one hundred sixty-four (164) of the Code. The
31 secretary of agriculture shall not approve a grant under this
32 section to a county unless the board of supervisors has levied
33 the maximum levy for the county brucellosis eradication fund
34 under section one hundred sixty-four point twenty-three
35 (164.23) of the Code for the fiscal year beginning July 1,

1 1975 and ending June 30, 1976 and all funds in the county
2 brucellosis eradication fund including all unobligated funds
3 transferred from the county tuberculosis eradication fund,
4 have been expended.

5 EXPLANATION

6 This bill provides for the vaccination of all female dairy
7 cattle between the ages of two and six months and all female
8 beef cattle between the ages of two and ten months. The
9 indemnification of cattle condemned because of a negative
10 test for brucellosis is limited to \$200 per animal. The bill
11 also provides for the transfer of unobligated money between
12 the county brucellosis eradication fund and the county
13 tuberculosis eradication fund.

14 The bill appropriates \$50,000 from the general fund of
15 the state to the department of agriculture for the fiscal
16 year beginning July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1976 to make
17 grants to counties which have exhausted their respective
18 county brucellosis eradication funds. A grant may be made
19 by the secretary of agriculture if the board of supervisors
20 has levied the maximum levy for the county brucellosis
21 eradication fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975
22 and all funds in the county brucellosis eradication fund,
23 including moneys transferred from the county tuberculosis
24 eradication fund, have been expended.

RELATING TO THE ERADICATION OF BOVINE BRUCELLOSIS AND MAKING
AN APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section one hundred sixty-four point one (164.1), subsection seven (7), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

7. "Official calfhood vaccination" shall mean the vaccination of any female calf of a dairy breed between the ages of four two months and eight six months or any female calf of a beef breed between the ages of two months and ten months with brucella abortus vaccine ~~strain-number-nineteen or such other vaccine as may hereafter be~~ approved by U.S. department of agriculture, which calf shall have been vaccinated by a licensed accredited veterinarian according to the rules established by the department. The officially vaccinated animal shall be identified by a vaccination tattoo mark, and ear tag or owner's purebred identification. Such tattoo mark, ear tag or owner's purebred identification shall be described in a certificate furnished by the attending veterinarian.

Within thirty days following such vaccination, the attending veterinarian shall supply the owner with a certificate of vaccination. The veterinarian shall retain a copy of same and forward a copy to the local office of the U.S. department of agriculture or a copy to the Iowa department of agriculture. ~~The veterinarian certificate covering the official vaccination shall entitle the vaccinated animal to be consigned to sales and exhibited at shows within the state at any time until said animal is thirty months of age.~~

The money derived from such levy shall be placed in a fund to be known as the "County Brucellosis Eradication Fund", and shall be used only for the payment of claims as provided in this chapter, and for payment of the expenses of the inspection and testing program provided in chapter 163A. However, the board of supervisors may transfer any unexpended funds from the county brucellosis eradication fund to the county tuberculosis eradication fund to meet any unpaid obligations of the county tuberculosis eradication fund.

However, the board of supervisors may transfer any unexpended funds from the county tuberculosis eradication fund to the county brucellosis eradication fund to meet any unpaid obligations of the county brucellosis eradication fund.

Sec. 8. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of agriculture for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1976, the sum of fifty thousand (50,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to make grants to counties to pay the

indemnity and the expenses of the inspection and testing of animals as provided in chapters one hundred sixty-three A (163A) and one hundred sixty-four (164) of the Code. The secretary of agriculture shall not approve a grant under this section to a county unless the board of supervisors has levied the maximum levy for the county brucellosis eradication fund under section one hundred sixty-four point twenty-three (164.23) of the Code for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1976 and all funds in the county brucellosis eradication fund including all unobligated funds transferred from the county tuberculosis eradication fund, have been expended.
