A BILL FOR

1 An Act appropriating funds for the financing of programs under
2 the administration of the Iowa employment security commis-
3 sion, the industrial commissioner, the bureau of labor,
4 the occupational safety and health review commission and
5 the public employment relations board and relating to
6 fees collected by the bureau of labor.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund
2 of the state for the following agencies the following amounts
3 or so much thereof as is necessary, for the fiscal year desig-
4 nated to be used in the manner designated:

5 1. IOWA EMPLOYMENT SECURITY COM- 1975-1976
6 MISSION Fiscal Year

7 For salaries, support, maintenance
8 and miscellaneous purposes for the
9 administration of chapter ninety-
10 seven (97) and chapter ninety-seven
11 C(97C) and section two hundred ninety-
12 four point fifteen (294.15) of the
13 Code \$ 99,056

14 2. INDUSTRIAL COMMISSIONER
15 For salaries, support, maintenance
16 and miscellaneous purposes \$260,102

17 3. BUREAU OF LABOR
18 For salaries, support, maintenance
19 and miscellaneous purposes \$765,897

20 4. OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH
21 REVIEW COMMISSION
22 For salaries, support, maintenance
23 and miscellaneous purposes \$ 33,549

24 5. PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT RELATIONS
25 BOARD
26 For salaries, support, maintenance

28 Sec. 2. Section eighty-eight A point four (88A.4), Code
29 1975, is amended to read as follows:

30 88A.4 PERMIT AND INSPECTION FEES. Annual inspection fees
31 under this chapter shall be as follows:

- 32 1. Permit fees, ~~five~~ ten dollars per
33 year.
- 34 2. Mechanical and electrical inspection fees for amusement
35 rides and devices, ~~thirty-five~~ forty dollars for each inspec-

1 tion.

2 3. Electrical inspection of concessions, booths, and
3 amusement devices fees, ~~ten~~ fifteen dollars each.

4 4. Special inspectors authorization fee, two dollars
5 each. The special inspectors authorization shall allow a
6 person to perform inspections only on rides, devices, and
7 concession booths of an operator who makes the request for
8 the special inspectors authorization.

9 Sec. 3. Section eighty-nine point six (89.6), subsection
10 one (1), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

11 1. The inspection required by this chapter shall not be made
12 by the state boiler inspector where any owner or user of any
13 equipment specified by this chapter obtains an inspection by
14 a representative of reputable insurance company and obtains
15 a policy of insurance from said company upon said equipment.

16 The insurance company shall file a certificate of inspection on
17 forms approved by the commissioner of labor stating that such
18 equipment is insured and that inspection shall be made in
19 accordance with section 89.2. Upon such showing and the pay-
20 ment of a fee of ~~two~~ five dollars the commissioner of
21 labor shall issue a certificate of inspection by the bureau
22 of labor which shall be valid only for the period specified
23 in section 89.2.

24 Upon such showing and the payment of a fee of ~~two~~ five
25 dollars for each one-year inspection and ~~four~~ ten dollars
26 for each two-year inspection, the commissioner of labor shall
27 issue a certificate of inspection by the bureau of labor, which
28 shall be valid only for the period specified in section 89.2.

29 Sec. 4. Section eighty-nine point seven (89.7), subsection
30 six (6), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

31 6. If at any time the owner, user or agent of the owner of
32 a steam boiler or equipment within the state shall desire a special
33 inspection of any boiler or equipment, it shall be made by the
34 boiler inspection department after due request therefor, and the
35 inspector making the inspection shall collect a fee of ~~ten~~

1 twenty dollars for each boiler, together with his expenses in
2 connection therewith.

3 Sec. 5. All federal grants to and the federal receipts of
4 the agencies appropriated funds under this Act are appropriated
5 for the purposes set forth in such federal grants or receipts.

6 EXPLANATION

7 Employment Security Commission

8 This appropriation funds the administration of the following
9 responsibilities assigned to the employment security
10 commission:

11 Securing of quarterly wage reports for social security
12 coverage of about 168,000 public employees from 2,950 political
13 subdivisions and submitting such wage reports and contributions
14 to H.E.W.

15 Provides for administering teacher retirement pension
16 payments to eligible teachers who retired from teaching prior
17 to July 1, 1953. There were 381 recipients December 31, 1973
18 and 344 as of December 31, 1974.

19 When the Iowa old age and survivors insurance system Act
20 was repealed in 1953, rights were preserved for all members
21 fully insured as of June 30, 1953 who were not in public
22 employment as of that date. Currently, benefits are being
23 paid to approximately 1865 recipients. This appropriation
24 also funds the administration of this program.

25 The number of authorized positions remains the same as
26 the current table of organization.

27 Industrial Commissioner

28 Substantial changes in the Iowa workmen's compensation
29 laws were enacted by the Sixty-fifth General Assembly such
30 as the inclusion of most agricultural employees and most
31 domestic and casual employees, an unlimited healing period
32 for permanent partial disabilities, full coverage of work
33 related diseases, the removal of any limitation on the amount
34 or duration for medical care, etc. Because of this additional
35 workload, two additional positions, 1 deputy commissioner

1 and 1 clerk typist II are funded in this appropriation plus
2 sufficient support money to fund these additional positions
3 and the additional workload.

4 Bureau of Labor

5 The appropriation of \$765,897 funds the following programs:
6 administration, \$84,499; amusement park-ride inspection,
7 \$57,580; boiler inspection, \$102,554; child labor & migrant
8 labor, \$21,819; elevator inspection, \$81,369; occupational
9 injury & illness statistical program, \$40,057; occupational
10 safety and health education, \$60,000; occupational safety
11 and health inspection, \$318,019. Federal match in the amount
12 of \$519,495 is anticipated. Funds for one new position (hear-
13 ing officer) has been funded in administration.

14 Occupational Safety and Health Review Commission

15 Funds for this commission, except for elevator inspection
16 cases, are 50% federal funds transferred from the bureau of
17 labor and 50% state funds. The increased workload is becom-
18 ing very demanding on the board so it has requested that a
19 hearing officer be added to the table of organization plus
20 a clerk steno I. The board members' per diem and expense
21 request was adjusted downward from the departmental request
22 due to the funding of these two additional positions.

23 Public Employment Relations Board

24 The appropriation of \$379,418 includes \$250,813 to fund
25 19 positions, \$37,605 for travel, \$16,000 for general office
26 expense, \$5,000 for equipment, \$21,600 for part-time election
27 employees, and \$48,400 for court reporting costs. This
28 appropriation is based on the department's anticipated workload
29 and the committee feels this new agency should be funded
30 adequately to meet that workload.

31 Section 2 amends the fee structure of amusement park-ride
32 inspection.

33 Sections 3 and 4 amend the fee structure for boiler
34 inspection.

APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE FINANCING OF PROGRAMS UNDER THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE IOWA EMPLOYMENT SECURITY COMMISSION, THE INDUSTRIAL COMMISSIONER, THE BUREAU OF LABOR, THE OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH REVIEW COMMISSION AND THE PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT RELATIONS BOARD AND RELATING TO FEES COLLECTED BY THE BUREAU OF LABOR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:
