A BILL FOR

1 An Act making appropriations to various state agencies for
 2 the purposes of providing for capital improvements, reim-
 3 bursement of state educational institutions for deficiencies
 4 in operating funds from funds pledged to finance academic
 5 and administrative buildings and facility services, pro-
 6 viding funds to lease data processing equipment, funding
 7 the purchase of certain equipment, providing funds for
 8 sewage works purposes, creating a hospital schools
 9 revolving fund and providing for expenditures from such
 10 fund, providing for land acquisition, providing a memorial
 11 for medal of honor recipients, and providing for the
 12 reversion of funds.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund
2 of the state for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1975,
3 to the following named agencies for the purposes indicated,
4 the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary:

5 1. IOWA BEER AND LIQUOR CONTROL
6 DEPARTMENT

7 For renovation of stores and equip-
8 ment and converting to self-service
9 stores \$ 180,000

10 2. STATE BOARD OF REGENTS

11 a. To supplement any prior appro-
12 priations for capital improvement items
13 for construction of new buildings, re-
14 pairs, improvements or purchase of land,
15 leases, equipment, replacements or al-
16 terations, or for any other capital ex-
17 penditures the state board of regents
18 may deem necessary for the proper and
19 necessary functions of all institutions
20 under its jurisdiction \$3,700,000

21 b. For detailed architectural
22 plans for a seeds laboratory facility
23 at Iowa state university there shall
24 be allocated from funds appropriated
25 by paragraph a of this subsection the
26 sum of seventy-five thousand (75,000)
27 dollars, or so much thereof as may be
28 necessary.

29 c. For allocation by the state
30 board of regents to the state univer-
31 sity of Iowa, the Iowa state university
32 of science and technology, and the uni-
33 versity of northern Iowa in such amounts
34 as may be necessary to reimburse such
35 institutions for deficiencies in their

1 operating funds resulting from the pledg-
2 ing of tuitions, student fees and charges
3 and institutional income to finance the
4 cost of providing academic and adminis-
5 trative buildings and facilities and
6 utilities services at such institutions
7 of higher learning \$3,340,000

8 3. CAPITOL PLANNING COMMISSION

9 For planning, specifications, and
10 contract for the power plant includ-
11 ing the demonstration solar energy
12 unit which will convert solar energy
13 to steam for the use of the heating
14 and cooling of the state house com-
15 plex, the total cost of which is not
16 to exceed three million two hundred
17 thousand (3,200,000) dollars \$ 300,000

18 4. STATE COMPTROLLER

19 For leasing, with the option
20 to purchase, two central data pro-
21 cessing units, one Kodak KMO-80
22 microfilmer and Collins "C" system \$1,500,000

23 5. STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

24 For construction, replacement,
25 development and alterations to state
26 parks and preserves, state forestry
27 facilities and state waters includ-
28 ing artificial lake development; ero-
29 sion and siltation control; river,
30 stream and lake access, fish hatch-
31 ery construction; land acquisition;
32 and engineering and planning ser-
33 vices or to supplement any prior
34 appropriation for such purposes \$3,700,000

35 6. ENERGY POLICY COUNCIL

1 For implementation of House
2 File four hundred thirty-three
3 (433) enacted by the Sixty-sixth
4 General Assembly, First Session \$2,500,000

5 7. IOWA STATE FAIR BOARD
6 For major repairs to buildings
7 and grounds \$ 500,000

8 8. DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES
9 a. For restoration of the ex-
10 terior masonry of the capitol build-
11 ing; for new roofs and roof repairs,
12 for grading and surfacing of parking
13 lots for tunnel entrances and repairs;
14 for utilities, mechanical equipment
15 and fixtures, repair and replacement;
16 for remedial repairs to miscellaneous
17 buildings and monuments; automatic
18 and new elevator cars for the capitol
19 building; for rewiring Lucas build-
20 ing lighting circuits; for laboratory
21 building window and door painting, re-
22 placement and repair, for remedial re-
23 pairs to court avenue viaduct; for
24 phase II of the restoration of first
25 floor ceilings in the capitol build-
26 ing; for phase I of redesigning and
27 replanting of garden areas; for capi-
28 tol and Lucas building lock hardware
29 replacement; for phase II of sidewalk
30 replacement \$ 730,000

31 b. To supplement funds appropri-
32 ated in chapter one thousand fifty-
33 seven (1057), section one (1), Acts
34 of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly,
35 1974 Session, and to provide suffi-

1 cient funds for the completion of a
2 state agricultural building to be
3 known as the Henry A. Wallace build-
4 ing and to supplement funds appropri-
5 ated in Acts of the Sixty-fifth Gen-
6 eral Assembly, 1973 Session, chapter
7 ninety-seven (97), section one (1),
8 subsection three (3), as amended by
9 Acts of the Sixty-fifth General As-
10 sembly, 1974 Session, chapter one
11 thousand fifty-eight (1058), section
12 one (1), to provide sufficient funds
13 for the completion of a state office
14 building in accordance with plans de-
15 veloped, providing a total cost of
16 construction of the Henry A. Wallace
17 building and the state office build-
18 ing not to exceed twenty-three million
19 three hundred thousand (23,300,000)
20 dollars if the contracts for con-
21 struction of the Henry A. Wallace
22 building and the state office build-
23 ing are awarded no later than Novem-
24 ber 1, 1975 \$3,000,000

25 All unencumbered funds appro-
26 priated for the purposes set forth
27 in this paragraph shall revert to
28 the general fund of the state as of
29 December 31, 1975, if contracts have
30 not been awarded for construction of
31 the Henry A. Wallace building and
32 the state office building by Novem-
33 ber 1, 1975. If such contracts are
34 awarded by November 1, 1975 unobli-
35 gated or unencumbered funds remaining

1 on June 30, 1979 shall revert to the
2 general fund on September 30, 1979.

3 c. For use of the educational
4 radio and television facility board
5 for the purchase of a video tape
6 recorder, a film projection center,
7 and a character generator \$ 226,500

8 9. SEWAGE WORKS CONSTRUCTION FUND

9 a. For the purpose of provid-
10 ing the state's twenty-five percent
11 of the eligible cost of eligible
12 projects as defined under section
13 four hundred fifty-five B point
14 sixty-seven (455B.67), subsection
15 four (4) of the Code, attributable
16 to the period July 1, 1966, through
17 June 30, 1969 \$1,651,558

18 b. For the sewage works con-
19 struction fund under section four
20 hundred fifty-five B point sixty-
21 seven (455B.67) of the Code to be
22 used for the purpose of paying to
23 those municipalities which were
24 eligible for fifty or fifty-five
25 percent grants, an amount equal
26 to twenty-five percent of the ac-
27 tual eligible project cost not
28 provided for in any prior appro-
29 priation \$1,900,000

30 c. For paying to those mu-
31 nicipalities which are eligible
32 for seventy-five percent grants
33 under the federal Water Pollution
34 Act amendments of 1972, eighty-
35 six (86) Stat. eight hundred six-

1 teen (816), an amount equal to
2 five percent of the amount ap-
3 proved as the eligible cost of
4 the project by the Iowa water
5 pollution control commission \$4,824,800

6 10. DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES

7 a. For the inflationary fac-
8 tor in new construction at the Iowa
9 veterans home at Marshalltown \$ 575,000

10 b. For the deposit in the hos-
11 pital schools revolving fund created
12 by section two (2) of this Act \$ 500,000

13 Unobligated or unencumbered funds
14 appropriated by this paragraph shall
15 not revert to the general fund of the
16 state until the attainment of the ob-
17 ject or the completion of the work
18 for which such appropriation is made.

19 c. To supplement any prior appro-
20 priations for capital improvement items
21 for repairs, improvements, replacements,
22 or alternations, or for any capital ex-
23 penditures the department of social ser-
24 vices may deem necessary for the proper
25 and necessary function of any institu-
26 tions under its jurisdiction \$ 925,000

27 11. DEPARTMENT OF SOIL CONSERVATION

28 For cost sharing to provide state
29 funding of not to exceed fifty percent
30 of the approved cost of permanent soil

33 (467A) of the Code with priority given
34 to projects on watersheds above state-
35 owned lakes, except that not more than

1 five percent of the amount herein ap-
2 propriated may be used for cost shar-

5 point forty-seven (467A.47) and four
6 hundred sixty-seven A point forty-

8 12. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC DEFENSE

9 a. For the state's share of
10 the armory construction program made
11 available to the state by the federal
12 government for the acquisition, con-
13 struction, expansion, rehabilitation
14 and converting facilities of the ad-
15 ministration and training units of
16 the national guard and state guard \$ 380,000

17 b. Unobligated or unencum-
18 bered funds remaining on June 30,
19 1979, from funds appropriated by
20 this subsection shall revert to
21 the general fund on September 30,
22 1979.

23 13. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

24 a. For radio equipment and
25 related items pertaining to the con-
26 version of stations from low band to
27 high band \$ 301,000

28 b. For repair and replace-
29 ment of towers \$ 150,000

30 c. Unobligated or unencum-
31 bered funds remaining on June 30,
32 1979, from funds appropriated by
33 this subsection shall revert to
34 the general fund on September 30,
35 1979.

1 14. IOWA STATE HISTORICAL DE-
2 PARTMENT

3 a. For land acquisition
4 at Toolsboro \$ 7,000

5 b. For purchase of a manu-
6 scripts fumigator \$ 4,000

7 Sec. 2.

8 1. There is created a revolving fund within the state
9 treasury to be known as the "hospital schools revolving fund"
10 which shall be used and administered as provided in this
11 section. The hospital schools revolving fund shall be used
12 for capital projects at the Glenwood and Woodward hospital
13 schools, which capital projects will bring the hospital schools
14 into compliance with federal and state standards relating
15 to physical facilities in order to have approved mental
16 retardation-intermediate care facilities as authorized under
17 Title nineteen (XIX) of the United States Social Security
18 Act.

19 2. The hospital schools revolving fund shall be composed
20 of moneys appropriated by the general assembly for capital
21 expenditures at the hospital schools and moneys which become
22 available from the federal government for such purposes
23 pursuant to Title nineteen (XIX) of the United States Social
24 Security Act.

25 Sec. 3. Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1973
26 Session, chapter one hundred fourteen (114), section one (1),
27 is amended to read as follows:

28 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund
29 of the state to the department of social services for the
30 biennium commencing July 1, 1973 and ending June 30, 1975,
31 the sum of three million (3,000,000) dollars, or so much
32 thereof as is necessary, to be used to supplement any prior
33 appropriations for capital improvement items for repairs,
34 improvements, replacements, or alterations, or for any capital
35 expenditures the department of social services may deem

1 necessary, except as otherwise provided in this Act, for the
2 proper and necessary function of any institution under its
3 jurisdiction. Funds appropriated by this section except the
4 sum of three hundred sixty thousand (360,000) dollars which
5 shall be deposited in the hospital schools revolving fund
6 on July 1, 1975, shall not be used to supplement the
7 construction of new buildings.

8 Sec. 4. Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1973
9 Session, chapter one hundred fourteen (114), section five
10 (5), is amended to read as follows:

11 Sec. 5. Funds appropriated by this Act shall not be sub-
12 ject to reversion as provided in section eight point thirty-
13 three (8.33) of the Code, however, any unencumbered balance
14 of the appropriation made by this Act, except the funds
15 deposited in the hospital schools revolving fund, remaining
16 as of June 30, 1977, shall revert to the general fund of the
17 state as of June 30, 1977.

18 Sec. 5. Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1974
19 Session, chapter one thousand twenty-six (1026), section one
20 (1), subsection five (5), is amended to read as follows:

21 5. RATHBUN LAKE
22 Area land purchase and prepara-
23 tion of a bidding prospectus for
24 private construction development and
25 operation of a resort-lodge com-
26 plex \$1,000,000

27 Sec. 6. There is appropriated from the general fund of
28 the state to the bonus board for the fiscal year beginning
29 July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1976 the sum of ten thousand
30 (10,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary,
31 for the purpose of constructing, dedicating and maintaining
32 a state memorial commemorating citizens of this state who
33 have been awarded the medal of honor, in the Medal of Honor
34 Grove, Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge, Valley Forge,
35 Pennsylvania. The members of the bonus board or their designee

1 shall be responsible for carrying out the provisions of this
2 section and may enter into a contract or agreement on behalf
3 of the state for such purpose.

4 Sec. 7. There is appropriated from the road use tax fund
5 of the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975, and
6 ending June 30, 1976, to the state department of transportation
7 the sum of four hundred thirty thousand (430,000) dollars,
8 or so much as may be necessary, to be used to purchase scales
9 for traffic weight stations and radios for the motor truck
10 enforcement cars.

11 Sec. 8. There is appropriated the remainder of the state
12 fish and game protection fund for use by the state conservation
13 commission for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975, and
14 ending June 30, 1976, for capital improvements and
15 contingencies arising during the fiscal year which are legally
16 payable from the fish and game protection fund. The remainder
17 is defined as the amount within the fish and game protection
18 fund that is not appropriated by Senate File five hundred
19 six (506), section one (1), subsection two (2), enacted by
20 the Sixty-sixth General Assembly, 1975 Session. A contingency
21 shall exclude any purpose or project which was presented to
22 the general assembly by way of a bill and which failed to
23 become enacted into law. Before any funds shall be allocated,
24 it shall be determined by the executive council that a
25 contingency exists and that the proposed allocation shall
26 be for the best interest of the state.

27 Sec. 9. Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1973
28 Session, chapter one hundred four (104), section four (4),
29 is amended to read as follows:

30 Sec. 4. Any unencumbered balance of funds appropriated
31 by this Act remaining as of June 30, 1975 may, notwithstanding
32 section one (1) of chapter one hundred four (104), be expended
33 during fiscal year 1975-1976 and shall revert to the general
34 fund of the state as of June 30, ~~1975~~ 1976.

35 Sec. 10. Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1974

3 Sec. 3. From funds appropriated by section one (1) of
4 this Act, not less than five hundred thousand (500,000) dollars

6 one hundred thousand (100,000) dollars shall be used to
7 contract for an independent study of the feasibility and
8 economics of dredging all lakes especially including Black

24 1. Unobligated or unencumbered funds remaining from funds
25 appropriated by this Act for which a specific reversion pro-
26 vision is provided shall revert to the fund from which appro-
27 priated pursuant to such provision.

28 2. Unobligated or unencumbered funds remaining as of June
29 30, 1976 from funds appropriated by this Act for the fiscal
30 year beginning July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1976, shall
31 revert to the fund from which appropriated on September 30,
32 1976.

33 3. Unobligated or unencumbered funds remaining on June
34 30, 1976 from funds appropriated by the following provisions
35 of this Act shall revert to the fund from which appropriated

1 on September 30, 1976:

30 EXPLANATION

31 This bill makes a number of appropriations to state agencies
32 enumerated in the bill for capital improvements and for
33 supplementing appropriations previously made for capital
34 improvements. It also provides for equipment purchase for
35 a number of departments and provides funds for repair of

1 existing state structures. Funds are appropriated to the
2 sewage works construction fund for payment to municipalities.
3 A hospital schools revolving fund is created which will provide
4 funds for the two state hospital schools to meet capital
5 requirements of the federal government. Funds are appropriated
6 for a memorial to persons of this state who have received
7 the medal of honor. Funds appropriated by this bill and Acts
8 which this bill amends will revert at various times and
9 detailed reversion sections provide for such reversions.

I hereby transmit House File 898, An Act making appropriations to various state agencies for the purposes of providing for capital improvements, reimbursement of state educational institutions for deficiencies in operating funds from funds pledged to finance academic and administrative buildings and facility services, providing funds to lease data processing equipment, funding the purchase of certain equipment, providing funds for sewage works purposes, creating a hospital schools revolving fund and providing for expenditures from such fund, providing for land acquisition, providing a memorial for medal of honor recipients, restoring flags exhibited in the state capitol, and providing for the reversion of funds.

House File 898 is approved July 18, 1975, with the following exception which I hereby disapprove.

I am unable to approve Item 7 designated in the Act as Section 7 which reads as follows:

"Sec. 7. Chapter one hundred seven (107), Code 1975, is amended by adding the following new section:

NEW SECTION. The state conservation commission shall make annual payments to school districts in such amounts sufficient to pay school taxes on lands acquired under the provisions of the Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, chapter seventy-four (74), 1973 Session, and under the authority of any other Act of the general assembly which authorizes the acquisition of land which would otherwise be subject to the levy of school taxes. There is appropriated annually from the general fund of the state from funds not otherwise appropriated to the state conservation commission an amount sufficient to make the payments provided for in this section. The state comptroller shall administer the funds appropriated by this Act and shall administer the program established by this section. The state conservation commission shall cooperate with the state comptroller in order to provide information necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.

This item provides a standing unlimited appropriation to the State Conservation Commission to make annual payments to school districts for reimbursement of property taxes lost on lands taken off the property tax rolls under the Open Spaces program and any other Act of the General Assembly. The apparent intent of this is to prevent a change in the property tax rate for the remaining property holders.

Section 7 of House File 898 directs the State Comptroller to administer the reimbursement program. Unfortunately this item goes no further than that. The item does not indicate what evaluation should be used; nor does it affect assessments; no method or direction is provided for computation of the payment to school districts; no instructions are given for what millage rates might be used. In short it is an inoperable section.

Even if one could determine the procedure to be used to administer this program, it seems apparent that the reimbursement of property taxes would not secure any reduction in existing property taxes. Under the school aid formula, this reimbursement would be treated as "miscellaneous income" and would be considered as an addition to all other school income funds. This payment would not replace any property taxes that are already levied, but just provide new dollars in the form of a special bonus to select and favored school districts. No reduction in property taxes would be accomplished.

Section 7 specifically states that the property tax reimbursement is to be provided for lands acquired under the Open Spaces program and "under the authority of any other Act of the General Assembly which authorizes the acquisition of land which would otherwise be subject to the levy of school taxes." This language carries no past or future limitations. One must assume that it is intended to include all other conservation land, the property of the Regents' universities, our highways, our Social Services institutions, and even the State Capitol. One of the consequences of such an extensive reimbursement program might be that the residents of the school districts where open space land is located would end up paying more than they would receive.

While one can assume that the cost of such a far-ranging reimbursement program would be enormous, it is impossible to provide any accurate cost figure. Data is unavailable as to the number of acres that would be involved, what they would be valued at, or what the total cost of reimbursement would be.

If research were done on this section as to costs, my office, the Department of Revenue, the Comptroller, and the Department of Public Instruction are unaware of it. Neither do I believe that the Legislative Fiscal Director or his staff are aware of the cost, for I find nothing in their budget to reflect the reimbursement program.

Even if Section 7 of House File 898 were designed to be functional and its scope and funding implications understood, I strongly doubt the overall soundness of this type of reimbursement for school districts or any other taxing district. The specter of several deleterious effects is raised by this item.

If schools are to be reimbursed for the property taxes they forego on state land, one must ask why not then reimburse schools for all other government-owned lands in the district. That would mean federal, county, and the city governments would reimburse school districts also.

If it is consistent for other government agencies to reimburse schools, then is it not consistent for schools to reimburse other government agencies for the property tax exempt land they own? It actually makes more sense for schools to reimburse city and county government for the basic services they receive (e.g. police and fire protection) than for the state and its other subdivisions to reimburse schools when no direct service is being provided.

To begin a program of property tax reimbursement triggers the related question of how property, ownership, and local services provided ought to relate. The concept of reimbursement for tax exempted land could easily be extended to other than government land. Conceivably, charitable institutions, such as churches and lodges, might be asked to pay taxes for the basic services provided to them by government.

The Iowa Open Spaces program since its inception in 1973, has been a successful effort to preserve scenic Iowa countryside for future generations. One of the key parts of the Open Spaces program is that land is purchased only from willing sellers. Never does the state condemn land to force a sale for this program.

The state has used its money for Open Spaces to purchase the land where local government agencies either could not or would not. With acquisition of land by the state, direct benefits usually accrue to the local community. In addition to preserving and improving the aesthetic value of the countryside, state land purchases in most cases result in more money spent in the surrounding area, other improvements, and a broader tax base.

While the legislators who supported this item were legitimately concerned with the decline of the property tax base of school district it should be pointed out that the state is making a massive effort through the school foundation plan to move the burden of school financing from property taxes to state taxes. Since FY 1971, state aid for local schools has increased from \$226 million to \$458 million in FY 1976. The state has increased its share of the funding of school budgets from 38% in 1971 to 52% for this next school year.



This influx of state aid is reflected at the local level. In one of the school districts that has a large share of the Open Spaces land in it, state aid has increased from \$120,000 in FY 1971 to \$342,000 in FY 1976, a 186% increase.

House File 898 (in subsection 5 of section 1) also provides for a one-year property tax reimbursement program for school districts. This item, which is estimated to cost up to \$15,000, could be removed also, but in light of the recent Supreme Court decision limiting my item veto authority, we believe it would necessitate removing the \$3.7 million capital appropriation to the Conservation Commission as well. It is important that these capital funds be retained to make necessary improvements and acquisitions. Reluctantly, therefore, I am not affecting this one-year reimbursement program.

For these reasons I hereby disapprove this item in accordance with Amendment 4 of the Amendments of 1968 to the Constitution of the State of Iowa. All other items of House File 898 are hereby approved this date.

MAKING APPROPRIATIONS TO VARIOUS STATE AGENCIES FOR THE PURPOSES OF PROVIDING FOR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS, REIMBURSEMENT OF STATE EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS FOR DEFICIENCIES IN OPERATING FUNDS FROM FUNDS PLEDGED TO FINANCE ACADEMIC AND ADMINISTRATIVE BUILDINGS AND FACILITY SERVICES, PROVIDING FUNDS TO LEASE DATA PROCESSING EQUIPMENT, FUNDING THE PURCHASE OF CERTAIN EQUIPMENT, PROVIDING FUNDS FOR SEWAGE WORKS PURPOSES, CREATING A HOSPITAL SCHOOLS REVOLVING FUND AND PROVIDING FOR EXPENDITURES FROM SUCH FUND, PROVIDING FOR LAND ACQUISITION, PROVIDING A MEMORIAL FOR MEDAL OF HONOR RECIPIENTS, RESTORING FLAGS EXHIBITED IN THE STATE CAPITOL, AND PROVIDING FOR THE REVERSION OF FUNDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1975, to the following named agencies for the purposes indicated, the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary:

1. IOWA BEER AND LIQUOR CONTROL

DEPARTMENT

For renovation of stores and equipment and converting to self-service stores \$ 180,000

2. STATE BOARD OF REGENTS

a. To supplement any prior appropriations for capital improvement items for construction of new buildings, repairs, improvements or purchase of land, leases, equipment, replacements or alterations, or for any other capital expenditures the state board of regents may deem necessary for the proper and necessary functions of all institutions

under its jurisdiction, including alterations for the main building at Iowa braille and sight-saving school, and remodeling and centralizing food service operations at the school for the deaf \$3,700,000

b. For detailed architectural plans for a seeds laboratory facility at Iowa state university there shall be allocated from funds appropriated by paragraph a of this subsection the sum of seventy-five thousand (75,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary.

c. For allocation by the state board of regents to the state university of Iowa, the Iowa state university of science and technology, and the university of northern Iowa in such amounts as may be necessary to reimburse such institutions for deficiencies in their operating funds resulting from the pledging of tuitions, student fees and charges and institutional income to finance the cost of providing academic and administrative buildings and facilities and utilities services at such institutions of higher learning \$3,340,000

3. CAPITOL PLANNING COMMISSION

For planning, specifications, and preparation of contracts for the power plant including the demonstration solar energy unit which will convert solar energy to steam for the use of the heating and cooling of the state house complex, the total cost, including the funds appropriated by this subsection, shall

not exceed three million two hundred thousand (3,200,000) dollars \$ 300,000

4. STATE COMPTROLLER

For leasing, with the option to purchase, two central data processing units, one Kodak KMO-80 microfilmer and Collins "C" system \$1,500,000

5. STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION

For construction, replacement, development and alterations to state parks and preserves, state forestry facilities and state waters including artificial lake development; erosion and siltation control; river, stream and lake access, fish hatchery construction; land acquisition; and engineering and planning services or to supplement any prior appropriation for such purposes \$3,700,000

Prior to the expenditure of funds appropriated by this paragraph, an amount sufficient to pay school taxes on land acquired under the provisions of the Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, chapter seventy-four (74), 1973 Session, and land acquired pursuant to this Act, shall be deducted from the funds appropriated by this paragraph and shall be paid to the school districts in which such lands are located.

6. ENERGY POLICY COUNCIL

For implementation of House File four hundred thirty-three (433) enacted by the Sixty-sixth

General Assembly, First Session \$3,000,000

7. IOWA STATE FAIR BOARD

For major repairs to buildings and grounds \$ 500,000

8. DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES

a. For restoration of the exterior masonry of the capitol building; for new roofs and roof repairs, for grading and surfacing of parking lots; for tunnel entrances and repairs; for utilities, mechanical equipment and fixtures, repair and replacement; for remedial repairs to miscellaneous buildings and monuments; for rewiring Lucas building lighting circuits; for laboratory building window and door painting, replacement and repair, for remedial repairs to court avenue viaduct; for phase II of the restoration of first floor ceilings in the capitol building; for phase I of redesigning and replanting of garden areas; for capitol and Lucas building lock hardware replacement; for phase II of sidewalk replacement \$ 700,000

b. To supplement funds appropriated in chapter one thousand fifty-seven (1057), section one (1), Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1974 Session, and to provide sufficient funds for the completion of a state agricultural building to be known as the Henry A. Wallace building and to supplement funds appropriated in Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1973 Session, chapter ninety-seven (97), section one (1),

subsection three (3), as amended by Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1974 Session, chapter one thousand fifty-eight (1058), section one (1), to provide sufficient funds for the completion of a state office building in accordance with plans developed, providing a total cost of construction of the Henry A. Wallace building and the state office building not to exceed twenty-three million three hundred thousand (23,300,000) dollars if the contracts for construction of the Henry A. Wallace building and the state office building are awarded no later than November 1, 1975 \$3,000,000

All unencumbered funds appropriated for the purposes set forth in this paragraph shall revert to the general fund of the state as of December 31, 1975, if contracts have not been awarded for construction of the Henry A. Wallace building and the state office building by November 1, 1975. If such contracts are awarded by November 1, 1975 unobligated or unencumbered funds remaining on June 30, 1979 shall revert to the general fund on September 30, 1979.

c. For use of the educational radio and television facility board for the purchase of a video tape recorder, a film projection center, and a character generator \$ 226,500

9. SEWAGE WORKS CONSTRUCTION FUND

a. For the purpose of provid-

ing the state's twenty-five percent of the eligible cost of eligible projects as defined under section four hundred fifty-five B point sixty-seven (455B.67), subsection four (4) of the Code, attributable to the period July 1, 1966, through June 30, 1969 \$1,651,558

b. For the sewage works construction fund under section four hundred fifty-five B point sixty-seven (455B.67) of the Code to be used for the purpose of paying to those municipalities which were eligible for fifty or fifty-five percent grants, an amount equal to twenty-five percent of the actual eligible project cost not provided for in any prior appropriation \$1,900,000

c. For paying to those municipalities which are eligible for seventy-five percent grants under the federal Water Pollution Act amendments of 1972, eighty-six (86) Stat. eight hundred sixteen (816), an amount equal to five percent of the amount approved as the eligible cost of the project by the Iowa water pollution control commission \$4,824,800

10. DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES

a. For the inflationary factor in new construction at the Iowa veterans home at Marshalltown \$ 575,000

b. For the deposit in the hospital schools revolving fund created

by section two (2) of this Act \$ 500,000

Unobligated or unencumbered funds appropriated by this paragraph shall not revert to the general fund of the state until the attainment of the object or the completion of the work for which such appropriation is made.

c. To supplement any prior appropriations for capital improvement items for repairs, improvements, replacements, or alterations, or for any capital expenditures the department of social services may deem necessary for the proper and necessary function of any institutions under its jurisdiction \$ 925,000

11. DEPARTMENT OF SOIL CONSERVATION

For cost sharing to provide state funding of not to exceed fifty percent of the approved cost of permanent soil conservation practices instituted under chapter four hundred sixty-seven A (467A) of the Code with priority given to projects on watersheds above state-owned lakes, except that not more than five percent of the amount herein appropriated may be used for cost sharing to abate complaints filed under sections four hundred sixty-seven A point forty-seven (467A.47) and four hundred sixty-seven A point forty-eight (467A.48) of the Code \$2,500,000

12. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC DEFENSE

a. For the state's share of the armory construction program made available to the state by the federal government for the acquisition, construction, expansion, rehabilitation

and converting facilities of the administration and training units of the national guard and state guard \$ 380,000

b. For restoring the flags exhibited on the first floor of the state capitol \$ 50,000

c. For repair, replacement, alteration, equipment and rehabilitation of national guard armory facilities throughout the state, including the maintenance and repair of equipment required for use of such facilities \$ 130,000

d. For repair, replacement, alteration, equipment and rehabilitation of buildings, grounds, roads and facilities located within the Camp Dodge military reservation \$ 130,000

e. Unobligated or unencumbered funds remaining on June 30, 1979, from funds appropriated by this subsection shall revert to the general fund on September 30, 1979.

13. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

a. For radio equipment and related items pertaining to the conversion of stations from low band to high band \$ 301,000

b. For repair and replacement of towers \$ 150,000

c. Unobligated or unencumbered funds remaining on June 30, 1979, from funds appropriated by this subsection shall revert to the general fund on September 30, 1979.

14. IOWA STATE HISTORICAL DEPARTMENT

- a. For land acquisition at Toolsboro \$ 7,000
- b. For purchase of a manuscripts fumigator \$ 4,000

15. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

For replacement of films, film strips, books, and other educational media material destroyed in the Ankeny, Iowa fire \$1,000,000

Unobligated or unencumbered funds remaining on June 30, 1976 from funds appropriated by this subsection shall revert to the general fund on September 30, 1976.

Sec. 2.

1. There is created a revolving fund within the state treasury to be known as the "hospital schools revolving fund" which shall be used and administered as provided in this section. The hospital schools revolving fund shall be used for capital projects at the Glenwood and Woodward hospital schools, which capital projects will bring the hospital schools into compliance with federal and state standards relating to physical facilities in order to have approved mental retardation-intermediate care facilities as authorized under Title nineteen (XIX) of the United States Social Security Act.

2. The hospital schools revolving fund shall be composed of moneys appropriated by the general assembly for capital expenditures at the hospital schools and moneys which become available from the federal government for such purposes pursuant to Title nineteen (XIX) of the United States Social Security Act.

Sec. 3. Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1973 Session, chapter one hundred fourteen (114), section one (1), is amended to read as follows:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund

of the state to the department of social services for the biennium commencing July 1, 1973 and ending June 30, 1975, the sum of three million (3,000,000) dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used to supplement any prior appropriations for capital improvement items for repairs, improvements, replacements, or alterations, or for any capital expenditures the department of social services may deem necessary, except as otherwise provided in this Act, for the proper and necessary function of any institution under its jurisdiction. Funds appropriated by this section except the sum of three hundred sixty thousand (360,000) dollars which shall be deposited in the hospital schools revolving fund on July 1, 1975, shall not be used to supplement the construction of new buildings.

Sec. 4. Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1973 Session, chapter one hundred fourteen (114), section five (5), is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 5. Funds appropriated by this Act shall not be subject to reversion as provided in section eight point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code, however, any unencumbered balance of the appropriation made by this Act, except the funds deposited in the hospital schools revolving fund, remaining as of June 30, 1977, shall revert to the general fund of the state as of June 30, 1977.

Sec. 5. Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1974 Session, chapter one thousand twenty-six (1026), section one (1), subsection five (5), is amended to read as follows:

5. RATHBUN LAKE

Area land purchase and preparation of a bidding prospectus for private construction development and operation of a resort-lodge complex \$1,000,000

Sec. 6. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the bonus board for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1976 the sum of ten thousand (10,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary,

for the purpose of constructing, dedicating and maintaining a state memorial commemorating citizens of this state who have been awarded the medal of honor, in the Medal of Honor Grove, Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge, Valley Forge, Pennsylvania. The members of the bonus board or their designee shall be responsible for carrying out the provisions of this section and may enter into a contract or agreement on behalf of the state for such purpose.

Sec. 7. Chapter one hundred seven (107), Code 1975, is amended by adding the following new section:

NEW SECTION. The state conservation commission shall make annual payments to school districts in such amounts sufficient to pay school taxes on lands acquired under the provisions of the Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, chapter seventy-four (74), 1973 Session, and under the authority of any other Act of the general assembly which authorizes the acquisition of land which would otherwise be subject to the levy of school taxes. There is appropriated annually from the general fund of the state from funds not otherwise appropriated to the state conservation commission an amount sufficient to make the payments provided for in this section. The state comptroller shall administer the funds appropriated by this Act and shall administer the program established by this section. The state conservation commission shall cooperate with the state comptroller in order to provide information necessary to carry out the provisions of this section.

Sec. 8. There is appropriated from the road use tax fund of the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975, and ending June 30, 1976, to the state department of transportation the sum of four hundred thirty thousand (430,000) dollars, or so much as may be necessary, to be used to purchase scales for traffic weight stations and radios for the motor truck enforcement cars.

Sec. 9. There is appropriated the remainder of the state fish and game protection fund for use by the state conservation commission for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975, and

ending June 30, 1976, for capital improvements and contingencies arising during the fiscal year which are legally payable from the fish and game protection fund. The remainder is defined as the amount within the fish and game protection fund that is not appropriated by Senate File five hundred six (506), section one (1), subsection two (2), enacted by the Sixty-sixth General Assembly, 1975 Session. A contingency shall exclude any purpose or project which was presented to the general assembly by way of a bill and which failed to become enacted into law. Before any funds shall be allocated, it shall be determined by the executive council that a contingency exists and that the proposed allocation shall be for the best interest of the state.

Sec. 10. Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1973 Session, chapter one hundred four (104), section four (4), is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 4. Any unencumbered balance of funds appropriated by this Act remaining as of June 30, 1975 may, notwithstanding section one (1) of chapter one hundred four (104) be expended during fiscal year 1975-1976 and shall revert to the general fund of the state as of June 30, 1975 1976.

Sec. 11. Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1974 Session, chapter one thousand twenty-six (1026), sections three (3) and seven (7), are amended to read as follows:

Sec. 3. From funds appropriated by section one (1) of this Act, not less than five hundred thousand (500,000) dollars shall be set aside for use for dredging and an additional one hundred thousand (100,000) dollars shall be used to contract for an independent study of the feasibility and economics of dredging all lakes especially including Black Hawk Lake, Blue Lake, Silver Lake, and Five Island Lake. No funds shall be used for dredging unless matching federal funds are available.

Sec. 7. Funds appropriated by this Act shall not be used for the purchase, construction, or leasing of resort lodges. Unencumbered funds remaining as of June 30, 1977 shall revert to the general fund of the state on September 30, 1977 except

those funds set aside for dredging under section three (3) of this Act shall revert to the general fund on September 30, 1979, if unencumbered as of June 30, 1979.

Sec. 12. If federal action eliminates or delays into future fiscal year periods certain federal funds previously anticipated as a part of various departmental receipts, there is appropriated from the general fund of the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975, and ending June 30, 1976, to the state comptroller the sum of nine hundred thousand (900,000) dollars to be allocated to the departments to supplement existing appropriations for losses of such federal funds during the fiscal period. No funds shall be allocated under this section without the approval of the governor and the state comptroller.

It is intended that any funds allocated to the state board of regents in this Act to supplement existing appropriations for loss of federal funds during the fiscal year shall be for federal funds lost which were related to educational and capitation grants to the institutions. It is not intended to supplement federal funds relating solely to sponsored research grants to the institutions.

Sec. 13. For any construction of new buildings or substantial modification of existing buildings under this Act the total estimated cost of fine arts elements included in the plans and specifications shall not be less than one-half of one percent of the total appropriation for such construction of new buildings or substantial modification of existing buildings. This section shall apply only to appropriations made pursuant to the following subsections of section one (1) of this Act:

1. Subsection two (2).
2. Subsection five (5).
3. Subsection seven (7).
4. Paragraph b of subsection eight (8).

Sec. 14. As used in this Act, "fine arts" means sculpture, fountains, bas-reliefs, mosaics, frescoes, wall hangings, pictures, photographs or other enhancements to be integrated

into the total environment of such construction. Fine arts does not include the incidental ornamental detail or functional structural elements or hardware and other accessories.

Sec. 15. The appropriate department, commission or board having authority over an appropriation to which the fine arts section applies shall coordinate with the Iowa arts council on matters relating to the inclusion of fine arts authorized by this Act.

Sec. 16. The appropriate department, commission or board must be assured, by the submission of a report by the architects or contractors before construction is begun on any new buildings or substantial modification of existing buildings pursuant to this Act, that the building design has been developed according to maximum energy conservation.

Sec. 17. All federal grants to and the federal receipts of the agencies appropriated funds under this Act are appropriated for the purposes set forth in such federal grants or receipts.

Sec. 18.

1. Unobligated or unencumbered funds remaining from funds appropriated by this Act for which a specific reversion provision is provided shall revert to the fund from which appropriated pursuant to such provision.

2. Unobligated or unencumbered funds remaining as of June 30, 1976 from funds appropriated by this Act for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1976, shall revert to the fund from which appropriated on September 30, 1976.

3. Unobligated or unencumbered funds remaining on June 30, 1976 from funds appropriated by the following provisions of this Act shall revert to the fund from which appropriated on September 30, 1976:

- a. Subsection one (1) of section one (1).
- b. Paragraph c of subsection two (2) of section one (1).
- c. Subsection three (3) of section one (1).
- d. Subsection four (4) of section one (1).
- e. Paragraph c of subsection eight (8) of section one

(1).

f. Subsection fourteen (14) of section one (1).

4. Unobligated or unencumbered funds remaining on June 30, 1977 from funds appropriated by the following provisions of this Act shall revert to the fund from which appropriated on September 30, 1977:

a. Subsection six (6) of section one (1).

b. Subsection seven (7) of section one (1).

c. Paragraph a of subsection eight (8) of section one

(1).

d. Paragraphs a and b of subsection nine (9) of section one (1).

5. Unobligated or unencumbered funds remaining on June 30, 1979 from funds appropriated by the following provisions of this Act shall revert to the fund from which appropriated on September 30, 1979:

a. Paragraphs a and b of subsection two (2) of section one (1).

b. Subsection five (5) of section one (1).

c. Paragraph c of subsection nine (9) of section one (1).

d. Paragraphs a and c of subsection ten (10) of section one (1).

e. Subsection eleven (11) of section one (1).

Sec. 19. The capitol planning commission shall sponsor a statewide contest to name the new state office building provided for in section one (1), subsection eight (8), paragraph b of this Act. All public school classes in Iowa history will be eligible to submit entries accompanied by an essay supporting their selection. It shall be the intent of this contest to not only provide a suitable name for the building, but to stimulate interest in Iowa history and its citizens who have contributed to its growth, welfare, and progress.

The capitol planning commission shall select the winning entry and submit it to the second session of the Sixty-sixth General Assembly for approval.

A suitable prize or award, not to exceed fifty dollars

in cost, will be presented to the winning class.

Expenses for this contest shall be paid from funds appropriated to the capitol planning commission for planning.
