A BILL FOR

1 An Act to appropriate and authorize expenditures for centralized
2 printing, centralized purchasing and the vehicle dispatcher.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general services
2 revolving funds established under chapter eighteen (18) of
3 the Code for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1976 and ending
4 June 30, 1977 the following amounts, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary:

6 1. a. From the centralized
7 printing permanent revolving fund
8 established by section eighteen
9 point fifty-seven (18.57) of the
10 Code for salaries, support,
11 maintenance and miscellaneous
12 purposes \$435,047

13 b. The remainder of the permanent revolving fund is
14 appropriated for the expense incurred in supplying paper
15 stock, offset printing, copy preparation, binding, distri-
16 bution costs, original payment of printing and binding claims
17 and contingencies arising during the fiscal year beginning
18 July 1, 1976 which are legally payable from this fund.

19 2. a. From the general service
20 revolving fund established by sec-
21 tion eighteen point nine (18.9) of
22 the Code for salaries, support,
23 maintenance and miscellaneous pur-
24 poses \$299,261

25 b. The remainder of the revolving fund is appropriated
26 for the payment of expenses incurred through purchases by
27 various state departments and for contingencies arising during
28 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1976 which are legally
29 payable from this fund.

30 3. a. From the vehicle dispatcher
31 revolving fund established by section
32 eighteen point one hundred nineteen
33 (18.119) of the Code for salaries,
34 support, maintenance and miscellaneous
35 purposes \$256,440

1 b. The remainder of the fund is appropriated for the
2 purchase of gasoline, oil, tires, repairs and all other
3 maintenance expenses incurred in the operation of state-owned
4 motor vehicles and for contingencies arising during the fiscal
5 year beginning July 1, 1976 which are legally payable from
6 this fund.

7 Sec. 2.

8 1. A contingency under this Act shall not include any
9 purpose or project which was presented to the general assem-
10 bly or any standing committee or subcommittee of a standing
11 committee by any person by way of a bill, proposed bill,
12 amendment to a bill, written document, or a proposal which
13 is documented by the minutes, records, or reports of a
14 committee or subcommittee, and which failed to be enacted
15 into law. For the purpose of this Act a necessity of addi-
16 tional operating funds may be construed as a contingency.

17 2. Before any of the funds authorized to be expended by
18 this Act shall be allocated for contingencies, it shall be
19 determined by the executive council that a contingency exists
20 and that the contingency was neither existent while the gen-
21 eral assembly was in session nor reasonably foreseeable at
22 that time, and that the proposed allocation shall be for the
23 best interests of the state.

24 3. If a contingency arises or could reasonably be foreseen
25 during the time the general assembly is in session, expendi-
26 tures for the contingency must be authorized by the general
27 assembly.

28 Sec. 3. Acts of the Sixty-sixth General Assembly, 1975
29 Session, chapter twenty-nine (29), section two (2), amending
30 section seventeen point twenty-two (17.22) of the Code, is
31 amended to read as follows:

32 SEC. 2. Section seventeen point twenty-two (17.22), un-
33 numbered paragraph one (1), Code 1975, is amended to read
34 as follows:

35 17.22 PRICE. Said publications shall be sold at a price

1 to be established by dividing the ~~total~~ cost ~~only~~, of printing,
2 binding, distribution and paper stock by the total number
3 printed of each edition.

4 EXPLANATION

5 1. Centralized Printing Permanent Revolving Fund

6 The expenditures authorized by this Act are to carry on
7 existing programs. Additional administrative expenditures
8 for administering the printing and distribution of the
9 Administrative Procedures Act are unknown and may be treated
10 as a contingency as defined in section 2 of this Act.

11 2. General Service Revolving Fund

12 The expenditures authorized by this Act are to carry on
13 existing programs. No new positions have been authorized.

14 3. Vehicle Dispatcher Revolving Fund

15 Expenditures authorized from the vehicle dispatcher re-
16 volving fund are to be used to carry on existing programs.

17 4. Section 3 of this bill corrects an error made in an
18 appropriation bill in 1975. The amending clause did not
19 note that only unnumbered paragraph one of section 17.22 was
20 being amended by inserting the word "distribution" in the
21 section. Failure to make such correction might lead to the
22 conclusion that it was intended to strike the remaining portion
23 of section 17.22, when in fact that was not the original
24 intent.

AN ACT
TO APPROPRIATE AND AUTHORIZE EXPENDITURES FOR CENTRALIZED
PRINTING, CENTRALIZED PURCHASING AND THE VEHICLE DISPATCHER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the general services revolving funds established under chapter eighteen (18) of the Code for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1976 and ending June 30, 1977 the following amounts, or so much thereof as may be necessary:

1. a. From the centralized printing permanent revolving fund established by section eighteen point fifty-seven (18.57) of the Code for salaries, support, maintenance and miscellaneous purposes \$435,047

b. The remainder of the permanent revolving fund is appropriated for the expense incurred in supplying paper stock, offset printing, copy preparation, binding, distribution costs, original payment of printing and binding claims and contingencies arising during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1976 which are legally payable from this fund.

2. a. From the general service revolving fund established by section eighteen point nine (18.9) of the Code for salaries, support, maintenance and miscellaneous purposes \$299,261

b. The remainder of the revolving fund is appropriated for the payment of expenses incurred through purchases by various state departments and for contingencies arising during

the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1976 which are legally payable from this fund.

3. a. From the vehicle dispatcher revolving fund established by section eighteen point one hundred nineteen (18.119) of the Code for salaries, support, maintenance and miscellaneous purposes \$256,440

b. The remainder of the fund is appropriated for the purchase of gasoline, oil, tires, repairs and all other maintenance expenses incurred in the operation of state-owned motor vehicles and for contingencies arising during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1976 which are legally payable from this fund.

Sec. 2.

1. A contingency under this Act shall not include any purpose or project which was presented to the general assembly or any standing committee or subcommittee of a standing committee by any person by way of a bill, proposed bill, amendment to a bill, written document, or a proposal which is documented by the minutes, records, or reports of a committee or subcommittee, and which failed to be enacted into law. For the purpose of this Act a necessity of additional operating funds may be construed as a contingency.

2. Before any of the funds authorized to be expended by this Act shall be allocated for contingencies, it shall be determined by the executive council that a contingency exists and that the contingency was neither existent while the general assembly was in session nor reasonably foreseeable at that time, and that the proposed allocation shall be for the best interests of the state.

3. If a contingency arises or could reasonably be foreseen during the time the general assembly is in session, expenditures for the contingency must be authorized by the general assembly.

Sec. 3. Acts of the Sixty-sixth General Assembly, 1975 Session, chapter twenty-nine (29), section two (2), amending section seventeen point twenty-two (17.22) of the Code, is amended to read as follows:

SEC. 2. Section seventeen point twenty-two (17.22), un-numbered paragraph one (1), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

17.22 PRICE. Said publications shall be sold at a price to be established by dividing the ~~total~~ cost ~~only~~, of printing, binding, distribution and paper stock by the total number printed of each edition.
