11 NEW SECTION. RENT REVOLVING FUND CREATED--PURPOSE.

12 1. There is created a permanent rent revolving fund which
13 shall be used by the department to pay the lease or rental
14 costs of all buildings and office space necessary for the
15 proper functioning of any state agency at the seat of state
16 government as provided in section eighteen point twelve
17 (18.12), subsection nine (9) of the Code, except that this
18 fund shall not be used to pay the rental or lease costs of
19 a state agency which has not received funds budgeted for
20 rental or lease purposes.

21 2. The director shall pay the lease or rental fees to
22 the renter or lessor and submit a monthly statement to each
23 state agency for which building and office space is rented
24 or leased. The lease or rental cost shall be paid by the
25 state agency to the department of general services in the
26 same manner as other expenses of the state agency are paid
27 and the payment shall be credited to the rent revolving fund.

28 Sec. 3. Section eighteen point twelve (18.12), subsection
29 nine (9), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

 8 be credited to the rent revolving fund and used for the
 9 purposes provided in section one (1) of this Act.

3 The city finance committee was established by the home
4 rule statute and is located for administrative purposes within
5 the office of the state comptroller. The sum of \$19,750 is
6 appropriated for support and per diem of the nine-member
7 committee.

8 General Services

9 a. Office of the Director. Funds are appropriated to
10 continue existing programs and the authorized current table
11 or organization with the transfer of one Accounting Clerk
12 from Purchasing to the Director's payroll and includes salary
13 and support for deputy director.

14 b. General Administration. Funds are appropriated to
15 continue existing programs with the current authorized ta-
16 ble of organization. No new positions are recommended.

17 c. Buildings and Grounds. This appropriation of \$1,767,814
18 funds the current authorized table of organization and the
19 continuation of existing programs. This includes the six-
20 month salary for one automation center supervisor and a three-
21 month salary for three automation center operators. Also
22 included is salary and equipment for capital restoration
23 painter.

24 d. Printing Division. No new positions are funded in
25 this appropriation. The amount of funds from printing ser-
26 vices which will be deposited in the permanent revolving fund
27 established in section 18.57 of the Code should represent
28 the costs to the department. If excess funds accumulate
29 in the permanent revolving fund they are to be deposited in
30 the general fund at the direction of the governor.

31 e. Communications Division. This appropriation of \$108,014
32 is for the continuation of existing programs and funding of
33 the current authorized table of organization plus one
34 communications representative. Funds are included for state
35 match for the state communications study and the emergency

1 medical implementation program.

2 This bill also creates a permanent rent revolving fund
3 to be used by the department of general services to pay the
4 lease and rental costs of all buildings and office space
5 necessary for the proper functioning of any state agency at
6 the seat of state government. The state agency for which
7 a building or office space is rented, will reimburse the
8 department monthly from funds budgeted for lease or rental
9 purposes. This bill also removes the monetary amount which
10 must be present for the department of general services to
11 rent or lease buildings and office space with the approval
12 of the executive council when funds have not been appropriated
13 for that purpose. Normally this section will not be operative
14 because funds will be appropriated to every known agency which
15 rents or leases space.

16 This bill appropriates \$70,000 to initially fund the rent
17 revolving fund and pay the initial lease and rental fees for
18 those state agencies for which appropriations have already
19 been enacted for the 1976-1977 fiscal year and appropriates
20 an additional \$110,124 to twelve state agencies to pay rental
21 or lease costs of office space and buildings for the 1976-
22 1977 fiscal year.

If sections two (2) through five (5) of this Act do not become law, the appropriation provided for in paragraph b of subsection three (3) of section one (1) of this Act shall be increased by a total of one hundred three thousand seven hundred fifty-seven (103,757) dollars, to provide for a total appropriation of one million three hundred sixty-two thousand five hundred thirty-seven (1,362,537) dollars.

Sec. 7. All federal grants to and the federal receipts of the agencies appropriated funds under this Act are appro-

printed for the purposes set forth in such federal grants or receipts.
