1 An Act relating to licensing and regulating restaurants and
2 food establishments.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section one hundred seventy point one (170.1),
2 subsection six (6), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

3 6. "Food establishment" shall include any building, room,
4 basement, or other place, used as a bakery, confectionery,
5 cannery, packing house, slaughterhouse, dairy, creamery,
6 cheese factory, retail grocery, meat market, or other place
7 in which food is kept, produced, prepared, or distributed
8 for commercial purposes for off the premise consumption,
9 except those premises ~~holding-a-current-class-"A"-license~~
10 issued-pursuant-to-chapter-124 covered by a current class
11 "A" beer permit as provided in chapter one hundred twenty-
12 three (123) of the Code.

13 Sec. 2. Section one hundred seventy point nineteen
14 (170.19), subsection six (6), Code 1975, is amended to read
15 as follows:

16 6. While preparing food, employees whose hair does not
17 extend below their ears shall wear suitable head covering,
18 and employees whose hair extends below their ears shall wear
19 hairnets. Preparing food does not include the mixing or the
20 -serving for consumption on the premises of alcoholic beverages,
21 wine, or beer as defined in chapter one hundred twenty-three
22 (123) of the Code or to the incidental furnishing of snacks
23 or appetizers.

24 EXPLANATION

25 This bill reinserts the proper chapter reference in the
26 Code after chapter 124 was repealed and the provisions for
27 licensing wholesale beer warehouses placed in chapter 123.
28 This bill also relaxes the restriction placed on persons
29 tending bar who serve incidental food items by not requir-
30 ing them to wear hairnets.

3 1. Page 1, by inserting before line 1 the
4 following:

5 "Sec. __. Section one hundred twenty-three point
6 forty-nine (123.49), subsection two (2), paragraph
7 c, Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

8 c. Sell alcoholic beverages or beer to any per-
9 son, except to a person holding a class "B" or class
10 "C" beer permit, on credit, except with a bona fide
11 credit card. This provision shall not apply to sales
12 by a club to its members nor to sales by a hotel or
13 motel to bona fide registered guests.

14 Sec. __. Section one hundred twenty-three point
15 forty-five (123.45), unnumbered paragraph two (2),
16 Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

17 No person engaged in the business of manufacturing,
18 bottling, or wholesaling alcoholic beverages or beer,
19 nor any jobber or agent of such person, shall directly
20 or indirectly supply, furnish, give, or pay for any
21 furnishings, fixtures, or equipment used in the
22 storage, handling, serving, or dispensing of alcoholic
23 beverages, beer, or food within the place of business
24 of a licensee or permittee authorized under the
25 provisions of this chapter, to sell at retail; nor
26 shall he directly or indirectly extend any credit
27 for alcoholic beverages or beer, except to the holder
28 of a class "B" or class "C" beer permit and for a
29 period not to exceed forty-five days, or pay for any
30 such license or permit, nor directly or indirectly
31 be interested in the ownership, conduct, or operation
32 of the business of another licensee or permittee
33 authorized under the provisions of this chapter to
34 sell at retail. Any licensee or permittee who shall
35 permit or assent or be a party in any way to any such
36 violation or infringement of the provisions of this
37 chapter shall be deemed guilty of a violation of the
38 provisions of this chapter."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section one hundred seventy point one (170.1), subsection six (6), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

6. "Food establishment" shall include any building, room, basement, or other place, used as a bakery, confectionery, cannery, packing house, slaughterhouse, dairy, creamery, cheese factory, retail grocery, meat market, or other place in which food is kept, produced, prepared, or distributed for commercial purposes for off the premise consumption, except those premises ~~holding a current class "A" license issued pursuant to chapter 424~~ covered by a current class "A" beer permit as provided in chapter one hundred twenty-three (123) of the Code.

Sec. 2. Section one hundred seventy point nineteen (170.19), subsection six (6), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

6. While preparing food, employees ~~whose hair does not extend below their ears shall wear suitable head covering,~~

~~and employees whose hair extends below their ears shall wear hairnets.~~ shall use effective hair restraints to prevent the contamination of food.
