1 Section 1. Section four hundred fifty-five B point seventy-
2 five (455B.75), Code 1975, is amended by adding the following
3 new subsection:

4 NEW SUBSECTION. "Resource recovery system" means the re-
5 covery and separation of ferrous metals and nonferrous metals
6 and glass and aluminum and the preparation and burning of
7 solid waste as fuel for the production of electricity.

8 Sec. 2. Section four hundred fifty-five B point eighty
9 (455B.80), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

10 455B.80 PLANS FILED. Every city, county and every private
11 agency operating or planning to operate a sanitary disposal
12 project shall file with the executive director a plan detailing
13 the method by which the city, county or private agency will
14 comply with the provisions of this part 1 of division IV.
15 The executive director shall review each plan submitted and
16 may reject, suggest modification, or approve the proposed
17 plan. The executive director shall aid in the development
18 of plans for compliance with the provisions of said part.
19 The executive director shall make available to each city,
20 county and private agency appropriate forms for the submission
21 of plans and may hold hearings for the purpose of implementing
22 the provisions of said part. The executive director and the
23 energy policy council shall provide research and assistance,
24 when cities, counties or private agencies operating or planning
25 to operate sanitary disposal projects request aid in planning
26 and implementing resource recovery systems.

27 EXPLANATION

28 This bill requires the executive director of the department
29 of environmental quality and the Iowa energy policy council
30 to advise, upon request, any city, county or private agency
31 operating a sanitary disposal project on the establishment
32 of a resource recovery system by which metals and other waste
33 products may be recovered or used in the production of fuel.

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PLANNING AND IMPLEMENTATION OF RESOURCE RECOVERY SYSTEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section four hundred fifty-five B point seventy-five (455B.75), Code 1975, is amended by adding the following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. "Resource recovery system" means the recovery and separation of ferrous metals and nonferrous metals and glass and aluminum and the preparation and burning of solid waste as fuel for the production of electricity.

Sec. 2. Section four hundred fifty-five B point eighty (455B.80), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

455B.80 PLANS FILED. Every city, county and every private agency operating or planning to operate a sanitary disposal project shall file with the executive director a plan detailing the method by which the city, county or private agency will comply with the provisions of this part 1 of division IV. The executive director shall review each plan submitted and may reject, suggest modification, or approve the proposed plan. The executive director shall aid in the development of plans for compliance with the provisions of said part. The executive director shall make available to each city, county and private agency appropriate forms for the submission of plans and may hold hearings for the purpose of implementing the provisions of said part. The executive director and

governmental agencies with primary responsibility for the development and conservation of energy resources shall provide research and assistance, when cities and counties operating or planning to operate sanitary disposal projects request aid in planning and implementing resource recovery systems.
