1 Section 1. Chapter three hundred thirty-five (335), Code
2 1975, is amended by adding the following new section:

3 NEW SECTION. COMBINED INDEXING SYSTEM. The county recorder
4 may, in lieu of maintaining separate index books as required
5 by law, prepare and maintain a combined index record or system
6 which shall contain the same data and information as required
7 to be kept in the separate index books.

8 EXPLANATION

9 This bill authorizes a county recorder to prepare and
10 maintain a combined index record or system in lieu of the
11 separate index books as presently required by law. A combined
12 index record or system will facilitate the computization of
13 the record filing and retrieval system in the county recorder's
14 office.

AN ACT

AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY RECORDER TO COMBINE SEPARATE INDEX BOOKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Chapter three hundred thirty-five (335), Code 1975, is amended by adding the following new section:

NEW SECTION. COMBINED INDEXING SYSTEM. The county recorder may, in lieu of maintaining separate index books as required by law, prepare and maintain a combined index record or system which shall contain the same data and information as required to be kept in the separate index books.
