2 of the state and the funds indicated to the state conserva-
3 tion commission and its divisions for the fiscal year begin-
4 ning July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1976 the following

9 1. DIVISION OF LANDS AND WATERS

10 For deposit in the state conserva-

17 not more than eight hundred eighty-

21 Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the marine fuel tax
 22 fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975 and ending
 23 June 30, 1976 to the state conservation commission, divi-
 24 sion of lands and waters, such amounts of funds computed as
 25 provided in section three hundred twenty-four point eighty-
 26 four (324.84) of the Code, which funds shall be deposited
 27 in the state conservation fund for use in the state conserva-
 28 tion commission recreational boating program as provided in
 29 subsections one (1) through five (5) of section three hundred
 30 twenty-four point seventy-nine (324.79) of the Code.
 31 Notwithstanding section seven (7) of this Act, the unencum-
 32 bered or unobligated balances of funds specifically allo-
 33 cated for capital projects shall not revert to the fund from
 34 which appropriated until June 30, 1979.

35 Sec. 3. All receipts and refunds and reimbursements related

1 to activities funded by the administration fund are appro-
2 priated to the administration fund. All refunds and reim-
3 bursements relating to activities of the state fish and game
4 protection fund shall be credited to the state fish and game
5 protection fund.

6 Sec. 4. The transfer of funds from the state conservation
7 fund and the state fish and game protection fund to the ad-
8 ministration funds shall not exceed the amounts specified
9 in subsections one (1) and two (2) of section one (1) of this
10 Act.

11 Sec. 5. The funds appropriated by subsection one (1) of
12 section one (1) of this Act shall, except for administration
13 personnel, be used to pay salaries and for support for a table
14 of organization of not more than one hundred fifty-nine per-
15 manent full-time positions. The funds appropriated by subsec-
16 tion two (2) of section one (1) of this Act shall, except
17 for administration personnel, be used to pay salaries and
18 support for a table of organization of not more than two
19 hundred twenty-eight permanent full-time positions. The funds
20 appropriated by subsection three (3) of section one (1) of
21 this Act shall be used to pay the salary and support for not
22 more than one permanent full-time position. The funds
23 transferred for the administration fund pursuant to subsections
24 one (1) and two (2) of section one (1) of this Act shall be
25 used to pay salaries and for support for a combined
26 administration table of organization for both the division
27 of lands and waters and division of fish and game of not more
28 than one hundred five permanent full-time positions.

29 Sec. 6. All federal grants to and the federal receipts
30 of the state conservation commission are appropriated for
31 the purposes set forth in such federal grants or receipts.

32 Sec. 7. Notwithstanding the provisions of section eight
33 point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code, except as provided
34 in section two (2) of this Act, all unencumbered or unob-
35 ligated balances of appropriations made by this Act for the

1 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1976
2 shall revert to the fund from which appropriated on August
3 31, 1976. In all other respects the provisions of section
4 eight point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code shall apply to
5 this Act.

6 EXPLANATION

7 This bill appropriates \$3,071,037 from the general fund
8 and authorizes the expenditure of \$5,369,026 from the fish
9 and game protection fund for use by the state conservation
10 commission. The appropriation for operations of the lands
11 and waters division allows for five additional park attendants
12 to comply with the Fair Labor Standards Act. Two additional
13 foresters are authorized. They will be eligible for ten
14 percent federal funding. An additional water safety officer
15 is also funded.

16 The administration division is funded fifty percent by
17 general fund money transferred from the lands and waters
18 division and fifty percent by fish and game protection fund
19 money. An engineer with experience in sanitary and water
20 treatment systems is added. At present, no such person is
21 on the engineering staff. An engineering inspector is also
22 included.

23 An additional outdoor planner is authorized. This person
24 will work with local governments concerning projects eligible
25 for federal funding.

26 The total state general fund appropriation for the lands
27 and waters division and administration division is \$3,071,037,
28 a 10.5 percent increase over the 1974-1975 fiscal year.

29 For the fish and game division, five additional conserva-
30 tion workers are authorized to comply with the Fair Labor
31 Standards Act. A mechanical engineer is authorized to operate
32 and maintain mechanical and electrical equipment at the Rathbun
33 Fish Hatchery. The total increase in fish and game operation
34 expenditures and the fish and game transfer to administration
35 is nine percent.

1 This bill also provides appropriations for the state ad-
2 visory board for preserves, land surveys, and support of the
3 Missouri and Mississippi River Basin Commissions.

AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION AND DIVISIONS OF THE COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state and the funds indicated to the state conservation commission and its divisions for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1976 the following amounts, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used for the following purposes:

1975-1976
Fiscal Year

1. DIVISION OF LANDS AND WATERS

For deposit in the state conservation fund from the general fund of the state for salaries, support, maintenance, equipment and miscellaneous purposes of the division, maintenance of state parks, waters, and forests, prison labor programs and including not more than eight hundred eighty-three thousand two hundred fifteen (883,215) dollars which shall be available for the administration fund from the state conservation fund in compliance with the provisions of section one hundred seven point seventeen (107.17) of the Code \$3,071,037

2. DIVISION OF FISH AND GAME

From the state fish and game protection fund for salaries, support, maintenance, equipment and miscellaneous purposes, including not more than eight

hundred eighty-three thousand two hundred fifteen (883,215) dollars, which shall be available from the state fish and game protection fund for the administration fund in compliance with the provisions of section one hundred seven point seventeen (107.17) of the Code \$5,369,026

3. STATE ADVISORY BOARD FOR PRESERVES

From the general fund of the state for salaries, support, maintenance, equipment and miscellaneous purposes for carrying out the duties of the board \$ 22,540

4. LAND SURVEYS

From the general fund of the state for land surveys to establish and identify the boundaries to state-owned land along the Missouri and Mississippi Rivers \$ 40,000

5. MISSOURI AND MISSISSIPPI RIVER BASIN COMMISSIONS

From the general fund of the state for the state's contribution for support of the Missouri and Mississippi River Basin Commissions \$ 42,710

Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the marine fuel tax fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1976 to the state conservation commission, division of lands and waters, such amounts of funds computed as provided in section three hundred twenty-four point eighty-four (324.84) of the Code, which funds shall be deposited in the state conservation fund for use in the state conservation commission recreational boating program as provided in subsections one (1) through five (5) of section three hundred twenty-four point seventy-nine (324.79) of the Code. Notwithstanding section seven (7) of this Act, the unencum-

bered or unobligated balances of funds specifically allocated for capital projects shall not revert to the fund from which appropriated until June 30, 1979.

Sec. 3. All receipts and refunds and reimbursements related to activities funded by the administration fund are appropriated to the administration fund. All refunds and reimbursements relating to activities of the state fish and game protection fund shall be credited to the state fish and game protection fund.

Sec. 4. The transfer of funds from the state conservation fund and the state fish and game protection fund to the administration funds shall not exceed the amounts specified in subsections one (1) and two (2) of section one (1) of this Act.

Sec. 5. The funds appropriated by subsection one (1) of section one (1) of this Act shall, except for administration personnel, be used to pay salaries and for support for a table of organization of not more than one hundred fifty-nine permanent full-time positions. The funds appropriated by subsection two (2) of section one (1) of this Act shall, except for administration personnel, be used to pay salaries and support for a table of organization of not more than two hundred twenty-eight permanent full-time positions. The funds appropriated by subsection three (3) of section one (1) of this Act shall be used to pay the salary and support for not more than one permanent full-time position. The funds transferred for the administration fund pursuant to subsections one (1) and two (2) of section one (1) of this Act shall be used to pay salaries and for support for a combined administration table of organization for both the division of lands and waters and division of fish and game of not more than one hundred five permanent full-time positions.

Sec. 6. All federal grants to and the federal receipts of the state conservation commission are appropriated for the purposes set forth in such federal grants or receipts.

Sec. 7. Notwithstanding the provisions of section eight point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code, except as provided

in section two (2) of this Act, all unencumbered or unobligated balances of appropriations made by this Act for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1976 shall revert to the fund from which appropriated on August 31, 1976. In all other respects the provisions of section eight point thirty-three (8.33) of the Code shall apply to this Act.
