# A BILL FOR

1 An Act setting a salary range for certain state officials and  
2 designated employees of the state and providing for the  
3 governor to set salaries within such ranges.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. The governor may establish a salary for persons  
2 in the executive branch of government holding the position  
3 within a range provided in this Act by considering among other  
4 things, whether the person receiving the salary is temporary  
5 or permanent, or acting full or part time, the experience  
6 of the individual in the position, changes in the duties of  
7 the position, the incumbent's performance of assigned duties,  
8 the availability of qualified candidates for the position,  
9 and subordinates' salaries.

10 Sec. 2. The following annual salary ranges shall be in  
11 effect for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975 and ending  
12 June 30, 1976 for the positions specified, the governor shall  
13 specify the salary to be paid to the person indicated at a  
14 rate within the salary ranges indicated from funds appropriated  
15 by the general assembly for such purposes:

9 Sec. 3. Notwithstanding any laws of this state, the pro-  
 10 visions of this Act shall govern for the fiscal year 1975-  
 11 1976. The salary rates established by the governor under  
 12 this Act for the persons indicated shall be the total salary  
 13 paid for the persons for whom established during the fiscal  
 14 year 1975-1976. Any salary rates or adjustments to salaries  
 15 provided for by any other Act of the Sixty-sixth General  
 16 Assembly, 1975 Session, shall not apply to the positions  
 17 specified in this Act, however funds appropriated for salaries,  
 18 salary increases or adjustments to salaries by any other Act  
 19 of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly may be expended to fund  
 20 salaries provided for by this Act if funds appropriated to  
 21 the agencies represented by or employing the persons holding  
 22 the positions specified in this Act are insufficient to pay  
 23 salaries provided for in this Act.

24 Sec. 4. The governor shall report to the legislative  
 25 council the salary rates established pursuant to the provi-  
 26 sions of this Act.

27 EXPLANATION

28 This bill establishes salary ranges for appointive officials  
 29 in state government. Elected state officials are not included  
 30 in the bill.

31 The bill does not provide for a specific salary rate for  
 32 officials which has been past practice in many instances.  
 33 It allows the governor, to consider a number of factors in  
 34 establishing a salary rate within the ranges established in  
 35 the bill for a specific position. These factors include

1 whether a person is temporary, permanent, full or part-time,  
2 experience, changes in duties, past performance, the  
3 availability of qualified persons for the position, and the  
4 salaries being paid subordinates. It should be noted that  
5 the bill does not limit consideration to these factors, only  
6 specifies that these factors shall be considered among other  
7 factors.
