1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund
2 of the state for the following agencies the following amounts,
3 or so much thereof as is necessary, for the fiscal year
4 beginning July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1976, to be used
5 in the manner designated:

8 1. COMMISSION ON AGING

9 For salaries, support, main-

12 2. IOWA DRUG ABUSE AUTHORITY

13 a. For salaries, support, main-

15 poses and to supplement the ap-
16 propriation in paragraph c of this

19 ficient for an annual contract with
20 the state hygienic laboratory \$ 68,711
21 b. For grants to local agencies\$ 130,000
22 c. For an annual contract with state

24 3. DIVISION ON ALCOHOLISM OF THE
25 STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

26 a. For salaries, support, main-
27 tenance and miscellaneous pur-
28 poses \$ 72,413

29 b. For the purpose of entering
30 into written agreements with one or
31 more treatment units approved pur-
32 suant to section one hundred twenty-
33 five point thirteen (125.13) of the
34 Code only for treatment as defined
35 in section one hundred twenty-five

1 point twelve (125.12) of the Code
 2 on a regional basis according to the
 3 needs of each region defined in the
 4 division's state plan \$1,200,000

5 Included in the state's seventy-five
 6 percent share for cost of treatment
 7 shall be federal funds received for
 8 treatment purposes at the state level.

9 c. For the purpose of carrying out
 10 research into the cause of alcoholism
 11 and experimentation in and evaluation
 12 of methods of treating and rehabilitating
 13 alcoholics \$ 50,000

14 Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the general fund of
 15 the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1975, and
 16 ending June 30, 1976, to the commission on aging the sum of
 17 one hundred ninety-six thousand (196,000) dollars, or so much
 18 thereof as is necessary, for the area agencies on aging for
 19 maintenance of current program effort and administrative
 20 expenditures of the area agencies. Area agencies shall be
 21 eligible for both program and administrative funds, however
 22 an area agency may not be excluded from program maintenance
 23 of effort funds.

24 Sec. 3. There is appropriated to the governor's committee
 25 on employment of the handicapped for the fiscal year begin-
 26 ning July 1, 1975 and ending June 30, 1976 the following
 27 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used in
 28 the manner designated:

29 For the governor's committee on
 30 the handicapped to be used for edu-
 31 cational meetings jointly sponsored
 32 with the division of municipal affairs-
 33 building code commission of the office
 34 for planning and programming \$ 9,000

35 Sec. 4. Section one hundred twenty-five point twenty-eight

1 (125.28), Code 1975, is amended to read as follows:

2 125.28 COUNTIES TO SHARE COST. Except as provided in
3 section 125.26, counties shall pay for the remaining twenty-
4 five percent of the cost of the care, maintenance, and
5 treatment of an alcoholic from the county mental health and
6 institutions fund as provided in section 444.12. However,
7 ~~a-county-shall-not-expend-from-the-county-general-fund-or~~
8 ~~the-county-mental-health-and-institutions-fund-for-programs~~
9 ~~implemented-pursuant-to-sections-125.4-to-125.26-an-amount~~
10 ~~in-excess-of-the-total-amount-spent-from-these-funds-by-the~~
11 ~~county-on-alcoholism-programs-for-the-calendar-year-ending~~
12 ~~December-31,-1973-without-the-approval-of-the-board-of~~
13 ~~supervisors.~~ The commission shall establish guidelines for
14 use by the counties in estimating the amount of expense which
15 the county will incur each year. The facility shall certify
16 to the county of the alcoholic's legal settlement once each
17 month twenty-five percent of the unpaid cost of the care,
18 maintenance, and treatment of an alcoholic. Such county shall
19 pay the cost so certified to the facility from its county
20 mental health and institutions fund. However, the approval
21 of the board of supervisors shall be required before payment
22 is made by a county for costs incurred which exceed a total
23 of five hundred dollars for one year for treatment provided
24 to any one alcoholic or intoxicated person, except that such
25 approval is not required for the cost of treatment provided
26 to an alcoholic or intoxicated person who is committed pursuant
27 to sections 125.18 and 125.19. A facility may, upon approval
28 of the board of supervisors, submit to a county a billing
29 for the aggregate amount of all care, maintenance, and
30 treatment of alcoholics for each month. The board of
31 supervisors may demand an itemization of such billings at
32 any time or may audit the same.

33 Sec. 5. Chapter two hundred forty-nine B (249B), Code
34 1975, is amended by adding the following new section:

35 NEW SECTION. AREA AGENCIES. The commission on aging may

1 establish area agencies on aging for the planning and ser-
2 vice areas developed by the office for planning and programming
3 pursuant to the "Older Americans Comprehensive Services Amend-
4 ments of 1973", United States Public Law ninety-three dash
5 twenty-nine (93-29), section three hundred four (304). An
6 area agency may be merged with a contiguous planning and
7 service area but not without the approval of each policy
8 making body which is a party to the merger. Merged planning
9 and service areas forming one area agency shall be governed
10 by only one policy making body. Funds appropriated pursu-
11 ant to this Act shall be allocated to each planning and service
12 area for which an area agency has been designated by the end
13 of the funding period, and shall be available for both program
14 maintenance of effort and administrative expenditures.

15 Sec. 6.

16 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section eight point
17 thirty-nine (8.39) of the Code, state funds shall not be
18 transferred to, from, or between categories or items of
19 appropriations provided for in this Act.

20 2. All federal grants to and the federal receipts of the
21 agencies appropriated funds under this Act are appropriated
22 for the purposes set forth in such federal grants. Federal
23 funds are not subject to subsection one (1) of this section.

24 EXPLANATION

25 This bill appropriates funds for the Commission on Aging,
26 Iowa Drug Abuse Authority, and the Division on Alcoholism
27 of the State Department of Health. In the case of alcoholism
28 treatment, funds are appropriated for allocation to local
29 agencies for treatment only in the amount of \$1,200,000.
30 Such funds will be used in conjunction with federal and local
31 funds. Funds for salaries, support, maintenance, and
32 miscellaneous purposes and funds for research purposes are
33 also appropriated to the division on alcoholism.

34 There is also an appropriation for the area agencies on
35 aging. Educational meetings jointly sponsored by the

1 governor's committee on the handicapped and the division of
2 municipal affairs-code commission of the office for planning
3 and programming will receive a \$9,000 appropriation.

4 Section 125.28 is also amended to strike the required ap-
5 proval of the board of supervisors to expend certain funds
6 from the county mental health and institutions fund or county
7 general fund.
