7 information.

1 Section 1. Acts of the Sixty-sixth General Assembly, 1976
2 Session, chapter one thousand forty-three (1043), section
3 six (6), subsection two (2), unnumbered paragraph two (2),
4 is amended to read as follows:

28 EXPLANATION

29 This bill permits the Advisory Commission on Corrections
30 Relief, a temporary body established by the 1976 Session of
31 the General Assembly to make a comprehensive analysis of
32 Iowa's correctional system, additional time to complete that
33 portion of its report which deals with juvenile services and
34 facilities. Completion of the part of the report covering
35 adult services and facilities by the original March 1 deadline

1 will require all of the resources available to the Advisory
2 Commission, and the Legislative Council has therefore
3 recommended that the date for submission of the remainder
4 of the report be set back.

5 The bill also delays reversion of any unobligated and
6 unencumbered funds remaining in the Advisory Commission's
7 \$100,000 appropriation for staff services, so that the
8 temporary staff employed by the Commission may be retained
9 to assist in completion of the part of the report covering
10 juvenile services and facilities.

11 Section 2 of the bill officially authorizes the Advisory
12 Commission access to certain confidential information needed
13 to complete its study.

AN ACT

TO CHANGE THE TIME WHEN THAT PORTION OF THE REPORT OF THE ADVISORY COMMISSION ON CORRECTIONS RELIEF RELATING TO JUVENILE CORRECTIONS MUST BE SUBMITTED, TO CHANGE THE REVERSION DATE OF THE UNOBLIGATED AND UNENCUMBERED PORTION OF THE FUNDS APPROPRIATED TO THE COMMISSION, AND TO AUTHORIZE THE COMMISSION ACCESS TO CERTAIN CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Acts of the Sixty-sixth General Assembly, 1976 Session, chapter one thousand forty-three (1043), section six (6), subsection two (2), unnumbered paragraph two (2), is amended to read as follows:

To further carry out the intent expressed in subsection one (1) of this section, the advisory commission shall hire professional corrections consultants to evaluate the state's correctional needs. For that purpose there is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the advisory commission on corrections relief the sum of, or so much thereof as is necessary, one hundred thousand (100,000) dollars. Unobligated or unencumbered funds remaining on ~~March 4~~ June 30, 1977 from this appropriation shall revert to the general fund of the state forthwith. The evaluation established by this subsection shall include, but need not be limited to, the information sought by subsection three (3) of this section. This evaluation shall be completed and submitted to the ~~legislative council by March 4, 1977, and it shall be submitted along with general assembly concurrently with the respective portions of the final report required by subsection three (3) of this section.~~

Sec. 2. Acts of the Sixty-sixth General Assembly, 1976 Session, chapter one thousand forty-three (1043), subsection

two (2), is amended by adding the following new unnumbered paragraph:

NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. The advisory commission shall have access to any information in the possession of state and local government departments and agencies which is designated confidential by law or administrative rule of this state. The commission and its staff shall treat otherwise confidential information, to which it is given access by this paragraph, in the same manner as is required of the agency which maintains the information and of employees of that agency, and shall be subject to the same penalties for unauthorized disclosure of such confidential information as are applicable to the agency and its employees.
