In compliance with a written request there is hereby submitted
a Fiscal Note for H.F. 2189 pursuant to Joint Rule 16:

This amendment requires an employer to make a payment in an amount for each fiscal year beginning on July first of two percent of the estimated annual insurance premiums. This two percent premium tax would be collected by the industrial commissioner and deposited in the state general fund.

Estimated increase in revenue for FY 79 would be \$325,000
and estimated increase in revenue thereafter would be \$650,000 annually.

Estimated annual increase in expense to the Industrial Commissioner for staffing and support would be \$35,000.

6 Sec. 8. There is appropriated from the general fund of
7 the state to the salary adjustment fund established by Acts
8 of the Sixty-seventh General Assembly, 1977 Extraordinary
9 Session, chapter one (1), section two (2) for the fiscal year
10 beginning July 1, 1978 and ending June 30, 1979, the sum of
11 three million nine hundred fifty-six thousand two hundred
12 ten (3,956,210) dollars, or so much thereof as may be
13 necessary, to be used to supplement the funds already
14 appropriated by the general assembly to be distributed to
15 various state departments to fund increases in compensation
16 and related fringe benefits for designated state employees.

17 Sec. 9. There is appropriated from the general fund of
18 the state to a special fund, established in the office of
19 the state comptroller, set aside to pay Federal Insurance
20 Contribution Act taxes resulting from an increase in the tax
21 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1978 and ending June
22 30, 1979, the sum of eight hundred thousand (800,000) dollars,
23 or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be distributed
24 to various state departments to be used to fund any increase
25 in the state's share of the taxes.

26 Sec. 10. There is appropriated from the general fund of
27 the state for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1978 to
28 the Iowa beer and liquor control department, contingent upon
29 the maintenance of store hours in effect on February 1, 1978,
30 the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary,
31 to be used for the purposes designated:

11 of this Act to a special Federal Insurance Contribution Act
12 tax fund and the appropriation for the comptroller's data
13 processing division in paragraph b of subsection six (6) of
14 section seven (7) of this Act shall not be subject to transfer
15 to any other department, institution or agency nor shall any
16 moneys be subject to transfer to such funds from any other
17 department, institution or agency as provided in section eight
18 point thirty-nine (8.39) of the Code.

19 Sec. 12. Section eighty-seven point eleven (87.11), Code
20 1977, is amended to read as follows:

21 87.11 RELIEF FROM INSURANCE. When an employer coming under
22 this chapter furnishes satisfactory proofs to the insurance
23 commissioner of such employer's solvency and financial ability
24 to pay the compensation and benefits as by law provided and
25 to make such payments to the parties when entitled thereto,
26 or when such employer deposits with such commissioner security
27 satisfactory to ~~him~~ the insurance commissioner and the
28 industrial commissioner as guaranty for the payment of such
29 compensation, such employer shall be relieved of the provisions
30 of this chapter requiring insurance if the employer makes
31 a payment in an amount for each fiscal year beginning on July
32 first of two percent of the estimated annual insurance premiums
33 that would be paid if the employer was not relieved from such
34 insurance; but such employer shall, from time to time, furnish
35 such additional proof of solvency and financial ability to

1 pay as may be required by such insurance commissioner or
2 industrial commissioner.

3 The payments of the two percent of estimated annual
4 insurance premiums shall be remitted quarterly to the
5 industrial commissioner to be deposited in the state general
6 fund. The industrial commissioner shall estimate the annual
7 insurance premiums for each such employer which shall be equal
8 to the premiums which the employer would have paid if not
9 relieved from such insurance. The requirement of this section
10 mandating that two percent of the estimated annual insurance
11 premiums be paid shall not apply to the state or any of its
12 political subdivisions.

13 For the fiscal year beginning on July 1, 1978, the estimated
14 annual insurance premiums shall be computed on the basis of
15 the premiums which would have been paid for six months
16 insurance. The payments for that fiscal year shall be remitted
17 in two equal installments on January 1, 1979 and March 1,
18 1979.

19 Sec. 13. All federal grants to and the federal receipts
20 of the agencies appropriated funds under this Act are
21 appropriated for the purposes set forth in such federal grants
22 or receipts.

23 EXPLANATION

24 This bill appropriates \$2,500,000 to the moneys and credits
25 replacement fund.

26 It appropriates \$4,000,000 to county assistance fund the
27 same level of appropriation as for preceding three years.
28 Moneys in the fund are distributed to counties on a
29 proportional basis for use in projects and programs developed
30 and maintained for citizens of the county residing outside
31 the incorporated areas of any city.

32 The bill appropriates \$12,000,000 to municipal assistance
33 fund, the same amount as the preceding three years. Moneys
34 in this fund are distributed to cities pursuant to section
35 405.1 of the Code.

1 For the board of architectural examiners the appropriation
2 allows for the continuation of current programs.

3 For the board of landscape architectural examiners the
4 bill reduces the position of secretary from full-time to one-
5 half time, consistent with the departmental request.

6 This bill allows for an increase in the areas of continuing
7 education and examination for the board of watchmaking
8 examiners.

9 For the board of accountancy the bill provides for
10 continuation of current level of staffing, plus an increase
11 in disciplinary, continuing education, and examination
12 programs.

13 The bill transfers funds from the motor vehicle fuel tax
14 fund to the department of revenue for administrative pur-
15 poses.

16 This appropriation allows for continuation of current
17 programs for the city finance committee.

18 The appropriation provides funds for the comprehensive
19 conference plan of the Iowa 2000 planning committee which
20 will enable the committee to conclude its activity this
21 biennium.

22 This appropriation allows for the continuation of current
23 programs for the auditor of state.

24 This appropriation for the department of banking expands
25 the bank examination program. The last expansion was in 1974,
26 since which time the loans and assets of banks have grown
27 rapidly. At the current examination pace, without additional
28 examiners, 100 banks would go unexamined by the end of 1978.

29 This bill allows for continuation of current liquor stores,
30 the conversion of 24 counter-type stores to self-service,
31 and the addition of one accountant and makes the appropriation
32 contingent upon the maintenance of the store hours in effect
33 on February 1, 1978. \$150,000 is provided to pay overtime
34 salaries as required by collective bargaining agreement.

35 For the campaign finance disclosure commission, this

1 appropriation allows for continuation of current programs.

2 This bill allows for continuation of current programs for
3 the commerce commission, state comptroller, and board of
4 engineering examiners.

5 For the industrial commissioner this bill allows for
6 continuation of current programs, adds one position to assist
7 in assigning cases, provides funding for operation of data
8 processing system in the compliance program and requires the
9 commissioner to collect two percent of the amount which
10 employers save in premiums by being self-insured under the
11 workers' compensation law.

12 For the insurance department this bill expands the operation
13 of the examination program by adding three examiners and
14 provides two additional clerical staff.

15 This bill continues current programs for the Iowa department
16 of job service, occupational safety and health review
17 commission, public employment relations board, and Iowa real
18 estate commission.

19 For the department of revenue the bill continues the current
20 programs, provides \$300,000 for industrial appraisal, adds
21 two programming staff, and one-half time agent in taxpayer
22 service.

23 This bill adds three clerical staff to corporations,
24 elections, and uniform commercial code divisions for the
25 secretary of state's office, makes a new appropriation for
26 purchase of power files included in fiscal year 1978
27 appropriation, and continues current programs.

28 This appropriation continues current operations for the
29 treasurer of state.

30 This bill supplements the salary adjustment fund created
31 in the special session and provides funds to meet the increase
32 in FICA taxes.

33 Capital appropriations provide funds for conversion of
34 24 counter-type liquor stores to self-service, purchase of
35 cash registers, and purchase of fork-lift trucks.

There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the county government assistance fund, established in section three hundred thirty-four A point one (334A.1) of the Code, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1978 and ending June 30, 1979, the sum of four million (4,000,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used for state assistance to counties, with distribution in accordance with section three hundred thirty-four A point two (334A.2) of the Code.

Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the municipal assistance fund, established in section four hundred five point one (405.1) of the Code, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1978 and ending June 30, 1979, the sum of twelve million (12,000,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used for state assistance to municipalities, with distribution in accordance with section four hundred five point one (405.1) of the Code.

Sec. 4. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1978 and ending June 30, 1979 to the following boards the following amounts, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used for the following purposes:

There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the salary adjustment fund established by Acts of the Sixty-seventh General Assembly, 1977 Extraordinary Session, chapter one (1), section two (2) for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1978 and ending June 30, 1979, the sum of three million nine hundred fifty-six thousand two hundred ten (3,956,210) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used to supplement the funds already appropriated by the general assembly to be distributed to various state departments to fund increases in compensation and related fringe benefits for designated state employees.

Sec. 9. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to a special fund, established in the office of the state comptroller, set aside to pay Federal Insurance Contribution Act taxes resulting from an increase in the tax for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1978 and ending June 30, 1979, the sum of eight hundred thousand (800,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be distributed to various state departments to be used to fund any increase in the state's share of the taxes.

Sec. 10. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1978 to the Iowa beer and liquor control department the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

1. For the remodeling and conversion of twenty-four existing counter type stores to self-service stores..... \$ 237,048

2. For the purchase of cash registers..... \$ 193,000

3. For the purchase of lift trucks..... \$ 105,000

Unencumbered or unobligated moneys remaining on June thirtieth following completion of the projects for which the funds are appropriated by this section, shall revert to the general fund of the state on the following September thirtieth.

Sec. 11. The appropriations made by section eight (8) of this Act to the salary adjustment fund, section nine (9) of this Act to a special Federal Insurance Contribution Act tax fund and the appropriation for the industrial commissioner in subsection eight (8) of section seven (7) of this Act shall not be subject to transfer to any other department, institution or agency nor shall any moneys be subject to transfer to such funds from any other department, institution or agency as provided in section eight point thirty-nine (8.39) of the Code.

The appropriation for the comptroller's data processing division in paragraph b of subsection six (6) of section seven (7) of this Act shall not be subject to transfer to any other department, institution, agency or other division of the same agency as provided in section eight point thirty-nine (8.39) of the Code.

Sec. 12. All federal grants to and the federal receipts of the agencies appropriated funds under this Act are appropriated for the purposes set forth in such federal grants or receipts.

Sec. 13. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, shall take effect and be in force from and after its

publication in The Red Oak Express, a newspaper published in Red Oak, Iowa, and in The Sioux County Index-Reporter, a newspaper published in Hull, Iowa.
