EXPLANATION

18 ACADEMY OF SCIENCE. This appropriation of \$4,500 is for
19 the publication program in the Iowa Academy of Science.

20 IOWA ARTS COUNCIL. This appropriation of \$211,000 al-
21 lows for the continuation of current programs with \$120,000
22 included for state match of special projects.

23 CAPITOL PLANNING COMMISSION. This appropriation is to
24 cover per diem and expenses of commission members.

25 IOWA STATE HISTORICAL DEPARTMENT.

26 a. HISTORICAL SOCIETY. This appropriation is to continue
27 programs at the existing level. It includes \$25,000 in the
28 library program for microfilming and \$25,122 to match federal
29 funds in the newspaper bibliography program.

30 b. HISTORICAL PRESERVATION. This appropriation is to
31 continue existing programs. It includes \$13,223 for
32 archaeological surveys, \$13,475 for historical surveys, and
33 \$12,040 for architectural surveys.

34 c. HISTORICAL MUSEUM AND ARCHIVES. This appropriation
35 is to continue existing programs and includes 1 microfilm

1 operator position.

2 d. STATE HISTORICAL BOARD. This appropriation of \$18,000

5 a. LAW LIBRARY. This appropriation is to continue ex-
6 isting programs and adds one part-time law clerk.

7 b. MEDICAL LIBRARY. This appropriation is to continue

10 isting programs.

11 d. REGIONAL LIBRARY. This appropriation is the state
12 aid for the regional library system.

13 BUREAU OF LABOR. This appropriation is to maintain current
14 programs.

16 is to continue existing programs.

17 IOWA MERIT DEPARTMENT. This appropriation is to continue
18 existing programs and includes \$51,000 for implementing a
19 data processing system.

20 GENERAL SERVICES. This appropriation is to continue
21 existing programs and includes \$908,576 for payment of
22 utilities costs; \$197,271 for the records management division
23 operations; \$78,800 to purchase equipment for the state
24 microfilming program; and \$83,677 for the maintenance of
25 Terrace Hill which will be open for not less than 20 hours
26 per week to the public beginning July 1, 1977.

27 REVOLVING FUNDS.

28 a. Centralized printing has an authorized expenditure
29 level of \$473,166.

30 b. Centralized purchasing has an authorized expenditure
31 level of \$318,810.

a. From the centralized printing permanent revolving fund established by section eighteen point fifty-seven (18.57) of the Code for salaries, support, maintenance and miscellaneous purposes \$ 473,166

b. The remainder of the centralized printing permanent revolving fund is appropriated for

the expense incurred in supplying paper stock, offset printing, copy preparation, binding, distribution costs, original payment of printing and binding claims and contingencies arising during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1977 which are legally payable from this fund.

c. From the general service revolving fund established by section eighteen point nine (18.9) of the Code for salaries, support, maintenance and miscellaneous purposes \$ 318,810

d. The remainder of the general service revolving fund is appropriated for the payment of expenses incurred through purchases by various state departments and for contingencies arising during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1977 which are legally payable from this fund.

e. From the vehicle dispatcher revolving fund established by section eighteen point one hundred nineteen (18.119) of the Code for salaries, support, maintenance and miscellaneous purposes \$ 281,751

f. The remainder of the vehicle dispatcher revolving fund is appropriated for the purchase of gasoline, oil, tires, repairs

and all other maintenance expenses incurred in the operation of state-owned motor vehicles and for contingencies arising during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1977 which are legally payable from this fund.

g. A contingency under this subsection shall not include any purpose or project which was presented to the general assembly or any standing committee or subcommittee of a standing committee by any person by way of a bill, proposed bill, amendment to a bill, written document, or a proposal which is documented by the minutes, records, or reports of a committee or subcommittee, and which failed to be enacted into law. For the purpose of this section a necessity of additional operating funds may be construed as a contingency.
