A BILL FOR

1 An Act authorizing the deduction from a state officer's or
2 employee's wages or salary an amount for contribution to
3 a qualifying charitable organization of the officer's or
4 employee's choice.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. NEW SECTION. DEFINITIONS. As used in this
2 Act, unless the context otherwise requires:

3 1. "Charitable organization" means an organization that
4 is eligible to receive contributions which may be deducted
5 on the contributor's Iowa individual tax return and that has
6 been designated, at the request of twenty-five or more eligi-
7 ble state officers and employees, by a responsible official
8 of the payroll system under which the officers or employees
9 are compensated, to receive contributions pursuant to section
10 two (2) of this Act.

11 2. "Enrollment period" means the time during which the
12 charitable organization conducts an annual consolidated ef-
13 fort to secure funds.

14 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. PAYROLL DEDUCTION. The responsible
15 official in charge of the payroll system may deduct from the
16 salary or wages of a state officer or employee an amount
17 specified by the officer or employee for payment to a
18 charitable organization if:

19 1. The request for the payroll deduction is made in writing
20 during the enrollment period for the charitable organization.

21 2. The deduction shall not continue in effect for a period
22 of time exceeding one year unless a new written request is
23 filed according to the requirements of this section.

24 3. The pay period during which the deduction is made,
25 the frequency, and the amount of the deduction are compatible
26 with the payroll system.

27 4. The officer or employee has requested a deduction for
28 only one charitable organization.

29 Moneys deducted pursuant to this section shall be paid
30 over promptly to the appropriate charitable organization.
31 The deduction may be made notwithstanding that the compensation
32 actually paid to the officer or employee is reduced to an
33 amount below the minimum prescribed by law. Payment to an
34 officer or employee of compensation less the deduction shall
35 constitute a full and complete discharge of claims and demands

1 for services rendered by the employee during the period covered
2 by the payment. The request for the deduction may be withdrawn
3 at any time by filing a written notification of withdrawal
4 with the responsible official in charge of the payroll system.

5 Sec. 3. Sections seventy-nine point fourteen (79.14) and
6 seventy-nine point fifteen (79.15), Code 1977, are repealed.

7 Sec. 4. This Act is effective January 1, 1978.

8 EXPLANATION

9 This bill allows state officers and employees to contribute
10 to any charitable organization through a payroll deduction
11 system. Presently only contributions to the United Fund are
12 allowed as payroll deductions. An organization may be deemed
13 eligible to receive funds by the official in charge of the
14 payroll system if contributions to the organization are de-
15 ductible on the contributor's Iowa individual income tax re-
16 turn and if at least twenty-five state officers and employees
17 request to contribute to the organization.

AN ACT

AUTHORIZING THE DEDUCTION FROM A STATE OFFICER'S OR EMPLOYEE'S WAGES OR SALARY AN AMOUNT FOR CONTRIBUTION TO A QUALIFYING CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION OF THE OFFICER'S OR EMPLOYEE'S CHOICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. NEW SECTION. DEFINITIONS. As used in this Act, unless the context otherwise requires:

1. "Charitable organization" means an organization that is eligible to receive contributions which may be deducted on the contributor's Iowa individual tax return and that has been designated, at the request of one hundred or more eligible state officers and employees, or the number of employees required by subsection three (3) of this section, by a responsible official of the payroll system under which the officers or employees are compensated, to receive contributions pursuant to section two (2) of this Act.

2. "Enrollment period" means the time during which the charitable organization conducts an annual consolidated effort to secure funds.

3. "Number of persons required" means:

a. In the case of employees at the Iowa state university of science and technology and the state university of Iowa, one hundred or more participants.

b. In the case of employees at the university of northern Iowa, fifty or more participants.

c. In the case of employees at the Iowa school for the deaf and the Iowa braille and sight-saving school, twenty-five or more participants.

Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. PAYROLL DEDUCTION. The responsible official in charge of the payroll system may deduct from the salary or wages of a state officer or employee an amount specified by the officer or employee for payment to a

charitable organization if:

1. The request for the payroll deduction is made in writing during the enrollment period for the charitable organization.

2. The deduction shall not continue in effect for a period of time exceeding one year unless a new written request is filed according to the requirements of this section.

3. The pay period during which the deduction is made, the frequency, and the amount of the deduction are compatible with the payroll system.

Moneys deducted pursuant to this section shall be paid over promptly to the appropriate charitable organization. The deduction may be made notwithstanding that the compensation actually paid to the officer or employee is reduced to an amount below the minimum prescribed by law. Payment to an officer or employee of compensation less the deduction shall constitute a full and complete discharge of claims and demands for services rendered by the employee during the period covered by the payment. The request for the deduction may be withdrawn at any time by filing a written notification of withdrawal with the responsible official in charge of the payroll system.

Sec. 3. Sections seventy-nine point fourteen (79.14) and seventy-nine point fifteen (79.15), Code 1977, are repealed.

Sec. 4. This Act is effective January 1, 1978.
