### A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the membership and duties of the state  
2 advisory council for vocational education.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:  
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S.F. 296

1 Section 1. Section two hundred fifty-eight point seven  
2 (258.7), unnumbered paragraph one (1), Code 1977, is amended  
3 to read as follows:

4 There is hereby established a state advisory council for  
5 vocational education, consisting of thirteen not more than  
6 twenty-three members, which shall be appointed by the governor.  
7 The term of each member shall be for three years, except that  
8 for the initial appointments the governor shall specify the  
9 terms of each member so that as nearly as possible, the terms  
10 of an equal number of members shall expire on the first day  
11 of ~~July~~ October of each year.

12 Sec. 2. Section two hundred fifty-eight point seven  
13 (258.7), Code 1977, is amended by striking unnumbered paragraph  
14 three (3) and subsections one (1) through thirteen (13), and  
15 inserting in lieu thereof the following:

16 The advisory council shall have as a majority of its mem-  
17 bers persons who are not educators or administrators in the  
18 field of education and shall include as members persons who:

19 1. Represent, and are familiar with, the vocational needs  
20 and problems of management in the state.

21 2. Represent, and are familiar with, the vocational needs  
22 and problems of labor in the state.

23 3. Represent, and are familiar with, the vocational needs  
24 and problems of agriculture in the state.

25 4. Represent the state industrial and economic development  
26 agency.

27 5. Represent community and junior colleges.

28 6. Represent other institutions of higher education, area

30 agencies or institutions which provide programs of vocational  
31 or technical education and training.

32 7. Have special knowledge, experience, or qualifications  
33 with respect to vocational education but are not involved

- 10 13. Are currently serving as a superintendent or other

- 13 15. Represent the state manpower services council estab-  
14 lished pursuant to section one hundred seven (107) of the  
15 United States Comprehensive Employment and Training Act of  
16 1973.
- 17 16. Represent a school system with large concentrations  
18 of persons who have special academic, social, economic, and  
19 cultural needs and of persons who have limited English-speaking  
20 ability.
- 21 17. Are women with backgrounds and experiences in em-  
22 ployment and training programs, and who are knowledgeable  
23 with respect to the special experiences and problems of sex  
24 discrimination in job training and employment and of sex

27 such backgrounds and experiences, special knowledge of the

- 33 19. Represent the general public, including a person or

35 disadvantaged.

1 20. Are enrolled in a vocational education program at  
2 the time of his or her appointment who are not qualified  
3 for membership under any of the preceding clauses of this  
4 paragraph.

5 Members of the advisory council may not represent more  
6 than one of the above-specified categories. In appointing  
7 the advisory council the governor shall insure that there  
8 is appropriate representation of both sexes, racial and ethnic  
9 minorities, and the various geographic regions of the state.

10 Sec. 3. Members of the advisory council on June 30, 1977  
11 who meet the criteria for membership stated in this Act shall  
12 continue as members of the advisory council until the expira-  
13 tion of the terms for which they were appointed. The terms  
14 of members of the advisory council on June 30, 1977 who do  
15 not meet the criteria for membership stated in this Act shall  
16 continue to serve on the council until September 30, 1977.  
17 Appointments of the governor for terms beginning October 1,  
18 1977 shall be made so that as nearly as possible, the terms  
19 of an equal number of members of the advisory council shall  
20 expire on October first of each year.

21 EXPLANATION

22 This bill revises the membership of the State Advisory  
23 Council for Vocational Education to reflect changes in the  
24 federal law which mandates the establishment of the Advisory  
25 Council.

Prepared in regard to Senate File 296, An Act relating to the membership and duties of the state advisory council for vocational education.

LSB 764S revises the membership of the State Advisory Council for Vocational Education to reflect changes in the federal law which mandates the establishment of the Advisory Council.

While this proposal will be funded entirely by the federal government and will therefore have no fiscal impact on the state, the costs are estimated as follows:

vocational schools, technical institutes, and post secondary agencies or institutions which provide programs of vocational or technical education and training.

7. Have special knowledge, experience, or qualifications with respect to vocational education but are not involved in the administration of state or local vocational education programs.

8. Represent, and are familiar with, public programs of vocational education in comprehensive secondary schools.

9. Represent, and are familiar with, nonprofit private schools.

10. Represent, and are familiar with, vocational guidance and counseling services.

11. Represent state correctional institutions.

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13. Are currently serving as a superintendent or other administrator of a local educational agency.

14. Are currently serving on a local school board.

15. Represent the state manpower services council established pursuant to section one hundred seven (107) of the United States Comprehensive Employment and Training Act of 1973.

16. Represent a school system with large concentrations of persons who have special academic, social, economic, and cultural needs and of persons who have limited English-speaking ability.

17. Are women with backgrounds and experiences in employment and training programs, and who are knowledgeable with respect to the special experiences and problems of sex discrimination in job training and employment and of sex stereotyping in vocational education, including women who are members of minority groups and who have, in addition to such backgrounds and experiences, special knowledge of the problems of discrimination in job training and employment against women who are members of such groups.

18. Have special knowledge, experience, or qualifica-

tions with respect to the special educational needs of physically or mentally handicapped persons.

19. Represent the general public, including a person or persons representing and knowledgeable about the poor and disadvantaged.

20. Are enrolled in a vocational education program at the time of his or her appointment who are not qualified for membership under any of the preceding clauses of this paragraph.

Members of the advisory council may not represent more than one of the above-specified categories. In appointing the advisory council the governor shall insure that there is as nearly as possible equitable representation of both sexes, appropriate representation of racial and ethnic minorities, and appropriate representation from the various geographic regions of the state.

Sec. 1. Section two hundred fifty-eight point nine (258.9), Code 1977, is amended to read as follows:

258.9 LOCAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE. The board of directors of any school district having a population of more than five thousand persons, maintaining a school, department, or class receiving the benefit of federal moneys under the provisions of this chapter shall, as a condition of approval by such state board as herein provided, appoint a local advisory committee for vocational education, consisting of persons of experience in agriculture, industry, home economics, and business, to give advice and assistance to such board of directors in the establishment and maintenance of such schools, departments, and classes. The state board may require the board of directors of any school district that maintains an approved school, department, or class, to appoint such an advisory committee. The state board shall adopt rules requiring that the memberships of local advisory committees fairly represent each sex and minorities residing in the school district. Members of such advisory committee shall serve without compensation.
