1 Section 1. Acts of the Sixty-eighth General Assembly,  
2 1979 Session, chapter fourteen (14), section one (1), sub-  
3 sections two (2), four (4), nine (9), and ten (10), are amended

6 Sec. 11. Two million seventy-five thousand (2,075,000)  
7 dollars of the funds appropriated for the Brushy Creek project  
8 by Acts of the Sixty-fifth General Assembly, 1974 Session,  
9 chapter one thousand twenty-six (1026), section one (1),  
10 subsection four (4), and Acts of the Sixty-seventh General  
11 Assembly, 1978 Session, chapter one thousand nine (1009),  
12 section one (1), subsection two (2), paragraph a, which are  
13 unencumbered shall revert to the general fund of the state  
14 on the effective date of this Act.

15 Sec. 12. There is appropriated from the general fund of  
16 the state to the department of social services for the fiscal  
17 year beginning July 1, 1980, except as otherwise provided,  
18 the sum of two million (2,000,000) dollars, or so much thereof  
19 as is necessary, to be used for capital improvement projects  
20 deemed necessary by the department for institutions under  
21 its jurisdiction or for maintenance of those institutions.

23 be carried out under this section the renovation and  
24 installation of security features in hope hall at the Clarinda  
25 mental health institute to serve as an adult corrections  
26 security facility primarily for chemically dependent, mentally  
27 retarded and socially inadequate offenders, the continuation  
28 of planned repairs and improvements at the Clarinda mental  
29 health institute, and needed safety and health-related  
30 improvements at other institutions under its jurisdiction.  
31 In addition, funds appropriated for projects referenced in  
32 Acts of the Sixty-seventh General Assembly, 1977 Session,  
33 chapter thirty-seven (37), section twenty-five (25), and Acts  
34 of the Sixty-seventh General Assembly, 1978 Session, chapter  
35 one thousand eighteen (1018), section seven (7), and Acts

1 of the Sixty-eighth General Assembly, 1979 Session, chapter  
2 fourteen (14), section thirteen (13) which have not previously  
3 been obligated may be used for the same purposes as the funds  
4 appropriated by this section.

5 Sec. 13. There is appropriated for the fiscal year begin-  
6 ning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982, the following  
7 amounts or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for  
8 the purposes of funding programs designated in the Acts of  
9 the Sixty-eighth General Assembly, 1979 Session, chapter  
10 fourteen (14), as amended by this Act, as follows:

22 Sec. 14. There is appropriated from the general fund of  
23 the state to the department of general services, office of  
24 the director, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and  
25 ending June 30, 1982, the sum of one hundred two thousand  
26 six hundred fifty (102,650) dollars, or so much thereof as  
27 is necessary, to be used for the purchase of land north of  
28 Grand avenue, south of I-235 freeway, east of Pennsylvania  
29 avenue and west of east fourteenth street.

30 Sec. 15. There is appropriated for the fiscal year  
31 beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982, the following  
32 amounts or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for  
33 the purposes of funding programs designated in Acts of the  
34 Sixty-seventh General Assembly, 1978 Session, as amended by  
35 this Act, as follows:

1 1. Chapter one thousand eleven (1011), section  
 2 one (1), subsection two (2), paragraph b..... \$ 155,350

3 2. Chapter one thousand nineteen (1019), sec-  
 4 tion four (4), subsection three (3)..... \$ 226,000

5 Sec. 16. There is appropriated to the state conservation  
 6 commission for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and  
 7 ending June 30, 1982, the sum of two million seventy-five  
 8 thousand (2,075,000) dollars, or so much thereof as is  
 9 necessary, for capital projects to be determined at the  
 10 discretion of the state conservation commission.

11 It is the intent of the general assembly that in allowing  
 12 the funds originally appropriated for the Brushy Creek project  
 13 now to be used for other capital projects, the general assembly  
 14 is not canceling or abandoning the project. The general  
 15 assembly intends to reappropriate funds for the completion  
 16 of a project in the Brushy Creek area when the environmental  
 17 impact statement for the existing project is completed and  
 18 a final proposal is approved.

19 It is the intent of the general assembly that the state  
 20 conservation commission give priority to the construction  
 21 of impoundments on watersheds where permanent soil conservation  
 22 practices have already been constructed above the proposed  
 23 impoundment when approving capital projects which are to be  
 24 funded with the funds made available by this section.

25 Sec. 17. Funds appropriated for the fiscal year beginning  
 26 July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982 by this Act are not  
 27 obligated funds for the purpose of determining the unobligated  
 28 state general fund balance under Acts of the Sixty-eighth  
 29 General Assembly, 1979 Session, chapter ninety-three (93),  
 30 section one (1), paragraph e with respect to the computation  
 31 of the annual inflation factor for the 1980 and 1981 calendar  
 32 years.

33 Sec. 18. Unobligated or unencumbered funds appropriated  
 34 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June  
 35 30, 1982 by this Act remaining on June 30, 1985, shall revert

1 to the general fund on September 30, 1985, however if after  
2 completion of the project for which the funds were appropriated  
3 and before the June 30, 1985 date, there remain unobligated  
4 or unencumbered funds, such funds shall revert on September  
5 thirtieth following the end of the fiscal year in which the  
6 project is completed.

7 Sec. 19. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance,  
8 takes effect from and after its publication in the Osceola  
9 Tribune, a newspaper published in Osceola, Iowa, and in The  
10 Cedar Rapids Gazette, a newspaper published in Cedar Rapids,  
11 Iowa.

12 EXPLANATION

13 Sections 1 through 8 amend Acts of the Sixty-eighth General  
14 Assembly, 1979 Session, chapter 14.

15 They reduce appropriations to the state board of regents  
16 made for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1979, to \$3,900,000  
17 for construction of a library; to \$260,000 for the state  
18 university of Iowa for planning space needs for law,  
19 communications, and performing arts; to \$8,049,000 for  
20 allocation to the universities for utility projects; and to  
21 \$900,000 for allocation to the universities for planning and  
22 implementation of energy conservation.

23 An appropriation is added to the state board of regents  
24 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1980, of \$500,000 for  
25 the university of northern Iowa to correct fire safety  
26 deficiencies.

27 An appropriation to the energy policy council is reduced  
28 to \$1,000,000 for determination of energy use and for energy  
29 conservation projects at state buildings.

30 Reductions are provided for the office of state comptroller  
31 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1979, to \$2,000 for  
32 site preparation and purchase of an uninterruptible power  
33 source for electronic data processing equipment and an  
34 appropriation to the Iowa beer and liquor control department  
35 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1980, to \$300,000 for

1 a warehouse.

2 A reduction of an appropriation to the department of general  
3 services for the fiscal biennium, to \$2,000,000 for renovation  
4 and remodeling of the Robert Lucas building is made.

5 An appropriation for the fiscal biennium to the department  
6 of general services, division of buildings and grounds for  
7 capital improvements is made.

8 An appropriation to the office of the governor for the  
9 fiscal biennium is reduced to \$200,000 for matching funds  
10 for restoring Terrace Hill.

11 A reduction of an appropriation to the department of general  
12 services for the fiscal biennium, to \$30,000 for remodeling  
13 the capitol cafeteria is also made.

14 Other provisions reduce an appropriation made by the Sixty-  
15 seventh General Assembly, 1978 Session, chapter 1011 to the  
16 office of the governor to \$94,650 for acquisition of land;  
17 reduce an appropriation made by the Sixty-seventh General  
18 Assembly, 1978 Session, chapter 1019 to the department of  
19 public defense to \$5,000 for a national guard armory in  
20 Dubuque; and require that \$2,075,000 of the appropriations  
21 for the bushy creek project made in 1974 and 1978 revert to  
22 the general fund of the state.

23 A section appropriates \$2,000,000 to the department of  
24 social services for capital improvement projects at the  
25 department's institutions, including conversion of hope hall  
26 at the Clarinda mental health institute for use as an adult  
27 corrections security facility. The department is also  
28 authorized to use any remaining unobligated funds from capital  
29 appropriations originally made in 1977, 1978 and 1979 for  
30 the same purposes as the \$2,000,000 appropriation.

31 Other sections restore in the fiscal year beginning July  
32 1, 1981 the majority of the funds reduced in the earlier  
33 sections.

34 A provision is made which provides that the funds  
35 appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 are

1 not obligations for the purpose of indexing the state income  
2 tax in the calendar years 1980 and 1981.

I hereby transmit House File 2595, an act relating to capital appropriations by reducing appropriations previously made by the general assembly, making additional appropriations for fiscal year 1980-1981, and restoring funds for the fiscal year 1981-1982 for capital improvements reduced by this act and to authorize the fair board to accept gifts and to authorize a study committee to be appointed by the legislative council.

House File 2595 is approved May 22, 1980, with the following exception which I hereby disapprove.

I am unable to approve the item designated in the act as Section 5 which reads as follows:

Sec. 5. Acts of the Sixty-eighth General Assembly, 1979 Session, chapter fourteen (14), section fifteen (15), subsection one (1), paragraph a, subparagraph one (1), is amended to read as follows:

(1) For the renovation, and remodeling of the Robert Lucas building.....

The department of general services may expend not exceeding two hundred sixty-seven thousand two hundred (267,200) dollars for architectural fees for the renovation and remodeling authorized by this subparagraph. The appropriation made in this subparagraph is conditioned upon the employees located in the east side of the corridor in the office of the auditor of state being moved to the Robert Lucas building and that space being assigned to the legislative fiscal bureau.

This provision of the capitals bill reduces the appropriation for renovation of the Lucas Office Building on the Capitol Complex from \$3 to \$2 million. Because the architects for the renovation project have already completed their plans based on the larger appropriation, a provision was added to the Section which permitted the architects to be paid in full for their services rather than a reduced amount based on the second and lower appropriation amount. On the last day of the legislative session, legislators added a further condition to this appropriation mandating that a portion of the State Auditor's Office be moved from the State Capitol to the Lucas Building and the vacated space be assigned to the Legislative Fiscal Bureau.

The State Auditor has raised legitimate concerns on the impact this unanticipated, forced move would have on the operations of his office. The portion of the office that would be required to move is currently occupied by the administrative division of the Auditor's Office which has the responsibility for processing and assembling the audit reports. During the assembly process, it is important that the two Deputy Auditors of State have easy access to answer any questions about the audits being prepared. In addition, the administrative division serves as the coordination unit for the Auditor's Office. The Auditor has a sincere belief that physical separation of this division from the rest of his office would impair the effective administration and management of the Auditor's Office.

What makes the legislative decision to require the move baffling is the fact that there was a mutual agreement between the legislative, judicial and executive branches of government in 1978 on the allocation of space in the Capitol. In January, 1978, the Chairman of the Legislative Council, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, the Treasurer of the State of Iowa, and the Director of the Department of General Services concurred in a specific plan to provide substantially more space on the first floor of the Capitol to the legislature and the Court of Appeals. To resolve differences, the State Treasurer generously ceded his personal office to the legislature, a move which successfully brought an agreement among all parties. That agreement further recognized that adequate space within the Capitol remained a problem. It urged the participants to work together for any further adjustments of space allocation that might become necessary. Apparently, the legislators, who engineered this relocation of the Auditor's Office in favor of the Legislative Fiscal



Bureau, have forgotten about this joint agreement. A surprising vote for this provision came from the former Chairman of the Legislative Council who signed the earlier agreement. One must ask himself whether it is productive to enter into negotiations with the legislature, if a signed agreement can be so easily cast aside when it suits a legislative desire. Fortunately the item veto is available to remove this section from the bill.

Vetoing Section 5 has the effect of restoring the full \$3 million appropriation for the Lucas Building renovation. In light of our continued decline of state revenues which prompted the other reductions to capital projects contained in the bill, I have indicated to the Director of the Department of General Services that he should proceed with the renovation project as if only \$2 million were available. This will accomplish basically the same purpose as the reduction called for in the bill but the Auditor will not be forced out of his offices.

For the above reasons, I hereby disapprove this item in accordance with Amendment 4 of the Amendments of 1968 to the Constitution of the State of Iowa. All other items of House File 2595 are hereby approved as of this date.

There is appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982, the following amounts or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes of funding programs designated in Acts of the Sixty-seventh General Assembly, 1978 Session, as amended by this Act, as follows:

Sec. 17. There is appropriated to the state conservation commission for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982, the sum of two million seventy-five thousand (2,075,000) dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary, for capital projects to be determined at the discretion of the state conservation commission.

It is the intent of the general assembly that in allowing the funds originally appropriated for the Brushy Creek project now to be used for other capital projects, the general assembly is not canceling or abandoning the project. The general assembly intends to reappropriate funds for the completion of a project in the Brushy Creek area when the environmental impact statement for the existing project is completed and a final proposal is approved.

It is the intent of the general assembly that the state conservation commission give priority to the construction of impoundments on watersheds where permanent soil conservation practices have already been constructed above the proposed impoundment when approving capital projects which are to be funded with the funds made available by this section.

Sec. 18. The Iowa state fair board may accept gifts or grants from sources other than the state or its agencies for the purpose of implementing the redevelopment proposals prepared for the Iowa state fair master plan committee, and shall deposit the gifts or grants in the fair redevelopment fund which is created within the state treasury. The state comptroller shall issue warrants for claims against the fair redevelopment fund subject to the conditions contained in this section.

Sec. 19. Funds appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982 by this Act are not obligated funds for the purpose of determining the unobligated state general fund balance under Acts of the Sixty-eighth General Assembly, 1979 Session, chapter ninety-three (93), section one (1), paragraph e with respect to the computation of the annual inflation factor for the 1980 and 1981 calendar years.

Sec. 20. Unobligated or unencumbered funds appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982 by this Act remaining on June 30, 1985, shall revert to the general fund on September 30, 1985, however if after

completion of the project for which the funds were appropriated and before the June 30, 1985 date, there remain unobligated or unencumbered funds, such funds shall revert on September thirtieth following the end of the fiscal year in which the project is completed.

Sec. 21. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect from and after its publication in the Osceola Tribune, a newspaper published in Osceola, Iowa, and in The Cedar Rapids Gazette, a newspaper published in Cedar Rapids, Iowa.
