1 Section 1. Chapter two hundred eighty A (280A), Code 1979,
2 is amended by adding the following new section:

3 NEW SECTION. AUXILIARY ENTERPRISES. The board of directors
4 may expend profits from auxiliary enterprises of area schools
5 for services and equipment which includes but is not limited
6 to tutoring services, scholarships, grants, furniture, fixtures
7 and equipment for noninstructional student use, support of
8 intramural and intercollegiate athletics, and for retirement
9 of bonds issued under section two hundred eighty A point nine-
10 teen (280A.19) of the Code.

11 For the purpose of this section:

12 1. "Auxiliary enterprises" means self-supporting services
13 provided at the area school for which fees or charges are
14 paid, and includes but is not limited to housing and food
15 services, college stores, student unions, institutionally-
16 operated vending services, recreational activities, faculty
17 clubs, laundries, parking facilities, and intercollegiate
18 athletics.

19 2. "Profits from auxiliary enterprises" means the dif-
20 ference between the total fees or charges collected for
21 auxiliary enterprises and the expenditures by the area school
22 for the auxiliary enterprises including actual expenditures
23 plus reimbursement to the area school's general fund for a
24 proportionate share of utilities, indirect administrative
25 costs, and a reasonable rental rate if the auxiliary service
26 is provided in a facility constructed with public funds.

27 Sec. 2. This Act takes effect January first following
28 its enactment.

29 EXPLANATION

30 This bill allows area schools to use any extra money col-
31 lected as fees or charges from auxiliary enterprises for ser-
32 vices and equipment for students and staff at the area school.

AN ACT

RELATING TO EXPENDITURE OF PROFITS FROM AUXILIARY SERVICES BY AREA SCHOOLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Chapter two hundred eighty A (280A), Code 1979, is amended by adding the following new section:

NEW SECTION. AUXILIARY ENTERPRISES. The board of directors may expend profits from auxiliary enterprises of area schools for services and equipment which includes but is not limited to tutoring services, scholarships, grants, furniture, fixtures and equipment for noninstructional student use, and support of intramural and intercollegiate athletics.

For the purpose of this section:

1. "Auxiliary enterprises" means self-supporting services provided at the area school for which fees or charges are paid, and includes but is not limited to food services, college stores, student unions, institutionally-operated vending services, recreational activities, faculty clubs, laundries, parking facilities, and intercollegiate athletics.

2. "Profits from auxiliary enterprises" means the difference between the total fees or charges collected for
