DIVISION 1

1
2 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund
3 of the state to the Iowa commission for the blind for the
4 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982,
5 the sum of one hundred ten thousand twelve (110,012) dollars,
6 or so much thereof as is necessary to be used for the same
7 purposes and to supplement funds appropriated by Acts of the
8 Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 8, section
9 1. It is the intent of the general assembly that the funds
10 appropriated in this section be used to fund six staff
11 positions in the library services program.

12 Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated
13 funds appropriated by this section for the fiscal year
14 beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982 shall not
15 revert to the general fund of the state until June 30, 1983.

16 Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the general fund of
17 the state to the department of public instruction for the
18 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982,
19 the sum of eight hundred sixty-one thousand one hundred
20 seventy-eight (861,178) dollars or so much thereof as is
21 necessary to be used for the same purposes and to supplement
22 funds appropriated by Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly,
23 1981 Session, chapter 8, section 18.

24 Sec. 3. Notwithstanding section 8.33, not more than seven
25 hundred ninety-eight thousand eight hundred eighty-one
26 (798,881) dollars of unencumbered or unobligated funds
27 appropriated in Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly,
28 1981 Session, chapter 8, section 9, for the fiscal year
29 beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982, that have
30 been allocated by the state board of regents for fuel and
31 electricity purposes for the institutions under the state
32 board of regents may be carried forward and expended during
33 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1982 and ending June 30,
34 1983. The amount carried forward shall be used to supplement
35 the amount allocated by the state board of regents for fuel

1 and electricity in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1982
2 and ending June 30, 1983. For the purpose of this section,
3 twenty-one million, three hundred fifty-nine thousand nine
4 hundred twenty-six (21,359,926) dollars of funds appropriated
5 in Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session,
6 chapter 8, section 9, have been allocated by the state board
7 of regents for fuel and electricity purposes in the fiscal
8 year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982.

10 Sec. 4. There is appropriated from the general fund of
11 the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, and
12 ending June 30, 1982, to the state department of health for
13 the health facilities division, twenty thousand one hundred
14 thirty-five (20,135) dollars, or so much thereof as is neces-
15 sary, to be used for the same purposes and to supplement funds
16 appropriated by Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly,
17 1981 Session, chapter 5, section 4, subsection 2.

18 Sec. 5. There is appropriated from the general fund of
19 the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, and
20 ending June 30, 1982, to the state department of health for
21 the licensing and certification division, eight thousand six
22 hundred (8,600) dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary,
23 to be used for the same purposes and to supplement funds ap-
24 propriated by Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981
25 Session, chapter 5, section 4, subsection 5. Of the funds
26 appropriated under this section, six thousand five hundred
27 (6,500) dollars is appropriated to the board of physical and
28 occupational therapy examiners and two thousand one hundred
29 (2,100) dollars is appropriated to the board of mortuary
30 science examiners.

32 Sec. 6. There is appropriated from the special railroad
33 facility fund for the fiscal biennium beginning July 1, 1981
34 and ending June 30, 1983, the sum of one hundred three thou-
35 sand eight hundred ninety (103,890) dollars, or so much thereof

1 as is necessary, to the department of agriculture as a cost
2 of administration for the expenses of approving and sealing
3 meters used to dispense fuel under Acts of the Sixty-ninth
4 General Assembly, Second Extraordinary 1981 Session, chapter
5 3, section 24.

6 Sec. 7. The provisions of Acts of the Sixty-ninth General
7 Assembly, Second Extraordinary 1981 Session, chapter 3, section
8 24, requiring fuel to be dispensed only through meters approved
9 and sealed by the department of agriculture and requiring
10 the department to approve and seal the meters are suspended.

11 Sec. 8. Section 6 of this Act does not become effective
12 until the litigation, including appeals, of Atchison, T. and
13 S. F. Ry., et al. v. Bair, et. al. No. CE 16-09145 pending
14 in the district court in Polk county is concluded. Section
15 7 of this Act ceases to be effective when section 6 becomes
16 effective.

17 Sec. 9. There is appropriated from the general fund of
18 the state to the department of environmental quality for the
19 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982
20 the sum of thirty thousand nine hundred twenty-five (30,925)
21 dollars or so much thereof as is necessary to be used for
22 the same purposes and to supplement funds appropriated by
23 Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter
24 12, section 9, subsection 1.

25 Sec. 10. It is the intent of the general assembly that
26 the fee schedule required by section 455B.32, subsection 6,
27 be implemented. The fees shall be deposited in the general
28 fund of the state.

30 Sec. 11. There is appropriated from the general fund of
31 the state to the Iowa beer and liquor control department for
32 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30,
33 1982, the sum of eighty thousand (80,000) dollars, or so much
34 thereof as may be necessary, to be used for the same purposes
35 and to supplement funds appropriated by Acts of the Sixty-

1 ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 6, section 2,
2 subsection 3.

3 Sec. 12. There is appropriated from the general fund of
4 the state to the insurance department of Iowa for the fiscal
5 year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982, the
6 sum of sixty thousand (60,000) dollars, or so much thereof
7 as may be necessary, to be used for the same purposes and
8 to supplement funds appropriated by Acts of the Sixty-ninth
9 General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 6, section 2,
10 subsection 9.

11 Sec. 13. There is appropriated from the general fund of
12 the state to the department of revenue for the fiscal period
13 beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1983 the amount
14 of two hundred thirty-seven thousand five hundred (237,500)
15 dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary to pay the attorney
16 fees, witness fees, travel and other legal fees for three
17 pipeline cases in litigation before the state board of tax
18 review which involves valuation of property for tax purposes.

20 Sec. 14. Pursuant to section 2604 of the federal Omnibus
21 Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981, one million six hundred
22 thousand (1,600,000) dollars of this state's allotment of
23 funds under the federal Low-Income Home Energy Assistance
24 Act of 1981, section 2601, et seq., of the federal Omnibus
25 Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981, is transferred within the
26 special fund in the state treasury established under Acts
27 of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter

29 Sec. 16. There is appropriated from the special fund in
30 the state treasury established by Acts of the Sixty-ninth
31 General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 17, section 3 from
32 those federal social services block grant funds transferred

5168-33 from federal energy assistance funds under section 16 of this
34 Act, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, and ending

35 June 30, 1982, to the department of social services six hundred

1 thousand two hundred (600,200) dollars, or so much thereof
2 as is necessary, for allocation to the various districts of
3 the department of social services for the purchase of local
4 day care services and other local services for eligible
5 individuals and for allocation to the various counties for
6 local administration, under the fiscal year 1981-1982 state
7 plan for use of the funds received under Title XX of the
8 federal Social Security Act.

9 Sec. 17. The eligibility level for services under Title
10 XX of the federal Social Security Act, also referred to as
11 services provided with social services block grant funds,
12 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, and ending June
13 30, 1982, shall not be reduced below forty-one and two-tenths
14 percent of the federal median income as established in the
15 fiscal year 1981-1982 state plan for use of funds received
16 under Title XX of the federal Social Security Act.

17 Sec. 18. The appropriation from the general fund of the
18 state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, and ending
19 June 30, 1982, to the department of social services for general

27 the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, and
28 ending June 30, 1982, to the department of social services
29 for the division of field operations one million four hundred
30 seventy-five thousand (1,475,000) dollars, or so much thereof
31 as is necessary, to be used for the same purposes and to
32 supplement funds appropriated by Acts of the Sixty-ninth
33 General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 7, section 2 pro-
34 vided that for the remainder of the fiscal year beginning

18 tinued through June 30, 1982.

19 2. The maximum co-payments allowed by federal law or
20 regulation shall be placed on all optional services under
21 the medical assistance program. A fixed co-payment shall
22 be established for each optional service by computing the
23 average or typical payment for each optional service. The
24 co-pay requirement shall not apply to the services provided
25 under the early and periodic screening, diagnosis, and
26 treatment program and to services provided to recipients in
27 hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, intermediate care
28 facilities, intermediate care facilities for the mentally
29 retarded, and state mental health institutes.

30 3. The medical assistance reimbursement rate for reserve
31 bed days for intermediate care facility residents who are

4 be performed on an outpatient basis.

6 medical assistance payments to hospitals, skilled nursing
7 facilities, and intermediate care facilities shall be limited
8 to the rate applicable to the lowest level of care medically
9 required by the patient, including the rate for residential
10 care facilities, rather than to the level of care for which
11 the hospital or facility is certified to provide under the
12 medical assistance program.

21 Sec. 24. There is appropriated from the general fund of
22 the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, and
23 ending June 30, 1982, to the department of social services
24 for community-based services eighty-five thousand (85,000)
25 dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for
26 the same purposes and to supplement funds appropriated by
27 Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter
28 7, section 3, subsection 10.

29 Sec. 25.

30 1. The appropriation from the general fund of the state
31 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, and ending March
32 31, 1982, to the department of social services for shelter
33 cost assistance under Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly,
34 1981 Session, chapter 7, section 4, is reduced by two hundred
35 thousand (200,000) dollars.

1 2. The shelter cost assistance program established in
2 Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter
3 7, section 4, shall be continued through June 30, 1982, and
4 the appropriation in Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly,

35 Sec. 29. There is transferred from the office of the

1 treasurer of state to the account of the state historical
2 department the balance of the life membership trust fund on
3 June 30, 1981. The funds shall be expended as provided in
4 section 303.9.

5 Sec. 30. For the fiscal years beginning July 1, 1981,
6 and July 1, 1982, the Iowa department of justice may receive
7 and there is appropriated, in addition to its appropriation
8 from the general fund, not exceeding ninety-five thousand
9 (95,000) dollars each year from damages awarded to the state
10 or its political subdivisions by any civil antitrust judgment,
11 for use in antitrust enforcement, if the judgment allows the
12 funds received to be used for such purposes.

13 Sec. 31. There is appropriated from the general fund of
14 the state to the Iowa merit employment department for the

22 Sec. 32. There is appropriated from the general fund of

26 much thereof as may be necessary, to supplement funds
27 appropriated by Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly,
28 1981 Session, chapter 14, section 1, subsection 1.

29 Sec. 33. There is appropriated from the general fund of
30 the state to the department of public safety for the fiscal
31 year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982, the
32 sum of one hundred thirty-one thousand nine (131,009) dollars,
33 or so much thereof as may be necessary, to repay the United
34 States government for overpayments received for intermediate
35 care facility inspection.

8 Sec. 37. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance,
9 takes effect from and after its publication in The Daily
10 Iowan, a newspaper published in Iowa City, Iowa, and in The
11 Sioux City Journal, a newspaper published in Sioux City, Iowa.

12 EXPLANATION

13 This bill supplements appropriations and provisions pro-
14 vided for in bills passed during the 1981 Session for the
15 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981. The bill is divided into
16 divisions representing the recommendations of the various
17 subcommittees of the committees on appropriations except that
18 recommendations of the corrections and mental health subcom-
19 mittee are not contained in this bill and division 8 contains
20 provisions relating to the jurisdictions of several of the
21 subcommittees.

22 Division 1 contains the recommendations of the education
23 subcommittee. It contains supplemental appropriations and
24 carries forward into the next fiscal year funds not expended
25 in the 1981-1982 fiscal year.

26 Division 2 contains the recommendations of the human
27 resources subcommittee, and contains supplemental
28 appropriations.

29 Division 3 contains the recommendations of the natural
30 resources subcommittee, and contains a supplemental
31 appropriation as well as provisions relating to implementing
32 the railroad fuel tax which is presently being challenged
33 in court. It also provides for implementation of a fee
34 schedule.

35 Division 4 contains the recommendations of the regulatory

1 and finance subcommittee and provides supplemental
2 appropriations.

3 Division 5 contains the recommendations of the social
4 services subcommittee. It transfers funds from one block
5 grant to another as authorized by federal law, and appropriates
6 those funds. This division contains a number of supplemental
7 appropriations, conditions, and miscellaneous provisions.

8 Division 6 contains the recommendations of the state depart-
9 ments subcommittee. It transfers funds from a fund which
10 was repealed in 1981, authorizes the limited use of funds
11 recovered in anti-trust suits by the attorney general's office,
12 and makes a supplemental appropriation to the Iowa merit
13 employment department to help fund merit testing.

14 Division 7 contains the recommendations of the transporta-
15 tion subcommittee. It makes two supplemental appropriations
16 and corrects an erroneous reference.

17 Division 8 transfers matching state funds which were set
18 aside pursuant to the provisions of chapter 17 of the 1981
19 Session Laws because federal funds in the form of block grants
20 and some categorical grants were not provided to the state
21 at the level anticipated. These funds were set aside by
22 operation of law as provided in sections 4 and 5 of chapter
23 17 and after transfer to the general fund by this bill are
24 available for appropriation.

RELATING TO ADJUSTMENTS TO APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE 1981-1983 FISCAL PERIOD, INCLUDING PROVISIONS AFFECTING THE EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS AND REVERSIONS AND CERTAIN FEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

DIVISION 1

Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the Iowa commission for the blind for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982, the sum of one hundred ten thousand twelve (110,012) dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary to be used for the same purposes and to supplement funds appropriated by Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 8, section 1. It is the intent of the general assembly that the funds appropriated in this section be used to fund six staff positions in the library services program.

Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated funds appropriated by this section for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982 shall not revert to the general fund of the state until June 30, 1983.

Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of public instruction for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982, the sum of six hundred twenty-three thousand (623,000) dollars or so much thereof as is necessary to be used for the same purposes and to supplement funds appropriated by Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 8, section 18.

Sec. 3. Notwithstanding section 8.33, not more than seven hundred ninety-eight thousand eight hundred eighty-one (798,881) dollars of unencumbered or unobligated funds

appropriated in Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 8, section 9, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982, that have been allocated by the state board of regents for fuel and electricity purposes for the institutions under the state board of regents may be carried forward and expended during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1982 and ending June 30, 1983. The amount carried forward shall be used to supplement the amount allocated by the state board of regents for fuel and electricity in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1982 and ending June 30, 1983. For the purpose of this section, twenty-one million, three hundred fifty-nine thousand nine hundred twenty-six (21,359,926) dollars of funds appropriated in Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 8, section 9, have been allocated by the state board of regents for fuel and electricity purposes in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982.

Sec. 4. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, and ending June 30, 1982, to the state board of regents for the specialized child health services program at the university of Iowa hospitals, six thousand seventy-five (6,075) dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used to replace the loss of federal funds to the phenylketonuria program. The funds appropriated in this section shall only be used to cover the cost of lofenalac required for treatment of phenylketonuria.

DIVISION 2

Sec. 5. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, and ending June 30, 1982, to the state department of health for the health facilities division, twenty thousand one hundred thirty-five (20,135) dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the same purposes and to supplement funds appropriated by Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 5, section 4, subsection 2.

Sec. 6. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, and ending June 30, 1982, to the state department of health for the licensing and certification division, eight thousand six hundred (8,600) dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the same purposes and to supplement funds appropriated by Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 5, section 4, subsection 5. Of the funds appropriated under this section, six thousand five hundred (6,500) dollars is appropriated to the board of physical and occupational therapy examiners and two thousand one hundred (2,100) dollars is appropriated to the board of mortuary science examiners.

The department shall identify any homemaker-home health aide funds allocated to counties under this paragraph which the counties do not anticipate spending during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1982. If the anticipated excess funds to any county are substantial, the department and the county may agree to return the excess funds to the department. The department may reallocate the excess funds to counties whose allocations are substantially insufficient to pay for homemaker-home health aide services during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1982.

DIVISION 3

Sec. 8. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of environmental quality for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982 the sum of thirty thousand nine hundred twenty-five (30,925) dollars or so much thereof as is necessary to be used for the same purposes and to supplement funds appropriated by Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 12, section 9, subsection 1.

Sec. 11. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the insurance department of Iowa for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982, the sum of sixty thousand (60,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used for the same purposes and to supplement funds appropriated by Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 6, section 2, subsection 9.

1. The medical assistance program established in Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 7, section 3, subsection 2, unnumbered paragraph 2, for those eligible children under twenty-one years of age shall be continued through June 30, 1982.

2. The maximum co-payments allowed by federal law or regulation shall be placed on all optional services under the medical assistance program. A fixed co-payment shall be established for each optional service by computing the

average or typical payment for each optional service. The co-pay requirement shall not apply to the services provided under the early and periodic screening, diagnosis, and treatment program and to services provided to recipients in hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, intermediate care facilities, intermediate care facilities for the mentally retarded, and state mental health institutes.

3. The medical assistance reimbursement rate for reserve bed days for intermediate care facility residents who are hospitalized or on a home stay shall be reduced from eighty percent to seventy-five percent of the allowable audited costs for those beds, which costs shall not exceed the maximum daily reimbursement rate for intermediate care facilities under the medical assistance program.

4. Medical assistance payments shall not be made for inpatient hospital services which can effectively and safely be performed on an outpatient basis.

5. Notwithstanding section 249A.4, subsections 1 and 9, medical assistance payments to hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, and intermediate care facilities shall be limited to the rate applicable to the lowest level of care medically required by the patient, including the rate for residential care facilities, rather than to the level of care for which the hospital or facility is certified to provide under the medical assistance program.

6. Notwithstanding section 249A.4, subsections 1 and 9, and Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 7, section 3, subsection 2, unnumbered paragraph 6, medical assistance payments for all mandatory and optional services, except for intermediate care facility services, intermediate care facility services for the mentally retarded, services provided to recipients in state mental health institutes, and medical transportation services other than ambulance services, shall be reduced by a factor of two and one-half percent. However, the two and one-half percent reduction shall not apply to the ingredient cost of prescription drugs or to hospital reimbursements.

7. Criteria for prior authorization of specified services under the medical assistance program shall be scrutinized to determine whether the current review process results in the most effective provision of needed services. If a change in the review process would be beneficial, the criteria shall be modified to change the review process or to subject additional services to prior authorization.

Sec. 20. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, and ending June 30, 1982, to the department of social services for contractual services-medical carrier three hundred forty-eight thousand (348,000) dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the same purposes and to supplement funds appropriated by Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 7, section 3, subsection 3.

Sec. 21. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, and ending June 30, 1982, to the department of social services for state supplementary assistance one hundred fifty thousand (150,000) dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the same purposes and to supplement funds appropriated by Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 7, section 3, subsection 6.

Sec. 22. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, and ending June 30, 1982, to the department of social services for foster care one hundred four thousand (104,000) dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the same purposes and to supplement funds appropriated by Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 7, section 3, subsection 9.

Sec. 23. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, and ending June 30, 1982, to the department of social services for community-based services eighty-five thousand (85,000) dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for

the same purposes and to supplement funds appropriated by Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 7, section 3, subsection 10.

15, section 19, subsections 2 through 7, and section 25 of this Act, and may adopt administrative rules under section 17A.4, subsection 2 and section 17A.5, subsection 2, paragraph b relating to section 19, subsection 1 and section 24, subsection 2 of this Act, and the rules shall become effective immediately upon filing, unless a later effective date is specified in the rules.

Sec. 28. Notwithstanding section 252B.4, if federal law or regulation requires the imposition of a fee on an individual who owes a support obligation for the support collection services provided under chapter 252B to a resident parent not otherwise eligible as a public assistance recipient, the commissioner of the department of social services shall charge the individual the fee required by federal law or regulation which may be in addition to the actual amount of support owed by the individual.

DIVISION 6

Sec. 29. There is transferred from the office of the treasurer of state to the account of the state historical department the balance of the life membership trust fund on June 30, 1981. The funds shall be expended as provided in section 303.9.

Sec. 30. For the fiscal years beginning July 1, 1981, and July 1, 1982, the Iowa department of justice may receive and there is appropriated, in addition to its appropriation from the general fund, not exceeding ninety-five thousand (95,000) dollars each year from damages awarded to the state or its political subdivisions by any civil antitrust judgment, for use in antitrust enforcement, if the judgment allows the funds received to be used for such purposes.

Sec. 31. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the Iowa merit employment department for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982, the sum of seven thousand three hundred fifty (7,350) dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the same purposes and to supplement funds appropriated by Acts of the

Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 10, section 7, subsection 6.

DIVISION 7

Sec. 32. Acts of the Sixty-eighth General Assembly, 1980 Session, chapter 1095, section 22, is amended to read as follows:

SEC. 22. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state for the use of the Iowa railway finance authority for the fiscal period beginning July 1, 1980 and ending June 30, 1983 the sum of two hundred seventy-five thousand (275,000) dollars, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for salaries, support, maintenance and miscellaneous purposes and to establish and maintain the Iowa railway finance authority and its staff, to promulgate rules under chapter seventeen A (17A) of the Code and for planning purposes. ~~Section-eight-point-thirty-three-(8-33)-of-the-Code-shall not-apply-to-the-funds-appropriated-by-this-section.--The funds-appropriated-by-this-section-which-are-unencumbered and-unobligated-on-July-1,-1982-shall-be-transferred-to-the railroad-assistance-fund-and-be-available-for-the-purposes provided-in-chapter-three-hundred-twenty-seven-H-(327H)-of the-Code.~~

Sec. 33. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the Iowa law enforcement academy for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982, the sum of three thousand nine hundred (3,900) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to supplement funds appropriated by Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 14, section 1, subsection 1.

Sec. 34. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the department of public safety for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 and ending June 30, 1982, the sum of one hundred thirty-one thousand nine (131,009) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to repay the United States government for overpayments received for intermediate care facility inspection.

Sec. 35. Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 14, section 9, is amended to read as follows:

SEC. 9. All unencumbered or unobligated balances of funds remaining on June 30, 1985, from funds appropriated by subsection 2 of section 6 § shall revert to the primary road fund on September 30, 1985.

Sec. 36. Matching state funds released due to federal grant reductions pursuant to the consolidation of federal categorical grants into federal block grants, and deposited in a special fund in the state treasury during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 under Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 17, section 4, are transferred to the general fund of the state.

The matching state funds released, deposited, and transferred under this section are portions of those funds appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, and ending June 30, 1982, under the following Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session:

Sec. 37. Matching state funds released due to federal categorical grant reductions and deposited in a special fund in the state treasury during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 under Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session, chapter 17, section 5, subsection 5, are transferred to the general fund of the state.

The matching state funds released, deposited, and transferred under this section are portions of those funds appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981, and ending June 30, 1982, under the following Acts of the Sixty-ninth General Assembly, 1981 Session:

1. Chapter 7, section 1; section 2; section 3, subsection 1; section 3, subsection 2; section 3, subsection 3; section 3, subsection 4; and section 3, subsection 9;

2. Chapter 10, section 7, subsection 5, paragraph a; section 7, subsection 8, paragraph a;

3. Chapter 12, section 9, subsection 1; section 12, subsection 2, paragraph c; and

4. Chapter 8, section 8, subsection 4.

Sec. 38. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect from and after its publication in The Daily Iowan, a newspaper published in Iowa City, Iowa, and in The Sioux City Journal, a newspaper published in Sioux City, Iowa.
