1 Section 1. Chapter 149, Code 1981, is amended by adding  
2 the following new section:

3 NEW SECTION. TEMPORARY CERTIFICATE. The podiatry examiners  
4 may issue a temporary certificate authorizing the licensee  
5 to practice podiatry if the podiatry examiners determine that  
6 a need exists and the person possesses the qualifications  
7 prescribed by the podiatry examiners for the certificate,  
8 which shall be substantially equivalent to those required  
9 for licensure under this chapter. The podiatry examiners  
10 shall determine eligibility for the certificate, whether or  
11 not examinations shall be given, and the type of examinations.  
12 The requirements of the law pertaining to regular permanent  
13 licensure shall not be mandatory for this temporary certificate  
14 except as specifically designated by the podiatry examiners.  
15 The granting of a temporary certificate does not in any way  
16 indicate that the person licensed is necessarily eligible  
17 for regular licensure, and the podiatry examiners are not  
18 obligated to license the person.

19 The temporary certificate shall be issued for one year  
20 and may be renewed, but a person shall not be entitled to  
21 practice podiatry in excess of three years while holding a  
22 temporary certificate. The fee for this certificate shall  
23 be set by the podiatry examiners and if extended beyond one  
24 year a renewal fee per year shall be set by the podiatry  
25 examiners. The fees shall be based on the administrative  
26 costs of issuing and renewing the certificates. The podiatry  
27 examiners may cancel a temporary certificate at any time,  
28 without a hearing, for reasons deemed sufficient to the  
29 podiatry examiners.

30 When the podiatry examiners cancel a temporary certificate,  
31 they shall promptly notify the licensee by registered United  
32 States mail, at the licensee's last-named address, which is  
33 reflected in the files of the podiatry examiners, and the  
34 temporary certificate shall become terminated and of no further  
35 force and effect three days after the giving of the notice

1 to the licensee.

2 A temporary certificate shall authorize a person to practice  
3 podiatry under the policies and standards applicable to the  
4 health care services of a podiatry school's academic staff  
5 member. A temporary certificate issued under this section  
6 to an academic staff member of a podiatry school in this state  
7 shall automatically expire when the special licensee terminates  
8 affiliation with the school.

9 EXPLANATION

10 This bill establishes a procedure for the board of podiatry  
11 examiners to issue a temporary certificate authorizing the  
12 holder of the certificate to practice podiatry under the  
13 policies and standards applicable to the health care services  
14 of a podiatry school. The temporary certificate will be  
15 issued for one year and may be renewed at the discretion of  
16 the board. However, no person may practice more than three  
17 years while holding a temporary certificate.

18 The bill takes effect July 1 following enactment.

AN ACT

TO PERMIT THE BOARD OF PODIATRY EXAMINERS TO ISSUE A TEMPORARY CERTIFICATE TO PRACTICE PODIATRY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Chapter 149, Code 1981, is amended by adding the following new section:

NEW SECTION. TEMPORARY CERTIFICATE. The podiatry examiners may issue a temporary certificate to an academic staff member of a podiatry school in this state authorizing the licensee to practice podiatry if the podiatry examiners determine that a need exists and the person possesses the qualifications prescribed by the podiatry examiners for the certificate, which shall be substantially equivalent to those required for licensure under this chapter. The podiatry examiners shall determine eligibility for the certificate, whether or not examinations shall be given, and the type of examinations. The requirements of the law pertaining to regular permanent licensure shall not be mandatory for this temporary certificate except as specifically designated by the podiatry examiners. The granting of a temporary certificate does not in any way indicate that the person licensed is necessarily eligible for regular licensure, and the podiatry examiners are not obligated to license the person.

The temporary certificate shall be issued for one year and may be renewed, but a person shall not be entitled to practice podiatry in excess of three years while holding a temporary certificate. The fee for this certificate shall be set by the podiatry examiners and if extended beyond one year a renewal fee per year shall be set by the podiatry examiners. The fees shall be based on the administrative costs of issuing and renewing the certificates. The podiatry

examiners may cancel a temporary certificate at any time, without a hearing, for reasons deemed sufficient to the podiatry examiners.

When the podiatry examiners cancel a temporary certificate, they shall promptly notify the licensee by registered United States mail, at the licensee's last-named address, which is reflected in the files of the podiatry examiners, and the temporary certificate shall become terminated and of no further force and effect three days after the giving of the notice to the licensee.

A temporary certificate issued under this section to an academic staff member of a podiatry school in this state shall automatically expire when the special licensee terminates affiliation with the school.
