11 enrolled in a laboratory school enrolls in a public school
12 in the pupil's district of residence during a school year,
13 the state board of regents shall transfer state aid received

15 upon by the board of the district of residence and the state
16 board of regents.

17 EXPLANATION

18 This bill requires the state board of regents to transfer
19 state aid to the district of residence for a pupil who was
20 enrolled in a laboratory school but transfers back to the
21 pupil's district of residence. The amount transferred must
22 be agreed upon by the two boards. The bill takes effect July
23 1 following its enactment.

FISCAL NOTE
House File 444
Requested by Representative Lind
March 31, 1981

In compliance with a written request there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for House File 444 pursuant to Joint Rule 16.

H.F. 444, An Act relating to the payment of state aid for pupils previously enrolled in a laboratory school.

This bill requires the state board of regents to transfer state aid to the district of residence for a pupil who was enrolled in a laboratory school but transfers back to the pupil's district of residence. The amount transferred must be agreed upon by the two boards.

The fiscal impact of this bill is not ascertainable. The number of students that might transfer from the laboratory school to the district of residence is unknown. The latest enrollment information for Price Laboratory School indicates a total student population of 645.

It is estimated that 75 students are from Waterloo schools and 570 students are from the Cedar Falls School District.

RELATING TO THE PAYMENT OF STATE AID FOR PUPILS PREVIOUSLY ENROLLED IN A LABORATORY SCHOOL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 265.6, Code 1981, is amended to read as follows:

265.6 STATE AID APPLICABLE. The If the state board of regents which has established a laboratory school, it shall receive state aid pursuant to chapters 281 and 442 for each pupil enrolled in the laboratory school in the same amount as the public school district in which the pupil resides would receive aid for that pupil and shall transmit the amount received to the institution of higher education at which the laboratory school has been established. If the board of a school district terminates a contract with the state board of regents for attendance of pupils in a laboratory school, the school district shall inform the state comptroller of the number of these pupils who are enrolled in the district on the second Friday of the following September. The state comptroller shall pay to the school district, from funds appropriated in section 442.26, an amount equal to the amount of state aid paid for each pupil in that school district for that school year in payments made as provided in section
