6 by the governor, subject to confirmation by the senate.

30 EXPLANATION

31 This bill replaces the salaries of members of the Iowa  
32 beer and liquor control council with per diem compensation.  
33 This bill also allows one member of the council to hold or  
34 have an interest in a license or permit to manufacture or  
35 sell alcoholic liquor or beer. It will take effect July 1  
36 following enactment.

123.6 APPOINTMENT--TERM--QUALIFICATIONS--COMPENSATION.  
Appointments shall be for five-year staggered terms beginning and ending as provided by section 69.19 and shall be made by the governor, subject to confirmation by the senate. Members of the council shall be chosen on the basis of managerial ability and experience as business executives. One member of the council may be the holder of or have an interest in a permit or license to manufacture alcoholic liquor or beer or sell alcoholic liquor or beer at wholesale or retail. Members may be reappointed for one additional term. Each member appointed shall receive full compensation for the member's services of ~~two-thousand-five-hundred-dollars~~ per-annum forty dollars per diem in addition to reasonable and necessary expenses while attending meetings.

Sec. 2. Section 123.45, unnumbered paragraph 1, Code 1981, is amended to read as follows:

No Except as provided in section 123.6, a council member or department employee shall not, directly or indirectly, individually, or as a member of a partnership or shareholder in a corporation, have any interest in dealing in or in the manufacture of alcoholic liquor or beer nor, and shall not receive any kind of profit nor have any interest in the purchase or sale of alcoholic liquor or beer by persons so authorized under this chapter except-that. However, this provision shall not ~~prevent~~ prohibit any such member or
