1 Section 1. Section 332.3, subsection 24, Code 1981, is  
2 amended to read as follows:  
3 24. To levy a tax, subject to ~~the provisions of~~ this  
4 subsection and not to exceed three cents per thousand dollars  
5 of assessed value, with the amount of tax collected not to  
6 exceed five thousand dollars in a county with a population  
7 of less than thirty-five thousand, fifteen thousand dollars  
8 in a county with a population of thirty-five thousand or more  
9 but less than one hundred thousand, or twenty-five thousand  
10 dollars in a county with a population of one hundred thousand  
11 or more, for the use of local, nonprofit historical societies,  
12 organized pursuant to chapter 504 or chapter 504A, ~~for the~~  
13 purpose of. Revenues from the tax shall be used to preserve  
14 and disseminate a knowledge of the history of the area to  
15 the general public, including but not limited to collecting  
16 and preserving historical materials, artifacts, places, and  
17 structures of the area, including repairing and maintaining  
18 buildings; maintaining a historical library and collections,  
19 including the construction, repair, and maintenance of  
20 facilities necessary for exhibits and displays; conducting  
21 historical studies and researches; issuing publications;  
22 and providing public lectures of historical interest; ~~and~~  
23 ~~otherwise disseminating a knowledge of the history of the~~  
24 ~~area to the general public.~~ If there are two or more nonprofit  
25 historical societies in the county, the board shall apportion  
26 the funds available under this subsection as it determines.  
27 The county board of supervisors shall require the historical  
28 society to submit to the board as a prerequisite to receiving  
29 funds under this subsection a proposed budget including the  
30 amount of available funds and estimated expenditures. A local  
31 historical society receiving funds under this subsection shall  
32 present to the county board of supervisors an annual report  
33 describing in detail its use of the funds received.

34 EXPLANATION

35 This bill allows a nonprofit historical society to use

1 funds received from the county through a tax levy to construct,  
2 repair, and maintain buildings of historical significance  
3 and facilities used for displays and exhibits. The bill is  
4 effective July 1 following enactment.
