2 1. Page 1, line 7, by striking the word "may"
3 and inserting in lieu thereof the word "shall".

4 2. Page 1, line 11, by striking the number "601D.8"
5 and inserting in lieu thereof the number "601I.8".

6 3. Page 1, line 13, by striking the number "601D.7"
7 and inserting in lieu thereof the number "601I.7".

8 4. Page 1, by inserting after line 14 the
9 following:

10 "Sec. 3. Section 601D.5, Code 1983, is amended
11 to read as follows:

12 601D.5 USE OF GUIDE DOGS. Every blind or partially
13 blind person shall have the right to be accompanied
14 by a guide dog, under control and especially trained
15 for the purpose, in any of the places listed in
16 sections 601D.3 and 601D.4 without being required
17 to make any additional payment for the guide dog.
18 ~~He shall be~~ A landlord shall waive lease restrictions

20 The blind person is liable for any damage done to

11 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 601D.8 PENALTY FOR DENYING RIGHT.
12 A person who denies or interferes with the right of a deaf
13 person established by section 601D.7 is, upon conviction,
14 guilty of a simple misdemeanor.

15 EXPLANATION

16 This bill states the right of a deaf person to use a hearing
17 dog in all public places and establishments open to the general
18 public. Interference with or denial of the right is a simple
19 misdemeanor. The bill assigns numbers to the new sections
20 in chapter 6011. The bill is effective July 1 following
21 enactment.

AN ACT

ALLOWING DEAF OR BLIND PERSONS TO USE AND KEEP HEARING OR GUIDE DOGS AND PROVIDING A PENALTY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. NEW SECTION. 6011.7 USE OF HEARING DOG

A deaf person has the right to be accompanied by a hearing dog, under control and especially trained at a recognized training facility to assist the deaf by responding to sound, in any place listed in sections 6010.3 and 6010.4 without being required to make additional payment for the hearing dog. A landlord shall waive lease restrictions on the keeping of dogs for a deaf person with a hearing dog. The deaf person is liable for damage done to any premise or facility by a hearing dog.

Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 6011.8 PENALTY FOR DENYING RIGHT.

A person who denies or interferes with the right of a deaf person established by section 6011.7 is, upon conviction, guilty of a simple misdemeanor.

Sec. 3. Section 6010.5, Code 1983, is amended to read as follows.

6010.5 USE OF GUIDE DOGS. Every blind or partially blind person shall have the right to be accompanied by a guide dog, under control and especially trained for the purpose, in any of the places listed in sections 6010.3 and 6010.4 without being required to make any additional payment for the guide dog. ~~He shall be~~ A landlord shall waive lease restrictions on the keeping of a guide dog for a blind person.
