14 Sec. 2. NEW SECTION. 110.5 BOUNDARY RIVER TROTLINE
 15 LICENSE. A boundary river sport trotline license shall include
 16 four tags and be issued annually. A licensee shall not use
 17 more than four trotlines containing a maximum of two hundred
 18 hooks in aggregate. The license is valid only in the Missouri
 19 and Mississippi rivers. The licensee shall also possess a
 20 valid resident fishing or combination license.

27 EXPLANATION

28 This bill reduces the number of licenses and stamps and
29 increases the price of several licenses. The bill removes
30 the requirement for special nonresident pheasant and raccoon
31 stamps and tags. The bill establishes a single \$15 lifetime
32 hunting and fishing combination license and a \$10 lifetime
33 fishing license for senior citizens. Under the current Code
34 senior citizens have three annual and two lifetime license
35 provisions. The bill also provides for nonresident commercial

FISCAL NOTE
REQUESTED BY REPRESENTATIVE SULLIVAN

In compliance with a written request received March 3, 1983, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for House File 406 pursuant to Joint Rule 17. Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Legislative Fiscal Bureau, to members of the Legislature upon request.

House File 406 is an Act reducing the number of licences, stamps and increasing the price of several licences. It also increases the allowable charge for the service rendered in issuing a licence.

Vendors of licenses would be allowed to charge an additional 25 cents per license for a writing fee to be retained by depositors and county records office. This would total approximately \$160,000.

The additional revenue to the Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund under the proposed bill is compared to the current law.

In compliance with a written request there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for Amendment S-3410 to House File 406 pursuant to Joint Rule 17.

Amendment S-3410 to House File 406, as amended by the House, would increase the deer and the turkey licenses from a fee of \$15.00 to \$20.00.

This amendment would increase the revenue to the Fish and Game Trust Fund by approximately \$42,000 in FY 1984 and \$480,000 in FY 1985.

This additional amount would increase the expected new revenue from House File 406 to \$680,261 for FY 1984 and \$2,246,008 in FY 1985.

REQUESTED BY SENATOR HALL

In compliance with a written request there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for House File 406 as amended by S-3566, pursuant to Joint Rule 17.

Amendment S-3566 to House File 406, as amended and passed by the House, would eliminate trapping licenses and replace them with fur harvesters licenses. It would eliminate nonresident raccoon stamps and tags and increase fur harvester licenses above the price of trapping licenses. A fur harvester license would be required to hunt raccoon or fox or trap any fur-bearing animal.

The net increase in revenue to the Fish and Game Trust Fund from the provisions of this bill is estimated to be between \$851,000 and \$1,094,000.

REQUESTED BY SENATOR WALDSTEIN

In compliance with a written request there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for Amendment S-5119 to Amendment S-5100 to House File 406 pursuant to Joint Rule 17.

S-5119 amends S-5100 by increasing the age at which a person is required to purchase a license to hunt game from 16 years old to 17. The amendment also changes the requirement of one licensed adult accompanying each underage hunter to require that underage hunters must be accompanied by a licensed adult.

The amendment would result in reduced revenue to the Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund because of a reduced base of hunters subject to the license requirement and reduced federal aid which is based on the number of licenses sold. This reduction is estimated as:

REQUESTED BY SENATOR VAN GILST

In compliance with a written request there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for House File 406 as amended by S-5100 pursuant to Joint Rule 17.

Amendment S-5100 amends House File 406 by striking everything after the enacting clause. The amendment reduces the number of licenses, raises the price of various licenses and stamps, creates a class of fur harvester licenses and specifies when fur harvester licenses are required.

It also provides that the county recorder will retain 50¢ of the price of each license they sell and receive a 25¢ service fee for each license sold by a depository they service. It is estimated that the 50¢ writing fee retained by the county recorders and their outlets will total \$58,920 in FY 1985 and \$305,350 in FY 1986.

It would allow licenses to be valid from the date issued to the end of the calendar year for which it is issued with no licenses to be issued before December 15 for the subsequent calendar year.

A person eligible for a free deer hunting license valid could chose to apply for a free turkey hunting license instead. The license would be valid only for hunting on the farm unit upon which the licensee to whom it is issued resides.

Assuming that this bill will become effective January 1, 1985, the additional revenue to the Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund under the proposed amendment is compared to the current law:

Amendment H-3260 to House File 406 changes the price of certain licenses related to fishing, modifies when licenses must be purchased for certain seasons and increases the fees a county recorder's office can require a depository to pay.

The portion of the amendment related to the price of licenses would reduce annual income to Fish and Game Trust Funds an estimated \$45,000 from the level expected from House File 406.

The portion of the amendment which would make licenses valid to the end of the season if it goes beyond the end of the calendar year would have the effect of delaying income. There would be a one time reduction in FY 1984 revenues which would be transferred into FY 1985 of \$189,500.

The number of license sales which would be lost totally can not be estimated accurately. There would be lost interest of \$20,500 annually resulting from delayed revenues.

The portion of the amendment which would allow county recorders to require their license depositories to pay a service fee of 25 cents per license would result in an estimated revenue of \$175,000 spread among the county recorders offices of the State. It would not effect state revenues.

Reduced revenue to the Fish and Game Trust Fund would be \$65,000 annually. Increased revenue to county recorders offices would be \$175,000 annually.

Sec. 9. Section 110.18, Code 1983, is amended to read as follows:

110.18 FORM OF LICENSE. All hunting, fishing, and ~~trapping~~ fur harvester licenses shall contain a general description of the licensee. Such licenses shall be upon such forms as the commission shall adopt. The address and the signature of the applicant and all signatures and other writing shall be in ink. All licenses shall clearly indicate the nature of the privilege granted.

Sec. 10. Section 110.24, unnumbered paragraphs 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, Code Supplement 1983, are amended to read as follows:

Upon written application to the state conservation commission, one of the following persons shall be issued a deer or a wild turkey hunting license:

1. The owner of a farm unit; or
2. One member of the family of the farm owner; or
3. The tenant residing on the farm unit; or
4. One member of the family of the tenant, who resides on the farm unit.

The deer or wild turkey hunting permit shall be valid only for hunting on the farm unit upon which the licensee to whom it is issued resides.

The application required ~~herein~~ for the deer or wild turkey hunting license shall be on forms furnished by the conservation commission and shall be without fee.

Deer or wild turkey hunting licenses issued under this section shall be subject to all other provisions of the laws and regulations pertaining to the taking of deer and wild turkey.

No A resident of the state under sixteen years of age or a nonresident of the state under fourteen years of age shall be is not required to have a license to fish in the waters of the state. However, residents under sixteen years of age and nonresidents under fourteen years of age must possess a valid trout stamp to possess trout or they must fish for trout with a licensed adult who possesses a valid trout stamp and limit their combined catch to the daily limit established by the commission.

Sec. 11. Section 110.26, Code 1983, is amended to read as follows:

110.26 NONRESIDENT MAKING FALSE CLAIM. A nonresident shall not obtain a resident license by falsely claiming residency in the state. The presumptions and provisions of section 321.1A, Code Supplement 1983, relating to residency shall apply to licenses under this chapter. The use of a license by a person other than the person to whom the license is issued is unlawful and shall nullify the license. A resident or nonresident who violates this section is guilty of a simple misdemeanor.

Sec. 12. Chapter 110, Code 1983, is amended by adding the following new section:

NEW SECTION. FUR HARVESTER LICENSE. A fur harvester license is required to hunt all furbearers, except coyote and groundhog and to trap any fur-bearing animal. A hunting license is not required when hunting furbearers, except coyote and groundhog, with a fur harvester's license.

Sec. 13. A trapping license valid on the effective date of this Act shall remain valid until it expires under the provisions of the 1983 Code.

Sec. 14. This Act takes effect December 15 following enactment.

Sec. 15. Sections 110.2, and 110.38, Code 1983, are repealed.
