1 An Act relating to the authority of the court over certain  
2 persons who committed crimes.  
3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 903.3, Code 1983, is amended to read  
2 as follows:

3 903.3 WORK RELEASE. The court may direct that a prisoner  
4 sentenced to confinement ~~for ninety days or less, or a prisoner~~  
5 ~~who has served all but ninety days or less of his or her~~  
6 ~~sentence, in a county jail, alternate jail facility, or~~  
7 community correctional residential treatment facility, be  
8 released from custody during specified hours, as provided  
9 by sections 356.26 to 356.35.

10 Sec. 2. Section 907.6, Code 1983, is amended to read as  
11 follows:

12 907.6 CONDITIONS OF PROBATION--REGULATIONS. ~~The court,~~

24 EXPLANATION

25 Section 1 of the bill expands the scope of prisoners who  
26 may be released from custody during specified hours for pur-  
27 poses such as seeking employment, employment, schooling, and  
28 medical treatment.

29 Section 2 of the bill provides that probationers are sub-  
30 ject to conditions established by community corrections (which  
31 conditions are approved by the court) as well as to other  
32 reasonable conditions imposed by the court itself.

33 The bill would take effect July 1 following its enactment.
