A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to visitation at state correctional institutions
2 by certain public officials and leaders of a religious
3 community.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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HF 74

1 Section 1. Chapter 218, Code 1983, is amended by adding
2 the following new section:

3 NEW SECTION. VISITATIONS. The following persons are
4 authorized to visit the men's reformatory, the state
5 penitentiary, the Iowa correctional institution for women,
6 the Iowa security and medical facility, the men's medium
7 security correctional facility at Rockwell City, the
8 correctional release center, the state training school and
9 other facilities not attached to the main campus of those
10 institutions at pleasure: The governor, the lieutenant
11 governor, secretary of state, auditor of state, treasurer
12 of state, secretary of agriculture, members of the general
13 assembly, judges of the supreme court, the court of appeals,
14 and district courts, including district associate judges and
15 judicial magistrates, county attorneys, and persons ordained
16 or designated as regular leaders of religious communities.
17 No other person shall be granted admission except by permission
18 of the warden or superintendent.

19 EXPLANATION

20 This bill removes the phrase "ministers of the gospel"
21 from the section of the Code relating to prison visitation
22 and instead uses language which applies to non-Christian
23 religions as well. It also expands the list of elected
24 officials given visitation privileges to include the lieutenant
25 governor and judges of the court of appeals. Finally, it
26 makes the visitation section applicable to all correctional
27 institutions.

28 The bill is effective July 1 following its enactment.

Section 1. Chapter 218, Code 1983, is amended by adding the following new section:

NEW SECTION. VISITATIONS. Members of the executive council, the attorney general, the lieutenant governor, members of the general assembly, judges of the supreme and district court and court of appeals, judicial magistrates, county attorneys and persons ordained or designated as regular leaders of a religious community are authorized to visit all institutions under the control of the division of adult corrections and the state training school at reasonable times.
