1 Section 1. Section 331.904, subsection 1, Code 1983, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 1. The annual salary of the first and second deputy officer
4 of the office of auditor, treasurer, recorder, and clerk and
5 the deputy in charge of the motor vehicle registration and
6 title division shall each be an amount not to exceed eighty
7 percent of the annual salary of the deputy's principal officer
8 ~~as-determined-by-the-principal-officer~~. In offices where
9 more than two deputies are required, each additional deputy
10 shall be paid an amount not to exceed seventy-five percent
11 of the principal officer's salary, except that in a county
12 having two locations at which the district court is held,
13 an additional deputy clerk shall be paid an amount not to
14 exceed eighty percent of the principal officer's salary.
15 The amount of the annual salary of each deputy shall be
16 certified by the principal officer to the board and, if a
17 deputy's salary does not exceed the limitations specified
18 in this subsection, the board shall certify the salary to
19 the auditor. The board shall not certify a deputy's salary
20 which exceeds the limitations of this subsection.

21 EXPLANATION

22 This bill provides that the annual salary of a third deputy
23 clerk of the district court may be set at an amount not to
24 exceed eighty percent of the clerk's salary in a county having
25 two locations at which the district court is held. Currently,
26 in clerks' offices where more than two deputy officers are
27 required, the additional deputy clerks are limited to seventy-
28 five percent of the clerk's salary.

29 This bill takes effect July 1 following enactment.

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ANNUAL SALARY OF THE DEPUTY CLERKS OF THE DISTRICT COURT IN A COUNTY HAVING TWO LOCATIONS AT WHICH THE DISTRICT COURT IS HELD.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 331.964, subsection 1, Code 1983, is amended to read as follows:

1. The annual salary of the first and second deputy officer of the office of auditor, treasurer, recorder, and clerk and the deputy in charge of the motor vehicle registration and title division shall each be an amount not to exceed eighty percent of the annual salary of the deputy's principal officer ~~as determined by the principal officer~~. In offices where more than two deputies are required, each additional deputy shall be paid an amount not to exceed seventy-five percent of the principal officer's salary, except that in a county having two locations at which the district court is held, an additional deputy clerk shall be paid an amount not to exceed eighty percent of the principal officer's salary. The amount of the annual salary of each deputy shall be certified by the principal officer to the board and, if a deputy's salary does not exceed the limitations specified in this subsection, the board shall certify the salary to
