EXPLANATION

17 This bill amends the child labor laws to allow the

18 employment of children as models for up to three hours per

19 day if the written permission of the parent, guardian or

20 custodian is obtained. Certain restrictions are imposed with

21 respect to children of school age. The bill takes effect

22 July 1 following its enactment.

AN ACT
TO ALLOW LIMITED CHILD MODELING UNDER THE CHILD LABOR LAWS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 92.17, Code Supplement 1983, is amended by adding the following new subsection:

NEW SUBSECTION. 5. A child under sixteen years of age from being employed or permitted to work, with or without compensation, as a model, for a period of up to three hours in any day between the hours of 7 a.m. and 10 p.m., not exceeding twelve hours in any month, if the written permission of the parent, guardian or custodian of the child is obtained prior to the commencement of the modeling. However, if the child is of school age this exception allows modeling work only outside of school hours during the regular school year and does not allow modeling work during the summer term if
