1 Section 1. Section 902.9, subsections 3 and 4, Code 1983,
2 are amended to read as follows:

3 3. A class "C" felon, not an habitual offender, shall
4 be confined for no more than ten years, and in addition may
5 be sentenced to a fine of not more than ~~five~~ ten thousand
6 dollars.

7 4. A class "D" felon, not an habitual offender, shall
8 be confined for no more than five years, and in addition may
9 be sentenced to a fine of not more than ~~one~~ seven thousand
10 five hundred dollars.

11 EXPLANATION

12 This bill raises the maximum fine allowable for the con-
13 viction of a class "C" felony from five thousand to ten thou-
14 sand dollars and for a class "D" felony from one thousand
15 to seven thousand five hundred dollars.

16 This bill takes effect July 1 following its enactment.

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE MAXIMUM FINE ASSESSABLE UPON THE CONVICTION OF A CLASS "C" OR CLASS "D" FELONY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 902.9, subsections 3 and 4, Code 1983, are amended to read as follows:

3. A class "C" felon, not an habitual offender, shall be confined for no more than ten years, and in addition may be sentenced to a fine of not more than ~~five~~ ten thousand dollars.
