A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to appropriations to the department of human
 2 services for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1983, and
 3 ending June 30, 1984, by appropriating funds for payments
 4 to certain recipients of aid to dependent children under
 5 the unemployed parent program due to denial of a portion
 6 of benefits to them in the 1982-1983 fiscal year and for
 7 reimbursement to the United States department of health
 8 and human services for audit exceptions relating to
 9 federal funds received pursuant to Title XIX of the
 10 federal Social Security Act, by removing the prohibition
 11 on the expenditure of certain funds for job training, and
 12 by requiring that excess social services block grant funds
 13 replace state funds previously appropriated for the
 14 purchase of local services.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund
2 of the state to the department of human services for the
3 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1983, and ending June 30, 1984,
4 for payment to families currently receiving benefits under
5 the unemployed parent program of the aid to families with
6 dependent children program who applied and were denied a
7 portion of benefits between October 6, 1982 and June 30, 1983
8 pursuant to 1982 Iowa Acts, chapter 1260, section 91, as
9 amended by 1983 Iowa Acts, chapter 4, section 2, the following
10 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary:

8 EXPLANATION

9 This bill relates to appropriations to the department of
10 human services for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1983,
11 and ending June 30, 1984.

12 Section 1 appropriates funds for payment to certain families
13 who were denied a portion of benefits for the spouse of an
14 unemployed parent during the 1982-1983 fiscal year under the
15 unemployed parent program of the aid to families with dependent
16 children program.

17 Section 2 appropriates funds to reimburse the federal
18 government for federal audit exceptions under the joint
19 federal-state medical assistance program.

20 Section 3 requires that excess social services block grant
21 funds replace state funds previously appropriated for the
22 purchase of local services.

23 Section 4 removes the prohibition on the expenditure of
24 funds, appropriated to the coordinated manpower services
25 demonstration projects, for job training after March 31, 1984.

26 The bill takes effect upon publication.

AN ACT

RELATING TO APPROPRIATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 1983, AND ENDING JUNE 30, 1984, BY APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR PAYMENTS TO CERTAIN RECIPIENTS OF AID TO DEPENDENT CHILDREN UNDER THE UNEMPLOYED PARENT PROGRAM DUE TO DENIAL OF A PORTION OF BENEFITS TO THEM IN THE 1982-1983 FISCAL YEAR AND FOR REIMBURSEMENT TO THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES FOR AUDIT EXCEPTIONS RELATING TO FEDERAL FUNDS RECEIVED PURSUANT TO TITLE XIX OF THE FEDERAL SOCIAL SECURITY ACT, BY REMOVING THE PROHIBITION ON THE EXPENDITURE OF CERTAIN FUNDS FOR JOB TRAINING, AND BY REQUIRING THAT EXCESS SOCIAL SERVICES BLOCK GRANT FUNDS REPLACE STATE FUNDS PREVIOUSLY APPROPRIATED FOR THE PURCHASE OF LOCAL SERVICES.
